## POSTAGE STAMPS. NOTICE.

**A**FTER the 2nd August next no postage stamps can be supplied for the use or on the requisition of any person in the public service under the Government of Victoria (see 27 Victoria No. 226, clause 18).

After the abovenamed date no letter or packet from or to any of the Government Departments will be exempt from postage, unless it be "On Her Majesty's Service," and be so described on the outside thereof, and have impressed thereon a "Frank stamp" not obliterated or defaced (27 Victoria 226, clause 14).

Officers of the Civil Service and others who may require frank-stamped envelopes, must apply for the same in the usual manner to the ministers controlling their respective departments, and must keep an account of the way in which such envelopes as they may be supplied with are used.

All postage stamps (issued on requisition) that may be unexpended after the 2nd proximo, must be sent to this office with as little delay as possible, in order that the persons against whom they are charged may be duly credited with the value of the stamps returned by them.

## ADDITIONAL POLLING PLACE FOR THE DUNDAS ELECTORAL DISTRICT.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the ninth day of May, 1864.

WHEREAS by *The Electoral Act*, 1863, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council shall, within thirty days after the commencement thereof, and afterwards as he shall see fit from time to time, appoint within and for each division of every province and district respectively one place and not more for taking the poll in such division at contested elections for the province or district, and every such appointment may revoke; provided that if the returning officer of the province or district and any police magistrate or superintendent of police acting in the locality shall by writing under their hands certify to the Governor that it is necessary so to do, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to appoint as aforesaid in and for such division one or more polling place or places, and the appointment of such place or places or any of them from time to time to revoke; provided also that no appointment of any polling place in or for any division of a province or district shall be revoked between the issue of any writ for election for the same and the return of such writ: And whereas the returning officer for the Dundas electoral district and the police magistrate acting in the locality have, by writing under their hands, certified to the Governor that it is necessary to appoint an additional polling place for the Casterton division of the said district: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order appoint Coleraine to be an additional polling place in and for the Casterton division for taking the poll in such division at contested elections for the electoral district of Dundas.

And the Honorable James McCulloch, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## UNION UNDER THE "WEIGHTS AND MEASURES STATUTE, 1861."

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, called, *The Weights and Measures Statute*, 1864, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council, at the request of and pursuant to any agreement made by the councils or boards of any two or more of any adjoining boroughs, shires, and road districts, may proclaim such boroughs, shires, and districts to be a "union" for the purposes of the said Act, and by such proclamation fix the proportion in which the expenses devolving upon such union under the said Act shall be borne by the several bodies corporate of such boroughs, shires, or districts: And whereas the councils of the Shires of Lexton and Ballarat have requested that the said shires may be proclaimed a "union," and that the expenses devolving upon such union under the said Act may be borne in the proportions of one-third by the Shire of Lexton, and two-thirds by the Shire of Ballarat: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do proclaim the Shires of Lexton and Ballarat to be a "union" for the purposes of the said Act, and do fix the proportion in which the expenses devolving upon such union under the said Act shall be borne by the councils of the said shires as follows:—One-third by the council of the Shire of Lexton, and two-thirds by the council of the Shire of Ballarat.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-seventh day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.

## NOTICE TO MARINERS.

## ADDITIONAL LIGHT, MORETON BAY.

ON and after this date, a fixed bright light will be exhibited from Cowan Cowan Point, 18 feet above highwater mark. This light will be visible between the bearings of S. by E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. and E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N., and between N.E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N. and N.N.E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E.; it will also be again seen to the eastward of N. by E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E.

Comboyuro Point light will, on and after this date, be also visible between the bearings of N.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. and N. by W., northerly.

*Directions.*—Vessels entering Moreton Bay, during the night, by the Middle Channel, keeping the lighthouse and Yellow Patch light in one, and hauling up to the southward, on the opening out of the Comboyuro Point light, will (supposing the eye of the observer to be 17 feet above the water line) open out the light on Cowan Cowan Point, when they are well clear of the western edge of the Venus bank, and by keeping this light open they will not approach too close to any portion of that bank. When the Yellow Patch light is shut out, a vessel should haul up S. by E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E., the Comboyuro Point light being obscured as formerly, on an E.N.E. bearing, and again opening out when bearing N.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. After opening out Comboyuro Point light on this bearing, vessels will, by keeping this light in sight, be to the westward of the shoal water off Cowan Cowan Point; and to the eastward of the S.W. spit in Yule Roads, and of those portions of the S.W. banks on which there is less than 15 feet water, at low water.

