TOWN COMMON INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act*, 1862, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE TOWN COMMON OF BERWICK, described amongst others in two several Proclamations bearing date respectively the eighteenth day of February, 1861, and the twenty-second day of December, 1862, is hereby further increased by adding thereto allotment 58, parish of Pakenham, containing 137 acres 2 roods and 22 perches, more or less, as shown on a plan deposited in the Lands and Survey Office, Melbourne.—(64.J.6426.)

CONTROL OVER CERTAIN FARMERS' COMMONS.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act*, 1863, it is amongst other things enacted, that the council of each shire shall, in the place and stead of the Board of Land and Works, alone have control over all farmers' commons and temporary commons for the use of selectors of lands, such commons respectively being within the shire and proclaimed under the Act numbered CXLV., and over all farmers' commons within the meaning of the Act numbered CXVII., within the shire; and it is also enacted, that in all cases in which part only of any such common as hereinbefore mentioned shall be situated within any shire, the Governor in Council may order that the whole of such common either shall be and be deemed included in, or shall be and be deemed excluded from, such shire, or else may order that the several parts of such common so lying within and without such shire respectively shall be separate commons, and such common shall to all intents and purposes be deemed to be either within or without such shire, or such several parts thereof to be separate commons according to the tenor of such order: And whereas the respective Farmers' Commons hereinafter mentioned are situated partly within and partly without the respective shires of Hampden and Winchelsea, and it is expedient that each of the said commons

should be wholly comprised in the shires within which respectively each thereof is hereinafter included: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do order and proclaim that the Farmers' Commons hereinafter mentioned shall respectively be wholly included within the shires mentioned in conjunction with their names, in the manner provided by the said Act, that is to say:—

LARPERT FARMERS' COMMON.—The Farmers' Common described amongst others as situate at Larpernt, in a Proclamation bearing date the fourth day of March, 1861, part only of which common is comprised within the shire of Hampden, shall be deemed to be and is hereby wholly included within the said shire of Hampden.—(64.L.6317.)

MODEWARRE FARMERS' COMMON.—The Farmers' Common described amongst others as situate at Modewarre, in a Proclamation bearing date the fourth day of March, 1861, and subsequently increased by a Proclamation bearing date the first day of December, 1862, part only of which common is comprised within the shire of Winchelsea, shall be deemed to be and is hereby wholly included within the said shire of Winchelsea.—(64.L.5980.)

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act, 1862*, it is amongst other things enacted; that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields township, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively; as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and alter the commons respectively hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

LINTON TOWN COMMON.—The Town Common for Linton shall be and comprise the area hereinafter mentioned, viz.:—Three thousand acres, more or less, county of Grenville, being all the unappropriated land comprised within the following boundaries: Commencing at the north-west angle of the Argyle and Linton's Farmers' Common; thence north ninety-two chains, more or less; thence east three hundred chains, more or less; thence south by part of Brown's and Scarsdale Municipal Common, and part of Linton's, Brown's, Happy Valley, &c., Gold Fields Common, two hundred chains, more or less, to the north-east angle of allotment 18, parish of Argyle; thence west sixty chains, more or less, to the north-east angle of allotment 15; thence north one hundred and fifty chains, more or less, to the north-east angle of Linton township reserve; by the north boundary thereof and part of the west boundary west and south to the north-east angle of Argyle and Linton's Farmers' Common; thence west by the north boundary of said common one hundred and sixty chains, more or less, to the point of commencement; as shown on plan deposited in the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(64.J.4903.)

EDDINGTON FARMERS' COMMON.—The Farmers' Common described amongst others in a Proclamation bearing date the fourth day of March, 1861, as situate at Eddington, is hereby altered; and the area hereinafter described shall be and constitute the said Farmers' Common, viz.:—About Four thousand two hundred and ninety acres. Commencing at the north-east angle of portion 2A of section 7, parish of Eddington; bounded on the east by the Fullarop Creek, bearing southerly to the south-east angle of portions 13 and 12 of section 7, and by a line bearing west, together about two hundred and thirty-five chains; on the west by part of the west boundary of the parish of Eddington, the eastern boundary of portion 8, and part of portion 7 of section 4, parish of Bet-bet, together bearing north about one hundred and thirty-eight chains; on the north from the south-west angle of portion 4 of section 5 to the south-east angle of portion 3, bearing east about thirty-three chains; on the west by a road one chain wide, bearing north about sixty chains; on the north-west by a continuation of this road in a north-easterly direction to its intersection with the main three chains wide road; thence crossing this road to the south-west angle of portion 1A of section 7, parish of Eddington; on the

west by the main road, bearing north about twenty-five chains; and on the north by a road one chain wide, bearing east about one hundred chains to commencing point.—(64.L.6889.)

MAIN ROADS UNDER "THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1863."

THE Governor in Council, in exercise of the power conferred by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, has, by Orders in Council severally made on the 22nd day of August, 1864, appointed the roads hereinafter mentioned to be main roads, upon applications made in accordance with the 219th clause of the said Act, viz.:—

1. The road extending from the eastern boundary of the borough of Tarnagulla to the township of Newbridge, and thence to Kangaroo Flat.

