## THE SHIRE OF BET-BET.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act*, 1863, it is amongst other things enacted, that if at any time in any district, whether single or united, which shall contain an area of not less than one hundred square miles, the total amount actually paid in respect of the general rate then last made shall have amounted to One thousand pounds, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to proclaim, if it shall seem fit, such district, by such name as in and by such Order in Council may be assigned thereto, to be a shire within the meaning of the said Act, and such district shall thereupon be and be called such shire accordingly; and no district, after the proclamation thereof as such shire, save as herein provided with regard to the adjustment of boundaries to those of electoral districts, shall be united with any other shire or district, or with any borough or municipal district: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the fourteenth day of January, 1861, a Road District was proclaimed under the designation of "The Bet-bet Road District": And whereas by another Proclamation bearing date the twenty-seventh day of October, 1862, the boundaries of the said district were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas the area of the said district and the amount of the last general rate therein are not less than the area and amount in the said Act mentioned, and it seemed fit to make an Order in Council this day to proclaim the said district to be a shire accordingly: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the district heretofore proclaimed and called the Bet-bet Road District to be a shire within the meaning of the said Act, by the name in and by such Order in Council assigned thereto, that is to say:-

## COMMON-TOLL ROAD.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight  
Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath,  
Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of  
Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS the Council of the Borough of East Collingwood and the District Board of the Boroondara Road District have complained to the Governor in Council that they ought, by reason of the traffic passing along the road hereinafter mentioned being common to their own districts with the district in which tolls are payable upon such road, to have a share of such tolls in the manner provided in the 254th clause of *The Local Government Act, 1863*: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the road hereinafter mentioned to be a Common-toll road, for the purposes and within the meaning of the provisions of the said Act relating to Common-toll roads, viz.:-

The road commencing at the junction of Johnston street with Hoddle street, and passing along the former eastwards over the Johnston street-bridge and through the Borough of Kew and the Boroondara Road District, shall be a Common-toll road of the Boroughs of East Collingwood and Kew and the Boroondara Road District.

## BAGSHOT AND GOORNONG FARMERS' COMMON.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight  
Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath,  
Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of  
Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act, 1862*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the eighteenth day of March, 1861, a Farmers' Common at Bagshot and Goornong therein described was amongst others proclaimed: And whereas it is expedient to amend the description of the said common: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the said Farmers' Common at Bagshot and Goornong, and do proclaim an amended description thereof in manner following, that is to say:-

Eleven thousand six hundred and sixty-two acres (more or less), county unnamed, situate within the parishes of Bagshot and Goornong, including the portions of land hereinafter enumerated—alotments 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 of section 8; 1 of section 10; 4 of section 11; 5 of section 9; 3, 5, and 6 of section 1; a reserve being allotment 1, section 2; a reserve on the north boundary of allotment 11, section 5; allotments 16 and 20, section 5; 2 and 4, section 7; and the portion of ground bounded on the east by a prolongation of the east side of section 7 and intersected on the south by a prolongation of the south boundary of section 13, on the west by section 13, and on the north by sections 6 and 7; the foregoing all being within the parish of Bagshot. Also, within the parish of Goornong, allotments 1 and 2, section 20; 1 and 2, section 19; 2 of section 15; 4 of section 16; 2, 6, 7, section 14; 1 and 2, section 13; a reserve at the east end of allotment 7 of section 14; a village reserve being section 1; a reserve being allotment 1, section 6; and a reserve at the north-west angle of allotment 2, section 3; a reserve at the south-west angle of allotment 2 of section 1; a reserve at the south-east angle of allotment 3, section 6; a reserve at the north-east angle of allotment 7, section 6; allotments 1 and 3, section 7; and two reserves at the north-west and south-west angles of the last-named allotment and section; a water reserve in section 10; the unappropriated land within the town reserve of Goornong; allotment 1 of section 5; allotment 3 of section 8; and the portion of ground bounded on the east by sections 19 and 20, on the south by part of section 14 and section 13, on the west by a prolongation of the west boundary of section 13 north to a point bearing west of the north-west angle of allotment 1, section 20; thence east to the said north-west angle of allotment 1, section 20; a reserve at the north-west angle of allotment 1, section 7; and a reserve at the south-west angle of allotment 4 of section 16.—(64 J.7923.)

## PETITION FOR A NEW BOROUGH.

CRAIGIE.

NOTICE is hereby given, in accordance with the provisions of *The Municipal Corporations Act, 1863*, section 11, that a petition has been presented to the Governor, signed by two hundred and twenty-three inhabitant householders resident in and near the townships of Majorca and McCallum's Creek, in the parish of Craigie, in the county of Talbot, praying His Excellency to constitute the district whereof the boundaries are hereinafter set forth a Borough, which they are desirous should be designated by the style and title of "The Borough of Craigie."

The boundaries of the proposed borough set forth are as follow:—Commencing at the south-west angle of the boundary of the borough of Carisbrook; thence west forty-seven chains; thence south crossing main road to Amherst, and proceeding along the east side of government road three miles twenty-eight chains, more or less, to the south-west angle of portion fifteen, section two, parish of Craigie; thence east crossing a government road two miles twenty-seven chains, more or less, to a government road; thence north on the west side of same road, proceeding along the east side of the township of Majorca, crossing the main road to Castlemaine, three miles twenty-eight chains, more or less, to a point on the south side of government road; thence west one mile sixty chains, crossing the Mount Greenock Creek, also main road to Carisbrook, and proceeding along the boundary of the borough of Carisbrook to the commencing point."
