REGULATION AS TO CROWN GRANTS OF LANDS SELECTED.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has made the subjoined Regulation, under *The Land Act, 1862*, § 133, relative to the issue of Crown Grants of leased moieties of allotments to original selectors and lessees or their heirs and assigns, viz.:-

Crown Grants of the leased moieties of allotments under *The Land Act, 1862*, shall not be made out and issued until the full amount of rent has been paid, and the persons entitled to such grants have made written application for the same to the Commissioner of Lands and Survey.

Persons claiming as the heirs of the original selectors and lessees must, in addition to the above application, give proof of heirship and of the death of the person through whom they claim; or if claiming as assignees, proof of the fact of their being the assignees of the original selector and lessee.

PRIZE ESSAYS.

IT is hereby notified that, in pursuance of a resolution of the Legislative Assembly, a premium of One hundred and fifty pounds will be awarded for the best essay on each of the following subjects, viz.:-

1. Pleuro-pneumonia; its causes, symptoms, post-mortem appearances (pathology); the best means of treatment; and practical hints on the avoidance of the disease and its eradication from the colony.

2. Scab; its causes, symptoms, pathology; best means of treatment; and practical hints for its avoidance and extermination.

3. The possibility of determining by inspection of the entire or divided animal in slaughter-houses or butchers' shops whether the animal has died or been slaughtered; whether it has been the subject of the above or any other disease; and if so, what are the signs by which such disease can be recognized.

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4. Whether food prepared from such flesh should be allowed to be consumed, or whether it should be confiscated and destroyed.

The essays must be legibly written on foolscap paper, on one side only, and leaving a two-inch margin.

No essay is to be in the handwriting of its author nor signed with his name; but for the purpose of identification each essay must bear a motto, and must be accompanied by a sealed envelope containing the name and address of the author, and on the outside, but not in the author's handwriting, the motto affixed to the essay.

The essays must be forwarded to this office, addressed to the Honorable the Chief Secretary, on or before the 1st February.

The Government will appoint three judges to decide on the respective values of the essays, but it reserves to itself the power to withhold the premium in the case of either subject, should the essays be considered unworthy of the premium offered. The essays for which premiums may be awarded will be considered the property of the Government.

ARARAT MINING DISTRICT.

BYE-LAW No. 2.—REGULATING QUARTZ MINING IN THE ARARAT MINING DISTRICT.—[21st June, 1864.]

At a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Ararat, begun and holden at the Mining Board Room, Ararat, in the said district, on the 21st day of June, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

1. *Marking off claims.*—All claims must be marked off at each corner by a post, and the boundary lines meeting at each post shall be as near as practicable at right angles to each other. The length of all claims shall be with the course or supposed course of the reef, and all reefs or veins of quartz within the said claims shall be the property of the holders thereof.

2. *Boundary posts.*—The corner posts of all claims shall be at least three (3) feet above the surface; they must be firmly fixed in the ground, and kept visible during the working of a claim or while it is held in possession.

3. *Claims to be worked in a bond fide manner.*—Not more than four (4) days after a claim has been taken possession of, work must be commenced and continued thereon in a bond fide manner by the number of men required to represent such claim according to this bye-law (except as hereinafter provided by clauses numbers 12, 13, and 14). If any shareholder is prevented from working by sickness or urgent business, the other shareholders, or a majority of them, may have his place supplied by a competent miner, and such shareholder shall be responsible for any reasonable wages to the person so employed.

4. *Prospecting claims.*—Any miner or miners prospecting for or discovering a quartz reef, shall be entitled to hold in length three hundred (300) feet along the course or supposed course of the reef, by a breadth at right angles of eight hundred (800) feet.

5. *Ordinary claims.*—In ordinary claims each miner shall be entitled to hold in length fifty (50) feet along the course or supposed course of the reef, by a breadth at right angles of six hundred (600) feet, but no ordinary claim shall exceed two hundred (200) feet in length.

6. *Claims to be numbered.*—All claims shall be numbered consecutively on either side from the prospecting claim, which shall be number one (1).

7. *A wall or partition.*—Three (3) feet in width of neutral ground must be left as a wall or partition between claims, until both parties agree to divide or otherwise dispose of the same; always provided that either party shall be at liberty to remove a portion of the said wall for the purpose of ventilation, and that the quartz so removed shall be the joint property of the said parties.

8. *Penalty for not leaving a wall.*—Where any party neglects to leave the proper width of wall, the same may be deducted from the claim of such party and assigned as a wall.

9. *Oversized claims.*—Any person having marked off a claim larger than he is entitled to, the excess may be taken possession of by any person claiming the same, on whichever side he may prefer; and should the ground so taken possession of not exceed the extent allowed for one miner, it shall not be necessary to leave a wall between the excess and the claim reduced.

10. *Temporary amalgamation.*—Any number of adjoining claims not exceeding six (6) may be amalgamated temporarily to test the ground in searching for a quartz reef; provided that not less than one (1) miner for every two hundred (200) feet be employed thereon. Claims so amalgamated must be worked *bonâ fide*, and in no case shall less than two (2) men be employed.

11. *Permanent amalgamation.*—Any number of adjoining claims not exceeding twelve (12) may be amalgamated permanently by the holders thereof, posting near the centre of the claims so amalgamated a notice stating the registered numbers and extent of such claims. Permanent and temporary amalgamations must be registered.