The light on Cowan Cowan Point will be obscured when it bears E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N., and will open out at N.E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N., remaining visible between that bearing and N.N.E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. While the light on Cowan Cowan Point is kept in sight between these bearings, a vessel will be clear of the S.W. banks on her starboard, and the middle bank on her port hand, being in not less than 3 fathoms, on either side of the channel; until, however, the Ship Patch bears east, vessels in working to the S.W. may stand across from the line of eclipsed light off the S.E. edge of the S.W. banks, until the light again opens out in a line to the eastward of the middle bank. Soon after dipping the Cowan Cowan light, the lightship at the bar will be visible above the horizon.

Vessels arriving in the port at night, and wishing to anchor on the 6 fathom bank in Yule Roads should, while keeping in sight the light on Cowan Cowan Point, anchor as soon as convenient after opening out the Comboyuro Point light on the N.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. bearing.

THE Governor in Council, on the 18th day of July instant, approved of the subjoined Regulations\* for the Victorian Volunteer Engineers, to be substituted in place of the Regulations approved on the 24th of November, 1863.

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE VOLUNTEER ENGINEERS.

THE following Regulations are substituted for those previously published:—

##### ENROLMENT.

No person shall be enrolled as a member of the Victorian Engineer Corps unless he shall have been educated as an architect, surveyor, civil, mechanical, or mining engineer, or as an assistant to one or other of them, or shall be a skilled mechanic, or have served in the corps of Royal Engineers.

##### DEFINITION OF AN EFFECTIVE.

On the 1st of January in any year after 1865, the following volunteers, and no others, will be classed as effective in the above-named branch of the force:

- (A.) Any volunteer who was enrolled before the 1st April of the year next preceding, and who has during that year—
- (1.) Attended two battalion parades.
  - (2.) Attended nine parades of the corps.
  - (3.) Attended and passed an official inspection.
  - (4.) Passed an official inspection in some branch of military engineering.
  - (5.) Attended eighteen musters of the corps for exercise and instruction, of which ten at least were for engineering instruction.
  - (6.) Gone through the modified course of musketry instruction as laid down for the corps.
- (B.) Any volunteer who was enrolled between the 1st April and 30th June of the year next preceding, and who has during that year—
- (1.) Attended two battalion parades.
  - (2.) Attended and passed an official inspection.
  - (3.) Passed an official inspection in some branch of military engineering.
  - (4.) Attended six parades of the corps.
  - (5.) Attended twelve musters of the corps for exercise and instruction, of which seven at least were for engineering instruction.
- (C.) Any volunteer who was enrolled between the 1st July and 30th September of the year next preceding, and who has during that year—
- (1.) Attended one battalion parade.
  - (2.) Attended and passed one parade for official inspection.
  - (3.) Attended five parades of the corps.
  - (4.) Attended nine musters of the corps for exercise and instruction, of which five at least were for engineering instruction.

On the 1st of January, 1865, all who have qualified as effectives, either under these regulations, or under those hitherto existing, will be classed as such.

##### RECRUIT DRILL.

Every recruit before enrolment shall attend twelve drills of one hour each within three weeks, and shall pass in squad drill and the manual and platoon exercises, unless he shall at some previous time have been in the army, or a member of the volunteer force, in which case it shall be sufficient to attend such drills as the commanding officer may order, and to pass.

##### PARADES.

In the definition of an effective, a parade shall mean an assembly of the corps under arms in the open air, for instruction in the field exercises and evolutions of infantry, at which twenty at least are present.

##### ALLOWANCES FOR THE MAINTENANCE OF THE CORPS.

On the 1st of January in each year the commanding officer of the corps will be credited with a sum of £6 for each effective should the number of effectives be below 75, and if over that number with a sum of £8 for each effective in excess of that number; but no claim shall be admitted should the number of effectives be below 37.

##### FINES AND SUBSCRIPTIONS.

Every member of the corps who fails to attend muster twice in each month shall pay 2s. 6d. fine; every corporal or sergeant, 5s.; every commissioned officer, 10s., unless on leave of absence or medical certificate.

##### MISCELLANEOUS.

Any member who shall not, during the time of training and exercise, conduct himself in an orderly manner, or shall not obey the command of his superior officer, may be placed in the custody of members of the volunteer force for the period of such training or exercise.

Any member may, for any military offence, be placed under arrest by his superior officer.

Arrest shall signify a suspension from all military duty; and members placed in arrest shall, on demand, deliver up their arms and accoutrements and uniform to such person as the officer commanding the corps may direct.

\* These Regulations were published in the *Gazette* of the 22nd of July, 1864 (page 1558 *ante*), and through a clerical error were designated as "Rules adopted by the Victorian Volunteer Engineers."

The officer commanding the volunteer force may, at any time, order a court of enquiry to be assembled; and such courts of enquiry shall be conducted, as far as practicable, according to the regulations in force in Her Majesty's army.

Acting appointments for temporary purposes, as officers and non-commissioned officers, may be given by the officer commanding the force; and members, while holding such appointments, shall exercise the same authority as though they were permanently appointed.

