THE SUBDIVISIONS OF THE OXLEY ROAD DISTRICT.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourth day of September, 1865.

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act 1863 it is amongst other things enacted that at any time after the first annual election or general election, as the case may be, or first appointment of members of the district board, for any original or proclaimed district thereinafter sometimes called "single district," the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, and if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said district, shall within three months after the receipt of the same divide the district into two, or, if the Governor in Council shall see fit, into three separate electoral subdivisions, thereinafter called subdivisions, by such names as shall by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council be boundaries of the subdivisions shall be set forth; provided that no such division shall be made within three months before any day appointed for holding any election of members of the district board in or for such district. And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the thirteenth day of November, 1802, a road district was proclaimed under the designation of "The Oxley Road District." East Subdivision—Commencing on Hurdle Creek at its intersection with a road running south from the eastern boundary of section 10, parish of Oxley; thence north by that road, forming the said eastern boundary, to the road from the Buffalo to Wangaratta, and by the last-named road north-westerly to its intersection with Tea-Garden Creek, north of section 10, parish of Oxley; thence northerly to the Ovens River, at a point south of the road between sections 19 and 14, parish of West Tarrawingee; thence by the Ovens River to its junction with the Buffalo River; thence by the Buffalo River to its source; thence by a straight line to the source of the eastern branch of the King River, to neet a line due south from the source of Hurdle Creek; thence by the last-named line and creek to the commencing point.

MIDDLE SUBDIVISION—Commencing at the source of the eastern branch of the King River; thence by a straight line to Futter's Range, next the source of the Fifteen-mile Creek, as far as the western branch of the King River; thence by that branch and river to the Ovens River, and by the Ovens River to a point south of the road between sections 19 and 14, parish of No. 121.—September 12, 1865.—1.

West Tarrawingee; thence by a straight line southerly to the intersection of Tea-Garden Creek and the road from Wangaratta to the Buffalo, north of section 10, parish of Oxley; thence by the last-named road south-easterly to a road forming the eastern boundary of said section 10, and south by the last-named road to Hurdle Creek; thence by Hurdle Creek to its source; and thence due south to meet a straight line from the source of the Buffalo River to the source of the eastern branch of the King River; and by the last-named straight line to the commencing point; excepting the borough of Wangaratta.

West Subdivision—Commencing on Futter's Range next the source of the Pifteen-mile Creek; thence by Futter's Range, eastward of Glenrowen township, to the Sydney road; thence due east to the Fifteen-mile Creek; thence by that creek to the Ovens River; thence by the Ovens and King Rivers to the intersection of the western branch of the King River with a straight line from the eastern source of the King River to the commencing point; thence by that line to that point; excepting the borough of Wangaratta.

And the Honorable James Forrester Sullivan shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

### DISTRICT FOR BEER LICENSES.

#### PROCLAMATION. .

By His Excellency Sir Charles Henry Darling, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c.

HEREAS by The Wines, Beer, and Spirit Sale Statute 1864, it is amongst other things enacted that a beer license shall authorise the license to sell and dispose of, not earlier than Six o'clock in the norning nor later than Eight o'clock in the evening, any ale or beer to be drunk in the house or on the premises described in such license, except in the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or in any borough, and if the promises described in such license, except in the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or in any borough, and if the promises described in such license busbequently to the granting of such license brought within any borough, such license shall expire at the end of the then current year; provided that upon the application by the council of any borough a district wherein beer licenses may be granted, and may on a like application revoke any such proclamation: And whereas the council of the borough of Ararat has made application that the whole of the said borough may be declared a district under the provise of the Act above recited: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare the whole of the borough of Ararat to be a district wherein Beer Licenses may be granted.

#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Amending Land Act 1805 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or reproclaimed, and may from time to time reproclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of The Land Act 1862 and the now recting Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, that is to say:—

BIREGURIA TOWN COMMON, described in a Proclamation bearing date 24th July, 1865, is hereby increased by the addition thereto of allotment 6, parish of Yeo, containing one hundred and one acres two roods, and described as follows: Commencing at the north-east angle of the allotment, being a point on the Barwon River; bounded thence by allotment 5, bearing west forty-nine chains twenty-five links; thence by a road bearing S. 32° W. twenty-three chains fity-eight links; thence by allotment 7, bearing east fifty-six claims to the beforementioned river; and thence by that river bearing northerly to the point of commencement.—(65.L9124.)

ONDIT AND CUNDARE FARMERS' COMMON, described in a Proclamation bearing date 1st September, 1862, is hereby increased by adding thereto eighty-three acres, more or less, being portion 95a, parish of Ondit, county of Grenville.—(65.K.9075.)
