POLLING PLACES FOR CERTAIN ELECTORAL DISTRICTS.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the twenty-ninth day of August, 1864.

WHEREAS by *The Electoral Act*, 1863, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council shall, within thirty days after the commencement thereof, and afterwards as he shall see fit from time to time, appoint within and for each division of every province and district respectively one place and not more for taking the poll in such division at contested elections for the province or district, and every such appointment may revoke; provided that if the returning officer of the province or district and any police magistrate or superintendent of police acting in the locality shall by writing under their hands certify to the Governor that it is necessary so to do it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to appoint as aforesaid in and for such division one or more polling place or places, and the appointment of such place or places or any of them from time to time to revoke; provided also that no appointment of any polling place in or for any division of a province or district shall be revoked between the issue of any writ for election for the same and the return of such writ: And whereas the returning officers for the respective electoral districts and the police magistrates acting in the respective localities hereinafter mentioned have, by writing under their hands, certified to the Governor that it is necessary to appoint additional polling places for certain divisions of such districts: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order appoint the polling places mentioned in the Schedule hereunto annexed to be polling places for the divisions opposite to the names of which they are respectively placed, for the purpose of taking the poll in and for such respective divisions at contested elections for the electoral districts within which they are respectively situated, that is to say:-

DISTRICT FOR BEER LICENSES.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight
Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath,
Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of
Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirit Sale Statute*, 1864, it is amongst other things enacted that a beer license shall authorize the licensee to sell and dispose of, not earlier than Six o'clock in the morning nor later than Eight o'clock in the evening, any ale or beer to be drunk in the house or on the premises described in such license, except in the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or in any borough, and if the premises described in such license be subsequently to the granting of such license brought within any borough, such license shall expire at the end of the then current year; provided that upon the application by the council of any borough the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare the whole or any part of such borough a district wherein beer licenses may be granted, and may on a like application revoke any such proclamation: And whereas the Council of the borough of Portland has made application that the whole of the said borough may be declared a district under the proviso of the Act above recited: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare the whole of the borough of Portland to be a district wherein Beer Licenses may be granted.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-second day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.

NOTICE TO APPLICANTS FOR LEASES OF AURIFEROUS LANDS.

THE attention of applicants for Mining Leases is directed to the Ninth and Eleventh clauses, Leases, of the Regulations under Act No. 148, relating to Leases of Auriferous Lands, and for other purposes, where it is notified that—

9. The parcel of land demised shall be, in ordinary leases, in the form of a parallelogram (except where the same shall be impracticable by reason of the adjoining land being occupied, or from insuperable impediments), and the maximum length thereof shall not, except as hereinafter provided, exceed more than twice the maximum breadth, and shall be accurately described by metes and bounds.

11. The extent of the areas of leases shall be (except in special cases hereinafter provided for)—

1. For ordinary leases an area not less than one acre nor more than thirty acres.

2. For quartz leases an area the length of which shall not exceed six hundred yards, nor be less than one hundred yards along the line of the lode, and the width thereof shall not be more than two hundred yards nor less than fifty yards measured across the lode;

and they are hereby required to mark out such lands as near as may be in the form therein prescribed.

Much delay and no little inconvenience have occurred in consequence of lessees marking out areas in such a manner as to include lands which by law cannot be demised for mining purposes.

REGISTRAR-GENERAL'S REPORT ON THE VITAL STATISTICS OF MELBOURNE AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF JULY, 1864.

ACTUAL Daily Mortality of persons of both sexes under and over five years of age in the Statistical District of Melbourne and suburbs, embracing a radius of ten miles, and including the Statistical Sub-districts of Melbourne Proper, East Melbourne, North Melbourne and Carlton, Fitz Roy Municipality, East Collingwood, Richmond, Jika-jika parish (exclusive of North Melbourne, Collingwood, and Richmond), South Yarra and Frahran, Emerald Hill and Sandridge, St. Kilda and Brighton, Dousta Galla and Keilor, Boroondara and Heidelberg, Cut-paw-paw parish, and the shipping in Hobson's Bay; also, the Temperature in the shade at Melbourne, deduced from the mean of twenty-four hourly observations taken at the Melbourne Observatory on each day during the month of July, 1864:—

The mortality in July was considerably below the average as compared with that of the same month in former years. It was also lower than in any other month since the beginning of the present year. About the average mean temperature and atmospheric pressure prevailed.

