NOTICE TO APPLICANTS FOR LEASES OF AURIFEROUS LANDS.

THE attention of applicants for Mining Leases is directed to the Ninth and Eleventh clauses, Leases, of the Regulations under Act No. 148, relating to Leases of Auriferous Lands, and for other purposes, where it is notified that—

9. The parcel of land demised shall be, in ordinary leases, in the form of a parallelogram (except where the same shall be impracticable by reason of the adjoining land being occupied, or from insuperable impediments), and the maximum length thereof shall not, except as hereinafter provided for, exceed more than twice the maximum breadth, and shall be accurately described by metes and bounds.
11. The extent of the areas of leases shall be (except in special cases hereinafter provided for):—
 1. For ordinary leases an area not less than one acre nor more than thirty acres.
 2. For quartz leases an area the length of which shall not exceed six hundred yards, nor be less than one hundred yards along the line of the lode, and the width thereof shall not be more than two hundred yards nor less than fifty yards measured across the lode;

and they are hereby required to mark out such lands as near as may be in the form therein prescribed.

Much delay and no little inconvenience have occurred in consequence of lessees marking out areas in such a manner as to include lands which by law cannot be demised for mining purposes.

NOTICE TO AGENTS, MASTERS OF VESSELS, AND SEAMEN.

WITH reference to the "Notice" in the *Government Gazette*, dated 25th March, 1859, the following conditions under which "permits" will be granted to seamen to engage with masters of vessels in the absence of certificates of discharge, are published for general information, viz. :—

1. No seaman shall be engaged in the *coasting* trade without a certificate of discharge.
2. In the *foreign* trade, if a master engages a man without a certificate of discharge, a "permit" may be granted on payment of a fee of Five shillings.
3. In cases where it can be clearly shown by the books of the office that a man has lost his certificate of discharge, the shipping master may issue a "permit" on payment of a fee of Five shillings.
4. No seaman shall be engaged by an officer of the Shipping Office without production of a "permit" or certificate of discharge.

Seamen are cautioned that they become liable to a penalty of six months imprisonment, or a fine of £50, for the fraudulent use of certificates of discharge, and that the provisions of the law in that respect will be strictly enforced.

THE BOROUGH OF TABNAGULLA.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the eighth day of August, 1864.

PRESENT :

His Excellency the Governor in Council.

WHEREAS by *The Municipal Corporations Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted that any district not being a district wholly or in part comprised within the limits of the city of Melbourne, or, as therein provided, the town of Geelong, or of any of the boroughs constituted by or under the said Act, which district shall not exceed in area nine square miles, and shall have no one point in such area distant more than six miles from any other point therein, and shall contain a population of inhabitant householders not less than three hundred, may be constituted a borough in manner next hereinafter mentioned; and it is also enacted that if not less than one hundred and fifty of the inhabitant householders resident within any such last-mentioned district shall sign and cause to be presented to the Governor a petition, praying him to constitute such district a borough under the said Act, and in such petition shall set forth accurately the boundaries of the district to which

such petition shall refer, and if within one month of the publication as hereinafter mentioned of such petition, an equal or greater number of inhabitant householders resident within such district so described shall not have signed and caused to be presented to the Governor a petition praying him not to grant the prayer of such first-mentioned petition, it shall be lawful for the Governor, by an Order in Council, if it shall seem fit, to constitute such district, or any portion thereof, a borough within the meaning of the said Act; and it is further enacted that in every such Order in Council as aforesaid the name and boundaries of the borough thereby constituted shall be set forth, and upon the making of every such order the district therein named shall be and be deemed to be a "borough" hereinafter sometimes called a "proclaimed borough" within the meaning of the said Act; provided that such district shall not comprise any locality not included within the boundaries set forth in the petition for the constitution thereof. And whereas a petition in accordance with the provisions of the said Act has been presented to the Governor, and notice of such petition has been duly given in the *Government Gazette* of the sixth day of July now last past: And whereas no petition has been presented to the Governor, in the manner allowed and prescribed by the said Act, praying him not to grant the prayer of the petition above mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, in exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act, constitute the district hereinafter described a borough within the meaning of the said Act, and doth set forth the name and the boundaries of the said borough in manner following, that is to say:—

