## PORTS OF ENTRY AND CLEARANCE ON THE MURRAY.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council having been pleased to appoint the following places to be Ports of Entry and Clearance, under the 9th clause of *The Customs Act, 1857*, and to define the boundaries of such ports, as follows:—

*Cowana*.—From the boundary of South Australia, on the 141st parallel of longitude, to Chalker Creek.

*Narung*.—From the place last mentioned to a point opposite to the junction of the Wakool River with the River Murray.

*Swan Hill*.—From the place last mentioned to Gunbower Creek.

*Echuca*.—From the place last mentioned to the Broken Creek.

*Wahgunyah*.—From the place last mentioned to Indigo Creek.

*Belvoir*.—From the place last mentioned to the junction of the Mitta-mitta Creek with the River Murray:

Notice is hereby given that masters of all vessels arriving at any such ports must in all respects comply with the provisions of the Customs Laws. They should report their arrival to the Customs Officers stationed respectively at Cowana, Narung, Swan Hill, Echuca, Wahgunyah, and Belvoir, who are empowered to enter and clear all vessels trading with such places.

Goods intended for introduction into Victoria, *via* or across the River Murray, must be landed at one of the places named, and in the presence or with the approval of the officers of customs respectively stationed thereat.

**SECTIONS V. AND IX. OF THE TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO THE SHIRE OF COLAC.**

**PROCLAMATION.**

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intituled, *An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X., in the said Act, shall extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts, and places as the Lieutenant Governor may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them; and it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX.) shall extend to and be in operation throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: Now I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the Shire of Colac shall come under the operation of the sections of the said Act numbered V. and IX. respectively.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this nineteenth day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.

**SHIRE OF MALDON.**

**PETITION FOR EXTENSION OF BOUNDARIES.**

THE President and Councillors of the Shire of Maldon have presented a petition to the Governor praying for an extension of the boundaries of the shire, in accordance with the provisions of *The Local Government Act, 1863, § 18.*

The petitioners refer to a tracing annexed to their petition, showing the portion of the colony which they desire should be annexed to their shire, and urge that it contains main roads which require repair and maintenance; that it is wholly comprised within the electoral district of Maldon, and not included in any borough, road district, or shire; that it will be advantageous to the surrounding localities that such roads should be under the management of a local body, and that the Council of the Shire of Maldon is the only local body whose district joins the land proposed to be annexed.

They further state that the eastern boundary of the shire is not well defined, and that the officers of the council experience great difficulty in tracing it.

The petitioners therefore pray that "the eastern boundary of this shire may be extended to the electoral boundary on the north-east side until that line joins the Castlemaine borough boundary; thence westward and southward by the boundary of the said borough to its extreme southern boundary; thence westward to the present boundary of the shire."

At a meeting of the Council of the city of Melbourne, held in the Council Chamber in the Town Hall, Swanston street, in the said city, on the 29th day of August, 1864, at which were present:—The Right Worshipful the Mayor, Alderman John Thomas Smith, presiding; Aldermen, Richard Bades, Richard Evans Hill, John Harrison, and Michael Keeley; Councilors, William Bayles, John Donovan Brown, Edward Cohen, Joshua Cowell, John Edwards, John George Goldsmith, George Hughes, Charles James Weedow, George Kenny, Joseph Story, Samuel Thorp, James Jones, Thomas Wragge, and William Williams, being more than one-third of the members of the said council, it was resolved and ordered, that whereas by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, 14 Victoria No. 20, intitled, *An Act for regulating the formation, drainage, and repair of streets, courts, and alleys on private property within the city of Melbourne*, it is amongst other things enacted that where any street, court, or alley on private property, in the city of Melbourne, shall not be or shall not have been sufficiently paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewer, or otherwise completed or repaired to the satisfaction of the council of the said city, it shall be lawful for the said council at any time, and from time to time, by any order under the hand of the mayor or town clerk of the said city for the time being respectively, to order that any such street, court, or alley, or any part thereof, shall be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewer, or otherwise completed or repaired, in such manner and within such time as to the said council may appear expedient; and thereupon the owners of the tenements adjoining or abutting upon such street, court, or alley, on each side thereof, shall, in such manner and within such time as shall be expressed in such order, at their respective costs, charges, and expenses, remove all obstructions, and well and sufficiently pave, flag, macadamise, level, drain, and sewer, or otherwise complete or repair so much of the said street, court, or alley, to the centre thereof, as may be opposite to and co-extensive with their respective tenements, adjoining or abutting on such streets, courts, or alleys respectively.

## SCHEDULE B,

Referred to in this Order.

Manner in which the streets, courts, and alleys, enumerated in in schedule A, referred to in this Order, are ordered to be freed from obstruction, paved, kerbed, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewered.

The natural soil is to be reduced or made up, as the case may require, so that the longitudinal section of the whole street, court, or alley, shall in no part have an inclination of less than one (1) in eighty (80), and where practicable the entire length is to form one incline.

In laying on any stuff it is to be spread in layers of not more than one foot thick.

The transverse section of the street, court, or alley (where the water-channels are on the sides), is to show a roadway whose crown shall be one inch above the kerbs of the footways, and the fall from the crown to the water-channels shall not be less than one (1) in twenty-five (25).

Each street, court, or alley, shall have a bluestone pitched water-channel, either at each of its sides or in its centre, of sufficient capacity to meet the required drainage for the same, the width of said channel or channels in no instance to be less than two (2) feet.

The pitchers to be nine (9) inches wide, and from six (6) to nine (9) inches deep, and from nine (9) to fourteen (14) inches long, with upright sides set in sand, and well rammed down to such section as the city surveyor may direct.

The bottom of the channel is to be seven (7) inches below the kerbstones of footpaths.

On either side of the roadway there is to be, where practicable, a footpath not more than three (3) feet wide, and these are to be separated from the roadway by a neatly dressed bluestone kerb from two (2) to four (4) feet long, six (6) inches wide, and fifteen (15) inches deep.

The footways are to be covered with a coat of gravel three (3) inches thick, and the surface is to fall towards the channel at the rate of one (1) in ten (10).

The whole of the work must be done under the inspection, and subject to the approval, of the city surveyor, who is authorised to order any deviation from these general principles which the peculiarities of any case may require.