Sixty-two per cent. of the deaths were of males, 38 per cent. of females; 44 per cent. were of children under five years of age, against 45 per cent. in July, 1863, 46 per cent. in July, 1862, 50 per cent. in July, 1861, and 43 per cent. in July, 1860.

Thirteen deaths was the highest number recorded on any one day, these occurred on the 7th. Only 4 deaths took place on the 12th, 22nd, 23rd, and 28th, these were the days of lowest mortality.

No instances of deaths of persons at extreme ages were recorded during the month. The oldest person who died was a female at 75 years of phtisis.

Nine deaths from violence were reported as having taken place during the month. These were returned as follows:—A railway constable, aged 36, was killed by a train; a miner, aged 18, by being passed over by the wheel of a dray, and a lad, aged 12, by the same cause. A lad, aged 15, died of dislocation of the neck; a female of 15 died of burns, and a child of 3 from the effects of a scald. An infant of 5 weeks, and another of 18 weeks old, were accidentally suffocated. A merchant, aged 37, committed self destruction by shooting.

Thirty-one deaths occurred in the Melbourne Hospital, 5 in the Benevolent Asylum, 15 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Immigrants' Home, 1 in the Collingwood Stockade, and 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, making in all 56 deaths in public institutions, or 26 per cent. of the total mortality.

The following table shows the number of persons of all ages according to the last census, the number of deaths of persons under and over five years of age, the total at all ages, and the number of deaths to every 1000 of the population during the month of July, in the Statistical District of Melbourne and suburbs, and in each of the sub-districts of which it is composed:—

Of the 95 children dying under the age of five years, 55, or 58 per cent., were males, and 40, or 42 per cent., were females; 53 were under one year of age, 14 were between one and two years, 8 were between two and three, 10 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five.

Of the 121 deaths of persons beyond five years of age, 80, or rather more than 66 per cent., were of males, and 41, or nearly 34 per cent., were of females; of those dying, 9 were between five and ten years of age, 3 were between ten and fifteen, 7 were between fifteen and twenty, 8 were between twenty and twenty-five, 9 were between twenty-five and thirty, 12 were between thirty and thirty-five, 12 were between thirty-five and forty, 17 were between forty and forty-five, 10 were between forty-five and fifty, 12 were between fifty and fifty-five, 3 were between fifty-five and sixty, 9 were between sixty and sixty-five, 4 were between sixty-five and seventy, 5 were between seventy and seventy-five, and 1 was seventy-five years old.

MELTON ROAD DISTRICT.

BYE-LAWS OF THE DISTRICT ROAD BOARD, MADE TO REGULATE THE PROCEEDINGS THEREOF.

THE business of the board, on ordinary occasions, shall be conducted with open doors, but any two members present may require the exclusion of strangers until the board has decided whether the debate be continued publicly or otherwise.

2. The regular meetings of the board shall be held on every alternate Friday, commencing at Three o'clock p.m., or as soon after as a legal quorum is present; but in the event of no quorum being present before the expiration of one hour from the appointed time for meeting, the clerk shall make a note thereof in the minute-book, stating the names of the members (if any) present, and such meeting shall stand adjourned, in accordance with clause 133 of the Local Government Act.

3. Special meetings may be summoned by the clerk, upon his receiving a written requisition signed by any three members of the board, and stating the matter to be brought before such meeting; and the clerk shall give each member of the board notice thereof, in writing, four (4) clear days before such meeting.

4. Confirmation of minutes.—The first business of each ordinary meeting of the board shall be the reading and confirmation of the minutes of the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall take place thereon except as to their accuracy, and when confirmed shall be signed by the chairman for the time being.