2. The Ballarat to Amherst road, extending from its junction with the Main Ballarat to Avoca road, *via* Mount Blowhard, to the southern boundary of the Amherst and Clunes Road District.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE BACCHUS-MARSH TROOP OF THE PRINCE OF WALES V.V. LIGHT HORSE.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

THE civil affairs of the troop shall be conducted by a committee of six, consisting of the captain, one lieutenant, one sergeant, one corporal, and two troopers.

2. The members of committee, under the rank of captain, shall remain in office until the 31st of December in each year, when a re-election of members shall take place; the former members being competent to be re-elected.

3. Any vacancy that may occur during the year, amongst the members of committee, may be filled up by the election of a member of the same rank at the next ensuing general meeting of the troop.

4. The commanding officer of the troop shall have power to dispense with the services of any member of committee who shall fail to attend four consecutive committee meetings without assigning a sufficient reason therefor.

MEETINGS OF THE TROOP.

5. At any meeting of the troop, the senior officer present shall be chairman.

6. There shall be a general meeting of the troop after each commanding officer's parade.

7. No meeting of the troop shall be convened for any specific purpose, unless due notice thereof, with the object for which such meeting is convened, shall have been posted on the notice board of the troop at the post office, at least six days before the day appointed for holding such meeting.

8. Before any rules shall be added, altered, or expunged, there shall be present at the meeting held for that purpose, not less than fifteen members, exclusive of the chairman.

FINES AND SUBSCRIPTIONS.

9. Every member who fails to attend muster for parades twice in each month, shall pay Two shillings and sixpence fine to his troop; every corporal or sergeant, Five shillings; every commissioned officer, Ten shillings; unless on leave of absence or medical certificate.

10. Any member appearing on commanding officer's parade with his arms, uniform, or accoutrements, dirty or unserviceable, or not in full uniform, shall be liable to a fine of One shilling, at the option of the senior officer present.

11. All excuses for absence from parade must be in writing, and shall be submitted to the senior officer present at such parade, and approved of by him, before any member shall be marked as on leave.

12. Any member intending to absent himself for more than sixty days from his permanent address, must give notice thereof in writing to his commanding officer, and deposit his arms, accoutrements, and uniform in the quartermaster's store; and in default he shall be liable to a penalty of Ten shillings.

13. Any member who may be fined must pay the amount of such fine to the non-commissioned officer appointed to receive the same, within fourteen days of its notification to him, and in default he will be proceeded against according to law.

14. An account of all fines, as incurred and received, shall be kept in a book, which shall be open for inspection at the Orderly Room.

15. A subscription of One shilling per month shall be due and payable from each member for the general uses of the troop; and such subscription shall be recoverable in a summary way in the same manner as the fines.

MISCELLANEOUS.

16. Every candidate for admission to the troop shall send to the secretary an application in writing, stating his name, age, height, occupation, and address; and such application shall be read out at the next commanding officer's parade, and submitted to the committee at their next meeting, and thereupon the committee shall have power to admit or reject the candidate.

17. Every member shall be responsible for the good order of his arms, accoutrements, and uniform, and any damage done thereto shall be made good by him; the result of accidents only excepted.

18. The commanding officer of the troop shall have power to strike the name of any member off the roll who shall fail to attend muster for commanding officer's parade for three consecutive months, without having received leave of absence.

19. Any member expelled the troop within twelve months from the receipt of new uniform, shall pay to the officer commanding the full contract price of the same, within thirty days of his expulsion, and in default shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding such contract; or if expelled at a period exceeding the said term of twelve months, he shall pay to such officer one-half of the contract price thereof within the said term, or be liable to a penalty not exceeding such amount.

20. At every half-yearly meeting of the troop, a balance sheet showing the actual financial position of the troop, shall be submitted by the committee; and all accounts shall be audited by two members, to be elected at such meeting.

21. An account shall be kept by the secretary between the troop and each of its members, wherein the member shall be debited with all liabilities incurred by the troop on his behalf, and all sums payable by him as fines, subscriptions, or otherwise, and credited with all sums earned by him as an effective, as well as all payments made by him.

22. If on the 1st of January in any year a member's debit exceed his credit, he shall be fined the amount of such difference.

23. If any member desire to quit the troop, under the provisions of the Act, he shall be fined the amount whereby his debit exceeds his credit.

NOTICE TO APPLICANTS FOR LEASES OF AURIFEROUS LANDS.

THE attention of applicants for Mining Leases is directed to the Ninth and Eleventh clauses, Leases, of the Regulations under Act No. 148, relating to Leases of Auriferous Lands, and for other purposes, where it is notified that—

9. The parcel of land demised shall be, in ordinary leases, in the form of a parallelogram (except where the same shall be impracticable by reason of the adjoining land being occupied, or from insuperable impediments), and the maximum length thereof shall not, except as herein-after provided for, exceed more than twice the maximum breadth, and shall be accurately described by metes and bounds.

11. The extent of the areas of leases shall be (except in special cases hereinafter provided for) —

1. For ordinary leases an area not less than one acre nor more than thirty acres.

2. For quartz leases an area the length of which shall not exceed six hundred yards, nor be less than one hundred yards along the line of the lode, and the width thereof shall not be more than two hundred yards nor less than fifty yards measured across the lode;

and they are hereby required to mark out such lands as near as may be in the form therein prescribed.

Much delay and no little inconvenience have occurred in consequence of lessees marking out areas in such a manner as to include lands which by law cannot be demised for mining purposes.
