THE GENERAL SESSIONS FOR STAWELL.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Justices of the Peace Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted, that Courts of General Sessions of the peace shall be holden in and for such places or districts within Victoria as the Governor in Council appoints; and the Governor in Council may from time to time define and appoint the limits and boundaries of the places or districts within which all such courts shall have jurisdiction respectively, and the places and times at which such courts shall be holden: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare and appoint that a Court of General Sessions of the peace shall be established and holden at the place and in and for the district hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

No. 110.—AUGUST 25, 1865.—1.

A Court of General Sessions of the peace shall be holden at Stawell, and shall have jurisdiction in and for the district of Stawell, the boundaries whereof shall be as follow, viz.:—Commencing at the source of the Haifer Station Creek in the range dividing the waters of the Wimmera and Avoca Rivers; thence by a line south-westerly to the head of the Pleasant Creek; thence by a line westerly through Hall's Gap to the River Glenelg; thence by that river and a line north to Norton Creek; thence by Norton Creek and the River Wimmera to the south shore of Lake Hindmarsh; thence by a straight line easterly to a point on the west shore of Lake Buloke; thence northerly, easterly, and southerly by the shores of Lake Buloke to the mouth of the Avon River; by the last-named river southerly to its junction with Richardson Creek; and by the last-named creek south-easterly to the south-west angle of the township of Navarre; by the south boundary of that township to its south-east angle; thence by a line easterly and southerly by the aforesaid dividing range to the starting point.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-first day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, and in the twenty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign.

REGULATIONS FOR CLAIMANTS OF PROCEEDS OF SALE OF IMPOUNDED CATTLE.

THE Governor in Council, on the 14th day of August, 1865, approved of the subjoined Regulations under the 22nd section of *The Pounds Statute* 1865 (28 Vict. No. 249), to be observed from and after the date aforesaid by persons claiming proceeds of sale of Impounded Cattle, viz.:-

1. The claimant must obtain a true and certified extract from the pound book, giving the full description, brands, and dates of sale of the cattle on account of which he claims; and the extract must be signed by the poundkeeper.

2. A declaration of ownership of the cattle at the time when sold out of pound must be made before a magistrate or justice of the peace, and by virtue and under the provisions of the Act 27 Vict. No. 197. Vide Form Y.

3. The printed form of claim marked (X.) must be used, and must be accompanied by the original or a certified copy of the receipt for the cattle, or, if no such receipt can be produced, the particulars of ownership must be embodied in the declaration mentioned in clause 2. A certificate of character of the claimant, signed by two respectable householders, as directed below and marked (Z.), must also be forwarded.

4. No claim can be allowed unless in accordance with these Regulations, and presented to the Treasurer within a period of six years from the time the proceeds of the sale of the cattle were paid into the Treasury.

5. Copies of printed forms, as below, marked (X.) (Y.) (Z.) respectively, can be obtained at the Treasury, or of any of the poundkeepers.
