THE attention of applicants for Mining Leases is directed to the Ninth and Eleventh clauses, Leases, of the Regulations under Act No. 148, relating to Leases of Auriferous Lands, and for other purposes, where it is notified that—

- 9. By His Excellency Sir Charles Hnnry Darling, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS the District Board of the Bylands and Glenburnie Road District has complained to the Governor in Council that it ought, by reason of the traffic passing along the road hereinafter mentioned being common to its own district with the district in which tolls are payable upon such road, to have a share of such tolls in the manner provided in the 254 h clause of The Local Government Act, 1863: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the road hereinafter mentioned to be a Common-toll road, for the purposes and within the meaning of the provisions of the said Act relating to Common-toll roads, viz.—

The portion of the Sydney road extending from the southern to the northern boundary of the Bylands and Glenburnie Road Districts, shall be a Common-toll road of the Borough of Kilmore, and of the Bylands and Glenburnie, the Willowmavin, and the Pylatong Road Districts.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fifteenth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.

With reference to three several Proclamations of Commontoll roads, 1st. from Finders street, Melbourne, vid Prince's Bridge to Sandridge; 2nd, from Sandridge road to Flinders street, over Falls Bridge; under Orders in Council dated respectively the 28th of December, 1863, and the 11th of April and 30th of May, 1864: The tolls payable and collected on the said roads and the bridges thereon shall be distributed among the City and Borough Councils interested therein in the following proportions, viz.:—