5. Order of business.—After the confirmation of the minutes, the following shall be the order of business, unless altered by a special resolution of the board for any special purpose:—1st, reading copies of letters; 2nd, reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon; 3rd, reading petitions and memorials; 4th, reading reports, first of permanent committees and second of special committees; 5th, orders of the day arising out of former minutes, and any business the chairman may bring before the meeting; 6th, motions of which notice shall have been given; 7th, giving notice of motion.

6. Petitions.—Every petition addressed to the board shall be presented by one of the members thereof, who shall be responsible for its being in proper form and being respectfully worded.

7. Every notice of motion and amendments must be in writing and signed by the mover.

8. Motions.—No motion shall be proceeded with unless the member who gave notice thereof, or a member of the board duly authorised by him in writing, be present when called upon to proceed with the same.

9. Motions referred to committee.—The mover of any motion which may be referred to a committee, shall, for the occasion, be a member of such committee.

10. No person, not being a member, shall be allowed to address the board without the consent of a majority of the members present.

11. Points of order.—1. Every member, including the chairman, shall stand while addressing the board.

2. The presiding chairman's decision shall be final on all questions of order or practice, and he shall state the same without comment or argument.

3. No member shall digress from the subject under discussion, nor impute improper motives, and all personal reflections shall be considered highly disorderly.

4. Any member who shall use an expression capable of being applied offensively to any other member, shall, if required by the chairman, withdraw such expression, and make a satisfactory apology to the board.

5. The chairman may call to order any one out of order, and if the person deemed out of order refuse to sit down and be silent, the chairman shall order him by name to leave the room; and if he shall persist in his interruptions, the chairman shall, in his discretion, order his removal, and such person so offending shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, to be recovered before a justice of the peace, and, in default, a period of imprisonment not exceeding seven days.

12. Motions and amendments, how proposed.—Any member desirous of making a motion or amendment shall address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall be silent until the member calling to order shall

have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the member in possession of the chair shall be allowed to proceed.

13. Priority in speaking.—If two or more members shall rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which of them is entitled to priority.

14. Motions and amendments recorded.—Every motion and amendment shall be entered on the minutes, with the name of the mover and seconder, and on a division thereon the votes shall be recorded.

15. Amendments.—One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but if lost, another amendment may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote.

16. Speaking.—A member moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a member seconding a motion without remark shall not be held to have spoken. No member shall speak twice on the same question, except by way of explanation, or reply upon an original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of an amendment. After the mover's reply, the amendment or motion, as the case may be, shall be immediately put to the vote.

17. Voting.—All questions before the board shall be decided by open voting, or by close ballot if decided on at the time.

18. Documents.—Any member of the board may require the production of documents relating to the matter under discussion.

19. Protests.—Any member may enter his protest against any resolution of the board, and the protest shall be entered by the clerk in the minute-book, and the member or members so protesting shall sign the same.

20. Recording particular words.—Any member may require the clerk to take down the particulars of any words used by a member immediately on the same being used.

21. Superseding questions.—As questions may be superseded, 1st, by a motion "that the board do now adjourn;" 2nd, by the previous question, viz., "That this question be now put," being proposed and negatived.

22. Payments.—All payments over One pound shall be made by cheque, signed by the chairman and one other member of the board, and countersigned by the treasurer.

23. Officers.—The officers of the board may consist of a treasurer, clerk, surveyor, valuer, and collector, and the board shall, if they see fit, combine any of these offices, and the persons so appointed shall enter into a bond with the board for the faithful performance of the several duties appertaining to their offices; and the clerk or collector shall have power to sue in the name of the board, before any justice, for the recovery of rates or other moneys due to the board.

24. Any officer of the board who shall participate in any contract, or accept any fee or reward other than the salary or allowance made by the board, shall forfeit the sum of One hundred pounds sterling, in accordance with clause 153 of the Local Government Act.