12. *Suspension of work.*—Any miners who have done three (3) consecutive months' *bonâ fide* work in a claim may obtain from the registrar a certificate (in the form of the schedule hereunto appended) authorising suspension of work in said claim for any period not exceeding three (3) months; previous to a subsequent suspension being allowed, three (3) additional consecutive months' *bonâ fide* work must be done on the claim. No certificate shall be granted if the holders of the greater part of the interest in a claim are opposed thereto. This clause shall not apply to claims amalgamated under clause ten (10).

13. *Suspension on the water level.*—The holders of any claim who first strike the water shall be entitled to receive from the registrar a certificate (in the form of the schedule hereunto appended) authorising suspension of work for three (3) months; but the holders of other claims on the same reef shall only be entitled to suspend work until the three (3) months granted to the first party have expired. Claims being drained and on which drainage assessment is paid, shall be allowed to suspend work on application to the registrar.

14. *Suspension whilst procuring machinery.*—Claimholders shall be entitled to receive from the registrar a certificate (in the form of the schedule hereunto appended), authorizing suspension of work for procuring, erecting, or repairing machinery, and in all cases where such work has not been completed in a reasonable time the claim shall be liable to forfeiture. Claims which are dependent upon pumping or other machinery for assistance in working their claims shall be entitled to suspension of work under this clause until such machinery is repaired. The shareholders in claims who have worked out the level a pumping engine is drawing water from, may suspend work until the owners of such pumping engine commence to sink their shaft to a greater depth.

15. *Tunnels and tramways.*—Any person cutting a tunnel or laying down a tramway for the greater convenience of working a claim, may hold possession of the same, together with a wall of six (6) feet on each side thereof; provided the same does not impede the working of the claim of any other person or obstruct any road in ordinary use.

16. *Protection to stacked quartz or tailings.*—Any person wishing to retain possession of any quartz or tailings may do so for one year by registering the same with the registrar; provided such quartz or tailings be stacked in a proper manner upon ground not supposed to be payable for mining purposes. After the expiration of one year, if the owners still desire to retain possession, registration must be renewed every six (6) months.

17. *Sites of dams, &c., proving auriferous.*—When the site occupied by a dam, tunnel, tramway, race, stacked quartz, or tailings, shall prove auriferous, it may be mined upon; but any person, before commencing work upon such site, shall compensate the owner for any injury that may be sustained thereby.

18. *Sludge.*—Where machinery is employed, an embankment for the purpose of retaining the sludge must be constructed, except the sludge can be more conveniently carried off by drainage without injury to any other person.

19. *Roads to be bridged.*—When sludge or water runs across any road in general use, a substantial bridge, not less than sixteen (16) feet in width, must be constructed and kept in repair by the owners of the claim from which such sludge or water proceeds.

20. *Forfeiture of claims.*—Non-compliance with the provisions of clauses Nos. three (3), twelve (12), thirteen (13), and fourteen (14); the obtaining by false representations a certificate from the registrar authorising suspension of work; and the non-resumption of work after the expiry of the time allowed for suspension, shall render the claim or interest affected liable to forfeiture.

21. *Non-forfeiture through neglect of hired workmen.*—No registered interest shall be forfeited through neglect on the part of any hired miner or contractor; provided that after seven (7) days' notice in writing of such neglect to the owner or his agent, the owner's interest be fully represented in conformity with this bye-law.

22. *Penalties for other infringements.*—Any other infringement of this bye-law shall subject the person so offending to the penalty specified in the 126th section of the Gold Fields Act.

23. *Effacing notices or removing posts.*—No person shall efface, alter, remove, or destroy any notice posted on a claim, or wilfully remove the posts thereof.

24. *Plurality of shares.*—Any holder of a miner's right may hold one or more shares in any number of claims, provided the same be represented in accordance with this bye-law by the holder of a miner's right; but no person shall be entitled to mark off more than one claim on any reef until the claim last marked off by him be abandoned, or shall have been worked in a *bonâ fide* manner at least four days.

25. *Registration.*—All interests in quartz claims must be registered.

26. *Agent to be appointed.*—Any person holding an interest in a claim shall, in case of absence from the locality, appoint an agent, whose acts shall be held as those of his principal, and whose name and address must be registered with the registrar of the division in which such interest is situated.

Persons illegally found in possession of any of the blankets or shirts issued by the Central Board will be prosecuted.

The *Blankets* are of the following description: Size of a single blanket, 7 feet by 5 feet 4 inches; weight, 7½ lbs per pair; color, brownish-grey and yellow check. The brownish-grey stripes are 4 inches in width, and the yellow stripes 3½ inches in width.

Serge Shirts: Brownish-grey and yellow check.

Cotton Shirts: Narrow red and white stripes.

DUNEED CEMETERY.

RULES and Regulations, in accordance with the provisions of the Act 17 Victoria 12, for the Mount Duneed Cemetery.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground is broken or a vault re-opened.

2. On application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery being made to the trustees, a certificate of permission will be granted on payment of the fees set forth in the schedule.

3. Charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on the certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that the relatives of the deceased were unable to pay the usual fees.

4. The sexton shall dig all ordinary graves, unless otherwise specially ordered, on payment of the fees mentioned in the schedule.

5. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones are to be kept in repair and in proper condition at the expense of the owners.

6. All persons destroying the fences, or in any manner injuring the cemetery, will be prosecuted as the law directs.

7. Every coffin in a vault must be bricked in, or cemented or covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

8. A plan of the ground and a register will be kept, which may be examined on payment of charges set forth in the schedule.

9. When a meeting of trustees is required, the same to be called by the secretary; three to form a quorum.

10. The trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alteration from time to time in these regulations and charges, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council.
