ARTESIAN WELLS.

A SUM of Two thousand pounds (£2000) is hereby offered by the Government as a reward (subject to the under-mentioned conditions) to the first successful discoverer of an Artesian stream of water within that portion of the basin of the River Murray lying below the junction of the Owens River with the Murray, and being within the colony of Victoria.

1. That such Artesian stream be at a distance of not less than ten miles from any portion of the River Murray, and at a distance of not less than five miles from any tributary thereof, or from any fresh-water lake, or any other permanent supply of fresh water.

2. That the water of such Artesian stream be fresh and suitable for drinking and other domestic purposes.

3. That it rise so as to flow over, at, or above the surface of the ground, without the aid of any mechanical appliances whatsoever, and that it continue so to flow and to remain fresh at the expiration of six months from the date of its first rising to the surface.

The due fulfilment of the above conditions will be referred to the decision of a board to be appointed for the purpose by His Excellency the Governor in Council.

WHEREAS by *The Electoral Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that no election shall be void in consequence only of there having been no returning officer at the time of the issue of the writ, or of any delay in the return of the writ; and where any impediment, misfeasance, or omission of a merely formal nature shall have happened, the Governor in Council may take all such measures as may be necessary for removing such impediment or rectifying such misfeasance or omission, or may declare any or all of the proceedings at or for any election valid as to and notwithstanding such impediment, misfeasance, or omission; and every such Order in Council shall be forthwith published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas the late Electoral Registrar for the Wyndham division allowed an omission to take place in not causing copies of the Roll of Ratepayers received from the Wyndham Road District to be printed: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that the present Electoral Registrar shall supply the above-mentioned omission, by preparing a new Ratepayers' Roll for so much of the said Wyndham division as was included in the Wyndham Road District, and shall have the same printed and forwarded to the Returning Officer.

WHEREAS by *The Electoral Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council shall within thirty days after the commencement thereof, and afterwards as he shall see fit from time to time, appoint within and for each division of every province and district respectively one place and not more for taking the poll in such division at contested elections for the province or district, and every such appointment may revoke: provided that if the returning officer of the province or district and any police magistrate or superintendent of police acting in the locality shall by writing under their hands certify to the Governor that it is necessary so to do, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to appoint as aforesaid in and for such division one or more polling place or places, and the appointment of such place or places or any of them from time to time to revoke: provided also that no appointment of any polling place in or for any division of a province or district shall be revoked between the issue of any writ for election for the same and the return of such writ: And whereas the returning officer for the Ballarat West electoral district and the police magistrates acting in the localities have, by writing under their hands, certified to the Governor that it is necessary to appoint additional polling places for certain divisions of the said district: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order appoint Little Bendigo to be an additional polling place in and for the Ballarat West Proper division for taking the poll in such division at contested elections for the Ballarat West electoral district; and doth further appoint Redan to be an additional polling place in and for the Western Road division of the said district for the purpose aforesaid.

THE SHIRE OF CORIO.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DABLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that if at any time in any district, whether single or united, which shall contain an area of

not less than one hundred square miles, the total amount actually paid in respect of the general rate then last made shall have amounted to One thousand pounds, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to proclaim, if it shall seem fit, such district, by such name as in and by such Order in Council may be assigned thereto, to be a shire within the meaning of the said Act, and such district shall thereupon be and be called such shire accordingly; and no district, after the proclamation thereof of as such shire, save as herein provided with regard to the adjustment of boundaries to those of electoral districts, shall be united with any other shire or district, or with any borough or municipal district: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-fifth day of March, 1861, a Road District was proclaimed under the designation of "The Corio Road District." And whereas by another Proclamation bearing date the thirty-first day of August, 1863, the boundaries of the said district were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas the area of the said district and the amount of the last general rate therein are not less than the area and amount in the said Act mentioned, and it seemed fit to make an Order in Council this day to proclaim the said district to be a shire accordingly: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the district heretofore proclaimed and called the Corio Road District to be a shire within the meaning of the said Act, by the name in and by such Order in Council assigned thereto, that is to say:—

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the Council of the Borough of Fitz Roy has complained to the Governor in Council that it ought, by reason of the traffic passing along the road hereinafter mentioned being common to its own district with the district in which tolls are payable upon such road, to have a share of such tolls in the manner provided in the 254th clause of *The Local Government Act, 1863*: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the road hereinafter mentioned to be a Common-toll road, for the purposes and within the meaning of the provisions of the said Act relating to Common-toll roads, viz.:—

The road extending from the junction of Reilly street with Brunswick street, in the said borough of Fitz Roy, to the village of Heidelberg, shall be a Common-toll road of the said borough of Fitz Roy and the Heidelberg road district.

