DISTRICT BROUGHT UNDER THE GUNPOWDER ACT.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to regulate the importation, carriage, and custody of Gunpowder*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to proclaim any town, township, or municipal district, not being a sea-port town, as a district into which no gunpowder shall be brought unless for deposit in a public or licensed magazine; and if any person shall bring more than one hundred pounds of gunpowder into any such district, and shall not forthwith deposit the same in a magazine as aforesaid, it shall be forfeited: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the borough of Heathcote as a district into which no gunpowder shall be brought unless for deposit in a public or licensed magazine.

BYE-LAWS.

THE business of the board shall be conducted with open doors, unless it shall become necessary to exclude strangers on account of their disorderly conduct.

2. The regular meetings of the board shall be held at the board-room, Lower Huntly, on the first and third Wednesday in each month, at Two o'clock p.m., and should there not be present at Three o'clock the necessary number of three members to form a quorum, the member or members present, or the clerk, if no member be present, may adjourn the meeting to another day, not farther distant than three days from such adjournment.

3. Special meetings may be called by three or more members, and may be held on four clear days' notice being given to all the members; the notice must specify the object for which it is called, and the time and place of meeting, and no business shall be transacted at a special meeting except that specified in the notice. Extraordinary business may be transacted at ordinary meetings if notice of same has been given at a prior meeting, and each member must be notified as in special meetings.

4. At every regular meeting of the board the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting for confirmation the minutes of any preceding meetings; and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings. The minutes then confirmed shall be signed by the chairman of the meeting at which the proceedings took place.

5. After the confirmation of the minutes the order of business shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable:—

1. Reading copies of letters sent. 2. Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon. 3. Opening and ordering on tenders. 4. Reception and reading of petitions. 5. Reading and ordering on reports of permanent committees, and reading and ordering on reports of special committees. 6. Orders of the day. 7. Motions of which previous notice shall have been given.

6. All petitions or memorials addressed to the Board must be presented by one of its members, who shall be responsible for its being in proper form and respectfully worded.

7. On a petition or memorial being presented, no debate on the subject matter therein contained shall take place thereon, the only question entertained will be that the same be received, and if necessary, referred to a committee; the name of the mover to be placed on such committee.

8. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the board, and any business which the chairman may think fit to bring under consideration. Any member of the board may, however, bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of a notice of motion. Every notice of motion must be in writing, signed by the mover, and no such notice of motion shall be proceeded with unless the mover or some member authorized by him be present when the business is called on. Any notice of motion not disposed of shall stand over until the next ordinary meeting, and no motion or amendment shall be withdrawn unless by consent of the board.

9. No resolution at any meeting of the board shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting, except in compliance with the 136th clause of *The Local Government Act*.

10. Any member of the board may of right require the production of any document of the board relating to the question under discussion.

11. Any member may enter his protest against any resolution passed or before the board.

Order of Debate and Points of Order.

12. Every member, including the chairman, shall stand whilst addressing the board. The presiding chairman's decision shall be final on all questions of order and practice, and he shall state the same without comment or argument. No member shall

digress from the subject under discussion, nor impute improper motives to another member, and all personal reflections shall be considered highly disorderly.

13. Any member using expressions capable of being applied offensively to any other member shall, if required by the chairman, withdraw such expression, and apologise to the board. The chairman may call to order any one out of order; and if the person deemed out of order refuse to sit down, or to be silent, the chairman shall order the person so offending to leave the room; and should he persist in his interruptions the chairman shall in his discretion order his removal, or record a fine against him; and the person so offending shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, to be recovered before a justice of the peace, and in default to be imprisoned for a period not exceeding seven days.

14. Every motion and amendment shall be entered on the minutes, with the names of the mover and seconder, and on a division thereon the votes shall be recorded.

15. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but if lost, another may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote.

16. All questions before the board shall be decided by open voting.

17. A member moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon; but a member seconding a motion without remark shall not be held to have spoken. No member shall speak twice on the same question, except by way of explanation or reply upon an original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of an amendment. After the mover's reply, the amendment or motion, as the case may be, shall be put to the vote.

18. If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall determine as to priority.

19. No discussion will be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the board, but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the adjournment be carried, the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the board.

20. Any member may require the clerk to take down any particular words used by a member immediately on the same being used.

