THE SHIRE OF KORONG.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act*, 1863, it is amongst other things enacted, that if at any time in any district, whether single or united, which shall contain an area of not less than one hundred square miles, the total amount actually paid in respect of the general rate then last made shall have amounted to One thousand pounds, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to proclaim, if it shall seem fit, such district, by such name as in and by such Order in Council may be assigned thereto, to be a shire within the meaning of the said Act, and such district shall thereupon be and be called such shire accordingly; and no district, after the proclamation thereof as such shire, save as herein provided with regard to the adjustment of boundaries to those of electoral districts, shall be united with any other shire or district, or with any borough or municipal district: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of June, 1862, a Road District was proclaimed under the designation of "The Kingower and Wedderburne Road District": And whereas by another Proclamation bearing date the twenty-seventh day of October, 1862, the boundaries of the said district were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas the area of the said district and the amount of the last general rate therein are not less than the area and amount in the said Act mentioned, and it seemed fit to make an Order in Council this day to proclaim the said district to be a shire accordingly: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the district heretofore proclaimed and called the Kingower and Wedderburne Road District to be a shire within the meaning of the said Act, by the name in and by such Order in Council assigned thereto, that is to say:—

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act*, 1862, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby diminish the common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

The temporary Farmers' Common for the use of selectors of land in the agricultural area of Naitte Yallock, described in a Proclamation bearing date the ninth day of May, 1864, shall be and the same is hereby diminished by withdrawing therefrom allotment 19 of section 1 in the agricultural area of Naitte Yallock, containing seventy-three acres two roods and seventeen perches, as shown on a plan deposited at the Office of Lands and Survey, Melbourne.

NOTICE TO APPLICANTS FOR LEASES OF AURIFEROUS LANDS.

THE attention of applicants for Mining Leases is directed to the Ninth and Eleventh clauses, Leases, of the Regulations under Act No. 148, relating to Leases of Auriferous Lands, and for other purposes, where it is notified that—

9. The parcel of land demised shall be, in ordinary leases, in the form of a parallelogram (except where the same shall be impracticable by reason of the adjoining land being occupied, or from insuperable impediments), and the maximum length thereof shall not, except as hereinafter provided for, exceed more than twice the maximum breadth, and shall be accurately described by metes and bounds.
11. The extent of the areas of leases shall be (except in special cases hereinafter provided for):—
 1. For ordinary leases an area not less than one acre nor more than thirty acres.
 2. For quartz leases an area the length of which shall not exceed six hundred yards, nor be less than one hundred yards along the line of the lode, and the width thereof shall not be more than two hundred yards nor less than fifty yards measured across the lode;

and they are hereby required to mark out such lands as near as may be in the form therein prescribed.

Much delay and no little inconvenience have occurred in consequence of lessees marking out areas in such a manner as to include lands which by law cannot be demised for mining purposes.