#### APPORTIONMENT OF TOLLS.

THE Governor in Council, in pursuance of the provisions contained in the 255th clause of *The Local Government Act, 1863*, has, by an Order in Council made on the 18th day of July, 1864, determined that the revenue derived from Tolls collected on the St. Kilda or Brighton road, proclaimed a Common-toll road under Orders in Council of 23rd December, 1863, and of the 8th February, 30th March, and 2nd May, 1864, relating respectively to the Brighton road, the Gardiner's Creek road, the Point Nepean road, and the Dandenong road, shall be distributed amongst the several local bodies in the following proportions, viz., to

The Corporation of the City of Melbourne, twenty-nine sixtieths.

The Council of the Borough of St. Kilda, eighteen sixtieths.

The Council of the Borough of Prahran, eleven sixtieths.

The Caulfield District Road Board, one sixtieth.

The Gardiner District Road Board, one sixtieth.

#### WORKS ON MAIN ROADS ORDERED UNDER "THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1863."

THE Governor in Council, in exercise of the power conferred by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, has, by Orders severally made on the 30th day of May and the 18th day of July, 1864, directed that the undermentioned Shire Council and District Boards shall, within the times by the said respective Orders appointed, execute the works on Main Roads hereinafter named and described, as provided by the 220th section of the said Act, that is to say:—

The District Board of the Berwick Road District shall, pursuant to Order in Council made on the 30th day of May, 1864, and within six months from the making thereof, execute the following works, according to a plan deposited by the said District Board with the Board of Land and Works, and recorded as (64.1613), viz.—Draining, forming, and metalling a portion of the Main Gipps Land road, in five several sections eastwards of the second mile-post. [This notification is in lieu of a former one in page 1220 *ante* referring to the same Road District, in which the works were inaccurately described.]

The Council of the Shire of Leigh shall, pursuant to Order in Council made on the 18th day of July, 1864, and within five months from the making thereof, execute the following works, according to a plan deposited by the said Council with the Board of Land and Works, and recorded as (64.2233), viz.—Draining, forming, and metalling about two miles and thirty-eight and a half chains (2 m. 38½ ch.) of the Main Upper Western road in four several sections.

The District Board of the Stawell Road District shall, pursuant to Order in Council made on the 18th day of July, 1864, and within five months from the making thereof, execute the following works, according to a plan deposited by the said District Board with the Board of Land and Works, and recorded as (64.2232), viz.—Draining, forming, and metalling about forty-nine (49) chains of the Main Ararat to Horsham road at Great Western township.

#### ROAD DISTRICT PETITIONED FOR.

##### PORTION OF NORTH GIPPS LAND.

A PETITION, signed by ten persons possessing rateable property within the area hereinafter described, has been presented to the Governor, in accordance with the 3rd clause of *The Local Government Act, 1863*, wherein they state that they reside in such area, and that it contains not less than forty square miles, and rateable property of not less than Five thousand pounds net annual value; and the petitioners pray that such area may be proclaimed a Road District.

The area above referred to is "the portion of North Gipps Land comprised within" the following boundaries, viz.: "Commencing at the entrance of the La Trobe River into Lake Wellington; along the north bank of the said river to the junction of the Thomson; thence along the River Thomson as far as the western boundary of the parish of Tinamba; thence by the said boundary (northerly) to its termination; thence by a line about north-east to the junction of Valencia Creek with the River Avon; thence by a line about south-east to the northern boundary of the parish of Stratford; thence easterly by the northern boundaries of the parishes of Stratford, Yerung, and Meerlieu to Tom's Creek; thence down Tom's Creek to Lake Victoria; thence by the western shores of Lake Victoria to McLennan's Straits; thence by those straits and the northern and western shores of Lake Wellington to the commencing point."

The Governor has been pleased to order that the said petition be taken into consideration by his Executive Council on Monday, the 5th day of September in the present year.

PYALONG CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE PYALONG GENERAL CEMETERY.

ALL fees must be paid when orders are given or before the grave or vault is opened.  
2. Any person making a vault or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees, under these rules, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a

vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person and his representatives for ever.

3. Application for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the charges in the schedule hereto, signed by one of the trustees.

4. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on a certificate from the minister, or other evidence, proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the cost and charges.

5. Orders for interments to be given either to the keeper or at the office of the trustees; such notice to be given between the hours of Ten a.m. and Three p.m., if not, an extra charge will be made.

6. The name, age, late place of residence, and date of death of the deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.

7. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. throughout the year.

8. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owner.

9. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

10. The positions of all graves to be determined by the trustees.

11. All graves must be sunk of not less than five feet in depth.

12. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription, to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are to determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument, according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan of ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner.

13. No servants or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

14. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the Survey Office, and may be inspected at the charge set out in the schedule. A registry of all grants are kept by the secretary.

15. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.