21. In committee of the whole board, the standing orders shall be observed.

22. Any question which it may be desirable to put to any officer of the board shall be put through the chairman.

23. At any ordinary meeting of the board it shall be competent for a majority of not less than two-thirds of the board to suspend *pro tem.* any standing order herein contained.

OFFICERS.

24. No election to any office at the disposal of the board shall take place without notice being given in some paper circulating in the district, inviting applications from qualified candidates.

25. Officers of the board shall be required to give satisfactory security for the due fulfilment of their respective duties; and should such officers, during their engagement with the board, neglect or fail to perform any or either of their various duties whereby the board may sustain damage or loss, they shall for every such neglect forfeit a sum not exceeding £5 sterling, on the board passing a resolution to that effect.

26. The collector shall pay into the treasurer's hands all moneys received by him within seven days of its receipt.

27. The collector shall, at the first ordinary meeting in each month, present his report to the board, showing the amount of rates received by him during the previous month, the moneys paid to the treasurer, and the amount of uncollected rates.

28. The treasurer shall furnish a report at each ordinary meeting of the board, showing the amount lodged and drawn since previous meeting, and the balance in hand.

29. The surveyor shall at each ordinary meeting of the board report on progress of contracts let by the board, and on any works he may think necessary within the district. In the event of a contractor not completing his contract within the specified time, the surveyor shall immediately report thereon, to the board.

CONTRACTS.

30. No motion, the effect of which if carried would involve an expenditure exceeding £10, shall be entertained, unless previous notice has been given.

31. Contracts shall be made by tender, and called for by advertisement. When the contract may exceed £100, notice by advertisement must be given at least five days previous to the day the tenders are to be sent in. Tenders must be sent in on the printed forms of the board, and must include not alone a lump sum for the whole of the work specified, but also a complete schedule of quantities and prices, showing how the lump sum has been arrived at. Tenders which are not in conformity with this will be rejected. Tenders shall be addressed to the chairman of the board, and sent to the board room, and only opened when about to be considered by the board.

32. All tenders must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit, as follows:—

Tenders the amount of which is—	
Under £25, a deposit of 10s.	
£25 to £50, " 20s.	
£50 to £75, " 30s.	
£75 to £100, " 40s.	

and 20s. for every additional £100 or fractional part of £100 up to £1000.

33. The security in all cases of contract shall be 10 per cent. on the amount of the tender, and shall be paid over to the clerk of the board, to be deposited with the treasurer, and shall not be repaid to the contractor until he has obtained a certificate from the surveyor that the work is satisfactorily completed.

34. Any contractor whose tender has been accepted by the board, and who fails or refuses to sign a contract, or pay the required deposit within four days after the acceptance of the tender, shall forfeit the amount paid by him as a preliminary deposit. Any error in computing the amount of the said tender, or ignorance of, or misunderstanding of the conditions of the specification that may be alleged to the contrary notwithstanding.

35. Cash advances may be made to contractors at a rate not exceeding 75 per cent. on the surveyor's report of the full amount of work done.

36. The respective amounts and the names of tenderers shall be entered on the minutes. When tenders are accepted, the contractors shall sign the form of contract, which shall also be signed by two members of the board.

37. No officer or member of the board shall have any pecuniary interest, either directly or indirectly, in any contract made by the board.

Payment of Moneys.

38. All payments shall be made by cheque, signed by the chairman and one other member of the board, and countersigned by the clerk. No cheques shall be drawn unless at an ordinary or special meeting of the board.

Local Assessment.

39. It shall be considered sufficient in all cases for the collector to make but one call for payment of rates, and if not paid in fourteen days after demand in writing recovery may be made according to the 205th clause of *The Local Government Act.*

Committees.

40. The duty of the Works Committee shall be to examine all contracts during progress, and also all roads under repair; and all applications for progress or final payments must be recommended by one of the Works Committee, as well as by the surveyor.

Fines, &c.

41. Any paid officer of the board, required to do so, not attending a regular or special meeting duly convened, shall be fined £1 for each such omission, unless detained by illness or other unavoidable circumstance; and for any other wilful infraction of these rules he shall be fined 10s. Members of the board absent at any regular or special meetings shall be fined 2s. 6d., unless a satisfactory reason is given for their absence.

42. All fines inflicted under these Bye-laws shall be devoted to charitable purposes.

The above Bye-laws were passed by a "special order" of the Board this date, and are now published under the common seal of the board.
