CLOSE SEASON FOR NATIVE GAME.

PUBLIC attention is hereby drawn to the provisions of Part III. of *The Fisheries and Game Statute 1864* (Act No. 206), relative to the Close Season for "Native Game," which has now commenced.

The interval comprised in the close season extends from the 1st of August to the 20th of December in each year.

During this period, any person wilfully killing or destroying, or taking by any means "native game," or selling, or knowingly having in his possession, house, or control, any "native game," is liable to the penalties prescribed in the 31st and 32nd sections of the Act; and any person found offending against the provisions of the Act relative to game, who shall not give his name and address, and deliver up any game or instrument used to kill or destroy it to any person or constable demanding the same, may be arrested by such last-mentioned person or constable, and dealt with as provided in the 35th section of the Act.

Aboriginal natives of Australia, and within certain limitations owners of "native game," are privileged.

"Native game" includes—

- Wild Ducks of any species
- Teal
- Bittern
- Emu
- Native Companions
- Wild Turkey or Bustard
- Black Swans
- Wild Geese
- Bronzed-winged and other Wild Pigeons
- Mallee Hen
- All species of Quail.

AMENDING LAND ACT 1865.

Section 27.

NOTICE TO PASTORAL TENANTS AND HOLDERS OF LEASES OR LICENSES TO OCCUPY SITES FOR INNS, STORES, FACTORIES, MILLS, ABATTOIRS, LIME-KILNS, BRICK-KILNS, FERRIES, OR OTHER PURPOSES.

THE attention of pastoral tenants who may desire to avail themselves of the provisions of the 27th section of *The Amending Land Act 1865*, and of holders of leases or licenses for the occupation of land for any of the purposes contemplated by the before-mentioned section of the said Act, is hereby directed to the requirements of that section, in pursuance of which all applications to exercise the exclusive right of purchase thereunder must be transmitted to the Board of Land and Works on or before the 23rd day of September, 1865, in order that such applications may be legally made within the period of six (6) months next after the passing of the said Act.

TRANSMISSION OF PACKETS BY POST.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the seventh day of August, 1865.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-eighth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, *The Post Office Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time direct what packets may be sent by post as town, country, and foreign packets, and upon what terms and conditions the same may be sent: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that the following may be sent by post as town, country, and foreign packets within the meaning of the aforesaid Act, upon the terms and conditions hereinafter mentioned:—

1. A packet may contain any number of separate books or other publications (including printed or lithographed letters), photographs (when not on glass or in cases containing glass), prints or maps, and any quantity of paper, parchment or vellum, or patterns or samples of merchandise; and the books or other publications, prints, maps, &c., may be either printed, written, engraved, lithographed, or plain, or any mixture of these; but no printed matter or prints will be allowed except such as may be printed on paper, parchment, or vellum. Further, all legitimate binding, mounting, or covering of a book, &c., or of a portion thereof, will be allowed, whether such binding, &c., be loose or attached; as also rollers, in the case of prints or maps, markers (whether of paper or otherwise), in the case of books, and, in short, whatever is necessary for the safe transmission of such articles or usually appertains thereto. The patterns or samples must not have a value of their own apart from their mere use as patterns or samples.

2. Every packet must be sent either without a cover or in a cover open at the ends or sides, so as to admit of the enclosures being removed for examination. For the greater security of its contents, the packet may be tied at the ends with string; but in such case the postmaster, or other officer, is authorised to cut the string, although if he do so he must again tie up the packet. Samples of seeds, drugs, and so forth, which cannot be sent in open covers, may be enclosed in bags of linen, or other material, tied round the neck, so as to be easily loosened and refastened, or (as town and country packets only) in closed transparent bags; but foreign packets must not be sent in closed bags, although transparent.

3. No packet may contain anything which is sealed or otherwise closed against inspection, nor any matter or thing not hereinbefore mentioned; nor must there be any letter, nor any communication of the nature of a letter, whether separate or otherwise, unless the whole of such letter or communication be printed. Entries, however, merely stating who sends the book, or to whom it is given, are not to be regarded as a letter. Packets containing patterns must not bear any writing other than the name and address of the person for whom they are intended, the name and address of the sender, a manufacturer's or trade mark, numbers, and the prices of the articles.

4. Packets containing seeds not sent as samples may be forwarded as town or country packets only; such packets must not, however, exceed eight ounces in weight, and must be enclosed either in bags or papers tied so as to be easily loosened and refastened, or in closed transparent bags.

5. No packet must exceed two feet in length, or one foot in width or depth, and if any such packet be presented at a post office it shall not be received.

6. No article likely to injure the contents of the mail bags or the person of any officer will be forwarded as a packet.

Any packet closed against inspection that may be posted bearing postage stamps equal in value to the proper postage chargeable on a town, country, or foreign letter not exceeding one half-ounce in weight, as provided by the Act aforesaid, shall be forwarded to its address, and be charged additional postage on delivery according to the weight, as in the case of letters exceeding one half-ounce in weight and posted with only one single rate of postage thereon.

And the Honorable James McCulloch, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

To carry out the instructions of the President, prohibiting travellers from entering the United States from foreign countries by sea without Passports, and the instructions of the State and War Departments to the same end: Masters and Owners of Steamers and Passenger Vessels are notified that no vessels will be allowed to discharge hereafter, bringing passengers without Passports duly *viséd*. This does not apply to ordinary emigrants.

The Masters of such Steamers and Passenger Vessels must themselves see that all their passengers embarking at a foreign port for this country, are furnished with Passports duly *viséd*, on penalty of detention, both of passengers and cargo, on arrival.

At the Court at Windsor, the 18th day of May, 1865.

PRESENT:

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Foreign Deserters Act 1852, it is provided that whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities are or will be given for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships, in the territories of any foreign power, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, stating that such facilities are or will be given, declare that seamen, not being slaves, who desert from merchant ships belonging to a subject of such power when within Her Majesty's dominions, shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships, and may limit the operation of such Order, and may render the operation thereof subject to such conditions and qualifications (if any) as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty, that due facilities will be given for recovering and apprehending seamen, not being Turkish subjects, who desert from British merchant ships in the territories of the Sublime Porte:

Now therefore Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said Foreign Deserters Act 1852, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that from and after the publication hereof in the *London Gazette*, seamen not being slaves, and not being British subjects, who desert from merchant ships belonging to subjects of the Sublime Porte within Her Majesty's dominions, shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships; provided always, that if any such deserter has committed any crime in Her Majesty's dominions, he may be detained until he has been tried by a competent court, and until his sentence (if any) has been fully carried into effect.

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, the Secretary of State for the Colonies, and the Secretary of State for India in Council, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