EXTENSION OF THE 11TH CLAUSE OF THE FISHERIES AND GAME STATUTE TO BALCOMBE'S CREEK.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act to consolidate the Laws for the protection of Fisheries and Game*, it is amongst other things enacted, that if any person shall set, lay down, use, or fish with any kind of net in the Yarra Yarra, Plenty, Werribee, or Saltwater Rivers, in the colony of Victoria, or in any or either of their respective tributaries, or in any other river, lake, creek, stream, or pond, to which the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, shall, by proclamation duly published in the *Government Gazette*, extend the provisions of the 11th clause of the said Act, he shall forfeit such net, and also such sum, not exceeding Ten pounds, as the convicting justice shall think fit:

Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby extend the above-recited provisions of the said Act, being the 11th clause thereof, to Balcombe's Creek, situated between Snapper Point and Dromana, in the county of Mornington.

SECTIONS V. TO X. OF THE TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO THE TOWNSHIP OF JAMIESON.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intitled, *An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X., in the said Act, shall extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts, and places as the Lieutenant Governor may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them; and it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX.) shall extend to and be in operation throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: Now I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the Township of Jamieson shall come under the operation of the sections of the said Act numbered respectively V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X.

WORKS ON A MAIN ROAD ORDERED UNDER "THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1863."

THE Governor in Council, in exercise of the power conferred by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, made the following Order on the 9th of May, 1864, viz.:—

The District Board of the Keilor Road District shall, pursuant to Order in Council made on the 9th day of May, 1864, and within seven months from the making thereof, execute the following works on the Main road from Melbourne to Ballarat, according to a plan deposited by the said board with the Board of Land and Works, and recorded as (64.1319), viz.:—Fifty-four chains and two hundred and fourteen chains of the said road to be drained, formed, and metalled.

This notification is in lieu of that referring to works to be performed by the said District Board on the said road, which appeared in the *Gazette* of 20th May last (page 1086 ante), the works being therein erroneously described.

MINING OPERATIONS AUTHORISED WITHIN EXEMPTED LAND IN THE PARISH OF CASTLEMAINE.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, by Order made on the 13th day of June, 1864, under the authority conferred by the Gold Fields Act, 21 Victoria No. 32, authorised the holders of miners' rights to prosecute mining operations upon and within allotment one of section one B one, in the parish of Castlemaine, on the following conditions, viz. :-

1. The workings shall be open at all reasonable hours to the inspection of any mining surveyor or other duly authorised officer.

2. On ceasing to mine, the miners shall fill up all shafts and excavations made by them, and restore the surface of the ground to the condition it was in before mining operations were commenced thereon.

3. Before any application for any claim shall be entertained, the applicants for the same shall deposit with the warden of the district the sum of Three pounds sterling, and the same shall be retained by the warden until the claim shall have been relinquished and the excavations made by the depositors filled up. If the excavations be not filled up to the satisfaction of the warden, the sum so deposited shall be forfeited; but if all the conditions herein set forth be complied with, then and in such case the whole sum shall be returned to the depositors.

4. All or any of the holders of miners' rights mining upon or within the said reserve shall stop their works when requested so to do by the mining surveyor or other duly authorised officer, whenever it shall appear that the works are not being carried out with due precaution against any contingent damage to the said reserve, or to the buildings erected thereon.

5. In case any person so mining shall in any way violate the above conditions, it shall not be lawful for him any longer to mine upon any claim upon or within such lands.

MINING OPERATIONS AUTHORISED WITHIN EXEMPTED LAND AT ARARAT.

1. The persons mining or occupying a claim upon or within the lands so exempted shall not interfere in any way with the reservoir, or pollute the water stored therein, or suffer or permit any sludge or tailings or polluted water to flow into the reservoir.

SHIRE OF WYNDHAM.

CLAUSE 1. Bye-law No. 1, made in accordance with sections 138, 174, and 175 of the Act 27 Victoria No. 176, and passed by the Council of the Shire of Wyndham, at a meeting held on Wednesday, 18th day of May, and confirmed at another meeting held on Wednesday, 15th day of June, 1861, being the standing orders to regulate the proceedings of the council.

Clause 2. The business of the council at all meetings shall be conducted with open doors, unless it shall be necessary to exclude strangers on account of disorderly conduct.

Clause 3. The ordinary meetings of the council shall be held on the first and third Wednesdays in each month, at Two p.m.

Clause 4. The business of the council shall commence as soon as a quorum may be present; but, should such quorum not be present at the expiration of one hour after the time appointed for the meeting, the circumstance shall be entered in the minute-book, together with the names of the members present; and the meeting shall be adjourned to the following Wednesday.

Clause 5. The minutes of any preceding meeting not previously confirmed shall be read first at all meetings, in order that they may be confirmed, and no discussion shall be allowed therein, except as to their accuracy. The reading of correspondence, the presentation of memorials and petitions, the bringing up of reports and notices of motion, the secretary's reports, and surveyor's reports of work done and in progress, shall have precedence in the order named of the regular business of each meeting.

Clause 6. Memorials shall be presented by members only, and every such member presenting a memorial shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded.

Clause 7. The orders of the day shall include all business incomplete at a former meeting, all matters of which due notice has been given, and any business which the president may see fit to introduce, and shall have precedence in the order in which they stand in the minute book and notice book respectively.