THE BOROUGH OF TARNAGULLA—Commencing at a point in the centre of the River Loddon where it is intersected by the northern boundary of the township of Newbridge; hence west about 80 chains; hence south 51 degrees west about 3 miles 70 chains; hence south along the western boundary of the township of Tarnagulla about 1 mile 30 chains; hence east 1 mile 20 chains; hence north 44 degrees east about 2 miles 40 chains; hence north 39 chains; hence east 80 chains to the centre of the River Loddon; hence northerly along the course of the Loddon about 1 mile 40 chains to the point of commencement.

And the Honorable James McCulloch, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

DISTRICT FOR BEER LICENSES.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirit Sale Statute, 1864*, it is amongst other things enacted that a beer license shall authorize the licensee to sell and dispose of, not earlier than six o'clock in the morning nor later than eight o'clock in the evening, any ale or beer to be drunk in the house or on the premises described in such license, except in the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or in any borough, and if the premises described in such license be subsequently to the granting of such license brought within any borough, such license shall expire at the end of the then current year; provided that upon the application by the council of any borough the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare the whole or any part of such borough a district wherein beer licenses may be granted, and may on a like application revoke any such proclamation: And whereas the Council of the borough of Smythesdale has made application that the whole of the said borough may be declared a district under the proviso of the Act above recited: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare the whole of the borough of Smythesdale to be a district wherein Beer Licenses may be granted.

SEVERANCE OF A FARMERS' COMMON.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the council of each shire shall, in the place and stead of the Board of Land and Works, alone have control over all farmers' commons and temporary commons for the use of selectors of lands, such commons respectively being within the shire and proclaimed under the Act numbered CXLV, and over all farmers' commons within the meaning of the Act numbered CXVII, within the shire;

and it is also enacted, that in all cases in which part only of any such common as hereinbefore mentioned shall be situated within any shire, the Governor in Council may order that the whole of such common either shall be and be deemed included in, or shall be and be deemed excluded from, such shire, or else may order that the several parts of such common so lying within and without such shire respectively shall be separate commons, and such common shall to all intents and purposes be deemed to be either within or without such shire, or such several parts thereof to be separate commons according to the tenor of such order: And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the fourth day of March, 1861, the Little River and Duck Ponds Farmers' Commons were constituted, and by another Proclamation bearing date the twenty-sixth day of January, 1863, the said commons were united: And whereas part of the said united common lies within and part thereof lies without the shire of Wyndham, and it is expedient to constitute such parts separate commons: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do order and proclaim that the part of the said United Farmers' Common of Little River and Duck Ponds, in the county of Grant, situated within the boundaries of the shire of Wyndham, and containing an area of 4480 acres, more or less, shall be a separate common and subject to the control of the Council of the said shire of Wyndham in the manner provided by the said Act.

DISTRICT BROUGHT UNDER THE GUNPOWDER ACT.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to regulate the importation, carriage, and custody of Gunpowder*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to proclaim any town, township, or municipal district, not being a sea-port town, as a district into which no gunpowder shall be brought unless for deposit in a public or licensed magazine; and if any person shall bring more than one hundred pounds of gunpowder into any such district, and shall not forthwith deposit the same in a magazine as aforesaid, it shall be forfeited: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the borough of St. Arnaud as a district into which no gunpowder shall be brought unless for deposit in a public or licensed magazine.

MINING OPERATIONS AUTHORISED WITHIN EXEMPTED LAND AT QUEENSTOWN.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, by Order made on the 8th day of August, 1864, under the authority conferred by the Gold Fields Act, 21 Victoria No. 32, authorised the holders of miners' rights to prosecute mining operations within the limits of the land reserved for public purposes at Queenstown, subject to the following conditions:—

1. The miners shall not mine on or within, or in any way interfere with, that portion of the said reserve now fenced in and used by the police, nor with the road leading through the reserve to the police station.
2. In case any person mining shall in any way violate the above conditions, it shall not be lawful for him any longer to mine upon any claim upon or within such lands.
