PETITION FOR A NEW BOROUGH.

TARNAGULLA.

NOTICE is hereby given, in accordance with the provisions of *The Municipal Corporations Act, 1863*, section 11, that a petition has been presented to the Governor, signed by one hundred and sixty-three inhabitant householders resident within Tarnagulla and Newbridge, in the parish of Tarnagulla, praying His Excellency to constitute the district whereof the boundaries are hereinafter set forth a Borough under the style and title of "The Borough of Tarnagulla."

The boundaries of the proposed borough are as follow:—"Commencing at a point in the centre of the River Loddon where it is intersected by the northern boundary of the township of Newbridge; hence west about 80 chains; hence south 51 degrees west about 3 miles 70 chains; hence south along the western boundary of the township of Tarnagulla about 1 mile 30 chains; hence east 1 mile 20 chains; hence north 44 degrees east about 2 miles 40 chains; hence north 39 chains; hence east 80 chains to the centre of the River Loddon; hence northerly along the course of the Loddon about 1 mile 40 chains to the point of commencement."

The Governor has been pleased to order that the said petition be taken into consideration by his Executive Council on Monday the eighth day of August next ensuing.
