## ADDITIONAL POLLING PLACE FOR THE CROWLANDS ELECTORAL DISTRICT.

*At the Government House, Melbourne, the eleventh day of July, 1864.*

WHEREAS by *The Electoral Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council shall, within thirty days after the commencement thereof, and afterwards as he shall see fit from time to time, appoint within and for each division of every province and district respectively one place and not more for taking the poll in such division at contested elections for the province or district, and every such appointment may revoke; provided that if the returning officer of the province or district and any police magistrate or superintendent of police acting in the locality shall by writing under their hands certify to the Governor that it is necessary so to do, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to appoint as aforesaid in and for such division one or more polling place or places, and the appointment of such place or places or any of them from time to time to revoke; provided also that no appointment of any polling place in or for any division of a province or district shall be revoked between the issue of any writ for election for the same and the return of such writ: And whereas the returning officer for the Crowlands electoral district and the police magistrate acting in the locality have, by writing under their hands, certified to the Governor that it is necessary to appoint an additional polling place for the Navarre division of the said district: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order appoint Redbank to be an additional polling place in and for the Navarre division for taking the poll in such division at contested elections for the electoral district of Crowlands.

And the Honorable James McCulloch, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that in and for each original district within thirty days after the commencement of this Act, and in and for each single proclaimed district within fifteen days after the constitution thereof, the Governor in Council shall, and from time to time afterwards if it shall seem fit may on the application of the board of any such district, appoint a sufficient number of polling places for every such district at which the poll shall be taken at all elections held for the same, and may from time to time on the like application alter and vary the same: And whereas by an Order of the

Governor in Council, made on the thirtieth day of September, 1863, polling places were appointed for elections in original districts: And whereas by divers Orders made subsequently the polling places were varied and altered as therein mentioned: And whereas it is expedient to alter and vary the polling places in the undermentioned districts: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order appoint the polling place mentioned in the first schedule hereunto annexed to be an additional polling place for the Carlsruhe road district; and, with the advice aforesaid, doth further appoint that the polling places mentioned in the second schedule hereunto annexed shall be substituted polling places for the Ballan road district, viz.:—

## UNITED COMMON.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act, 1862*, it is amongst other things enacted, that where there are two or more neighboring commons the Governor in Council may proclaim that the same shall be a common under the name of "The United Town and Gold Field [or, as the case may be] Common of" for the benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on either: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that the neighboring commons hereinafter mentioned shall be a United Common, under the following name, that is to say:—

THE UNITED FARMERS' AND TOWN COMMON OF HEXHAM, comprising the Farmers' Common at Hexham, described in a Proclamation bearing date the fifteenth day of July, 1861, and the Town Common for Hexham, described in two several Proclamations bearing date the eighteenth day of February, 1861, and the thirteenth day of October, 1862. And the said

United Common shall be for the benefit of all persons entitled to commouage on either of the above-mentioned commons.— (64.L.15131.)

## COMMON-TOLL ROAD.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS the District Board of the Caulfield Road District has complained to the Governor in Council that it ought, by reason of the traffic passing along the road hereinafter mentioned being common to its own district with the district in which tolls are payable upon such road, to have a share of such tolls in the manner provided in the 254th clause of *The Local Government Act, 1863*: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the road hereinafter mentioned to be a Common-toll road, for the purposes and within the meaning of the provisions of the said Act relating to Common-toll roads, viz.:-

The portion of the road known as the Point Nepean road, extending from the southern boundary of the borough of St. Kilda to the south-eastern angle of the boundary of the Moorabbin road district, shall be a Common-toll road of the borough of Brighton and of the Caulfield and the Moorabbin road districts.

## VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

## BYE-LAW.—RATES FOR CARRIAGE OF WOOL.

THE Board of Land and Works, by virtue of the powers and authorities vested in it by *The Railways Act, 1863*, do hereby make the following Bye-law for altering and fixing the charges for the carriage of wool upon railways vested in the said Board, that is to say:—

That the rates hitherto charged for the carriage of wool upon the said railways be annulled; and that from and after one month from the publication of this bye-law in the *Government Gazette* the rates shall be as follows:—

From country stations on the "up" journey to Melbourne, Geelong, or Williamstown, Fourpence per ton per mile, according to the distance travelled.

That the minimum distance to be charged at that rate shall be fifteen miles.

That for the carriage of wool from Melbourne to Williams-town for shipment the rate shall be One shilling per bale.
