#### AMENDING LAND ACT 1865.

Section 27.

#### PROCLAMATION.

His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Amending Land Act 1865 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or reproclaimed, and may from time to time reproclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of The Land Act 1862 and the now recting Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the

Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the common bereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is
