AMENDING LAND ACT 1865.

Section 27.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the

Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

CATHCART FARMERS' COMMON, described in a Proclamation bearing date 18th March, 1861, is hereby increased by the addition thereto of the following area, viz.:—One thousand six hundred acres, more or less, being the unsold and unappropriated land within the boundaries herein defined: Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 10 of section 1, parish of Burrumbeep; bounded thence by a road bearing west to the north-west angle of allotment 7; thence by a line bearing west to the Dividing Range; thence by the Dividing Range bearing northerly to the south-west angle of the Ararat United Borough and Gold Field Common; thence by the south boundary of that common, being a line, and the north boundaries of sections 1 and 2, parish of Burrumbeep, bearing east to the Ararat and Port Fairy main road; thence by that road bearing south-westerly to the south-east angle of allotment 19, section 4; thence by a road bearing west to the south-west angle of allotment 12, section 3; and thence by a road bearing north to the point of commencement.—(65.L.3414).
