## MINING OPERATIONS AUTHORISED ON EX-EMPTED LANDS AT BUNINYONG.

THE Governor in Council has authorised the holders of miners' rights to mine on the reserve in the town of Buninyong, bounded on the south by Somerville street, on the east by the extension of Inglis street, on the north by Herriott street, and on the west by Warreneep street, on the following conditions:—

1. The mining operations shall be conducted in such a manner as not to interfere with the purpose for which the reserve was made.

2. The workings shall be open at all reasonable hours to the inspection of any mining surveyor or other authorised officer.

3. The miners who shall mine as aforesaid upon or within this land shall stop their works when requested so to do by a mining surveyor, or other authorised officer, whenever it shall appear to such mining surveyor or officer that the works are not being carried out with due precaution against any contingent damage to the said reserve.

4. In case any person so mining shall in any way violate any of the above conditions, it shall not be lawful for him any longer to mine upon or within such lands.

**SUPPLYING COALS TO WAR VESSELS OF NORTH AMERICAN BELLIGERENTS.**

THE Governor has directed the publication of the annexed Despatch from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, and its enclosed Notice relating to the supplies of Coals to War Vessels of the North American Belligerents therein specified:—

Downing street, 15th November, 1864.

SIR,—I transmit to you herewith a copy of a letter from the Treasury (13th October, 1864), with a copy of a printed notice (8th October, 1864), which, at the request of the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, their Lordships have caused to be issued by the Commissioner of Customs, in regard to the supply of coals to war vessels of the belligerents.

The statute 18 & 19 Victoria, cap. 96, referred to in the notice, applies only to the United Kingdom, and not to the colonies; but you will put into operation such laws bearing upon this subject as may be in force within the colony under your government.

Earl Russell's letter of the 31st January, 1862, referred to in the enclosed notice, was communicated to you in the circular despatch from this department of the 1st of February, 1862.

NOTICE.

Custom House, London, 8th October, 1864.

The Commissioners of Her Majesty's Customs having received information that a cargo of coal had been shipped on board a vessel at a British port without due clearance by the proper officers of customs at the port of shipment, and that such coals had been laden at sea on board a ship of war of the United States of America, with which certain states styled the Confederate States of America are now at war:

The said Commissioners hereby give notice that by the 144th section of *The Customs Consolidation Act*, 1853, it is enacted that if any goods shall be shipped, put off, or water-borne to be shipped, without being duly cleared, or otherwise contrary to the provisions of that Act, the same shall be liable to forfeiture; and by section 11 of 18 and 19 Victoria, chapter 96, if any ship having cargo on board depart from any port without being duly cleared, the master shall forfeit the sum of One hundred pounds.

And the said Commissioners hereby further give notice that in all similar cases of shipment for either of the belligerent powers in violation of the regulations contained in Earl Russell's letter of 31st January, 1862, the law above quoted will be strictly enforced.

In accordance with the instructions conveyed in the foregoing despatch of 15th November, 1864, it is hereby notified that the law relating to the illegal shipment of cargo, or illegal departure of vessels, will be strictly enforced. The following clauses of *The Customs Act*, 1857, in force in Victoria, applicable to this case, are published for general information:—

116. *Time of clearance.*—The collector shall not be compelled or compellable to grant a clearance outwards of any ship unless all the documents or papers of such ship, duly completed and certified where necessary, shall have been deposited at the Custom House of the port at or before the hour of One o'clock in the afternoon on the day of clearance; but nothing herein contained shall prevent the collector from granting, if he shall think fit, such clearance on any day, although such documents or papers shall not have been deposited before the hour aforesaid; and if any ship shall depart without such clearance, the master thereof shall forfeit any sum not exceeding One hundred pounds nor less than Twenty pounds.

117. *Forfeiture of goods on non-shipment or illegal shipment.*—If any goods liable to duty on importation or taken from the warehouse to be exported, or entitled to drawback on exportation, which are enumerated in the content of any ship, shall not be duly shipped before the departure of such ship, or shall not be duly certified by the proper officer as short-shipped, such goods shall be forfeited; or if any such goods shall be taken on board such ship not being enumerated in such content, the master of the ship shall forfeit the sum of Five pounds in respect of every package of such goods; and if any goods duly shipped on board such ship shall be landed at any other place than that for which they shall have been cleared, unless otherwise accounted for to the satisfaction of the commissioner, the master of such ship shall forfeit a sum equal to treble the value of the goods so landed; and if any goods shall be shipped or water-borne to be shipped without being duly cleared or otherwise contrary to this Act, the same shall be forfeited.