Clause 8. Notices of motion, containing the name of the proposer, shall be handed to the secretary, who shall enter them in the minute book kept for that purpose; and the member making such motion shall read it aloud, and state the day of bringing on such motion.

Clause 9. No motion entered on the notice book shall be proceeded with unless the member who gave such notice shall be present when the business is called, or unless some other member present be authorized by the proposer to take up the motion during his absence; and notices not so proceeded with will be struck out.

Clause 10. No motion or amendment shall be entered or discussed until it has been seconded.

Clause 11. Every motion or amendment shall be committed to writing before it is entertained, and shall then be entered in the minute book, with the names of the mover and the seconder, and on a division thereon the names of the members voting *pro* and *con* shall be recorded.

Clause 12. Any member when proposing a motion or amendment, or discussing any matter, must rise and address the president; and no member shall be interrupted except by a call to order; and the member then calling to order shall then be heard, and the question decided before the subject is resumed, or any other business shall be called.

Clause 13. The president shall put each question first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and shall there and then decide which is in the majority.

Clause 14. The ruling of the president shall be final for all points of order, and shall be given without argument or comment, except by way of citing precedent; and if two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the president shall decide which has the first claim.

Clause 15. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council; but if, on the question being put, the motion for adjournment is negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, or any other that may be allowed precedence by the president, shall be discussed before any subsequent motion for adjournment be entertained, and if the motion for adjournment be carried, then the business undispensed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the council.

Clause 16. The council shall, in all cases, vote by a show of hands.

Clause 17. Any member or members of the council may protest respectfully against any resolution of the council, provided that at the time such resolution is passed the member or members so protesting shall give the secretary a written notice, signed by him or them, stating reasons for protesting, and the secretary shall make an entry of the same in the minutes.

Clause 18. No member shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or impute improper motives to others; and all personal reflections upon any member shall be considered as highly disorderly, and the member making use of such offensive expressions shall make an apology if required by the council to do so.

Clause 19. Any member may require the secretary to take down in writing any particular word or words used by a member, immediately upon the same being used.

Clause 20. No moneys shall be paid by the council except at the first ordinary meeting held in each month.

Clause 21. All payments shall be made by cheque, signed by the president, or acting chairman, and one member, and countersigned by the treasurer; and no such cheque shall be given except at the first ordinary meeting to be held in each month.

Clause 22. In committee of the whole council the standing orders shall be observed.

Clause 23. It shall be competent for a majority of not less than two-thirds of the council in session to suspend during the discussion of any subject any standing order herein contained,

except the purport of such suspension be the rescinding of any motion previously adopted by the council.

Clause 24. All contracts shall be advertised in the *Argus* at least twice consecutively.

Clause 25. Tenders shall be addressed to the president of the council, and shall not be opened till the day fixed for their consideration arrives, and then only by the president or acting chairman; and the amounts, together with the names of the parties tendering, shall be entered on the minutes of the council and whenever tenders are accepted a contract shall be entered into and signed by the contractor, one member of the council, and the secretary.

Clause 26. Contractors are requested to send in their tenders on printed forms, and tenders must not only include a lump sum for the whole of the work specified, but also a complete schedule of quantities and prices, showing how the lump sum has been arrived at. Tenders which do not comply with these conditions will be rejected.

Clause 27. Tenders must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit of not less than £2 per cent. on the amount of the tender. Any contractor whose tender has been accepted by the council and who fails or refuses to sign a contract or pay the deposit required by the council, shall forfeit the moneys paid in by him as a preliminary deposit; any error in computing the amount of the said tender, or ignorance of or misunderstanding of the conditions of the specification that may be alleged to the contrary notwithstanding.

Clause 28. The security in all cases of contracts shall be £10 per cent. on the amount of the tender, and shall be paid over by the contractor to the treasurer; and the money so paid shall be deposited in the bank with the other moneys of the council, and shall not be repaid to the contractor until he has obtained a certificate from the surveyor of the council that the works under his contract are satisfactorily completed.

Clause 29. Money or cash advances may be made to contractors at a rate not exceeding 75 per cent. on the surveyor's report of work performed.

OFFICERS.

Clause 30. In all cases it shall be considered sufficient for the collector to call once for any sum due on the assessment roll; and in the event of any such sum not being paid to him, a notice shall be left stating that unless the sum be paid before the expiration of fourteen days from the date thereof, legal proceedings shall be taken for its recovery.

Clause 31. The collector shall in no case distrain without the order of the council.

Clause 32. Every seven days all moneys received by the collector for rates shall be paid to the treasurer, and the collector shall take a receipt for the same.

Clause 33. The collector shall, previous to the day on which the first ordinary meeting of the council is held in each month, prepare a report showing the amount of rates received by him during the month immediately preceding, the moneys paid in to the treasurer, and the amount of uncollected rates, and shall deliver the same to the secretary.

Clause 34. The surveyor shall from time report on progress of the contracts let by the council, and in the event of any contractor not completing his contract within the time specified in the conditions of his contract, the surveyor shall immediately report thereon to the council.
