THE SUBDIVISIONS OF THE OXLEY ROAD DISTRICT.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourth day of September, 1865.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1863* it is amongst other things enacted that at any time after the first annual election or general election, as the case may be, or first appointment of members of the district board, for any original or proclaimed district thereafter sometimes called "single district," the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, and if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said district, shall within three months after the receipt of the same divide the district into two, or, if the Governor in Council shall see fit, into three separate electoral subdivisions, thereafter called subdivisions, by such names as shall by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council the boundaries of the subdivisions shall be set forth; provided that no such division shall be made within three months before any day appointed for holding any election of members of the district board in or for such district: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the thirteenth day of November, 1862, a road district was proclaimed under the designation of "The Oxley Road District;" And whereas by another Proclamation bearing date the twenty-ninth day of February, 1864, the boundaries of the said district were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by not less than twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said road district, praying for the division of the same into three subdivisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order divide the Oxley Road District into three separate electoral subdivisions in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by the names hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, and doth hereby set forth the boundaries of the said several subdivisions in manner following, that is to say:—

EAST SUBDIVISION—Commencing on Hurdle Creek at its intersection with a road running south from the eastern boundary of section 10, parish of Oxley; thence north by that road, forming the said eastern boundary, to the road from the Buffalo to Wangaratta, and by the last-named road north-westerly to its intersection with Tea-Garden Creek, north of section 10, parish of Oxley; thence northerly to the Owens River, at a point south of the road between sections 19 and 14, parish of West Tarrawingee; thence by the Owens River to its junction with the Buffalo River; thence by the Buffalo River to its source; thence by a straight line to the source of the eastern branch of the King River, to meet a line due south from the source of Hurdle Creek; thence by the last-named line and creek to the commencing point.

MIDDLE SUBDIVISION—Commencing at the source of the eastern branch of the King River; thence by a straight line to Futter's Range, next the source of the Fifteen-mile Creek, as far as the western branch of the King River; thence by that branch and river to the Owens River, and by the Owens River to a point south of the road between sections 19 and 14, parish of

West Tarrawingee; thence by a straight line southerly to the intersection of Tea-Garden Creek and the road from Wangaratta to the Buffalo, north of section 10, parish of Oxley; thence by the last-named road south-easterly to a road forming the eastern boundary of said section 10, and south by the last-named road to Hurdle Creek; thence by Hurdle Creek to its source; and thence due south to meet a straight line from the source of the Buffalo River to the source of the eastern branch of the King River; and by the last-named straight line to the commencing point; excepting the borough of Wangaratta.

WEST SUBDIVISION—Commencing on Futter's Range next the source of the Fifteen-mile Creek; thence by Futter's Range, eastward of Glenrowen township, to the Sydney road; thence due east to the Fifteen-mile Creek; thence by that creek to the Owens River; thence by the Owens and King Rivers to the intersection of the western branch of the King River with a straight line from the eastern source of the King River to the commencing point; thence by that line to that point; excepting the borough of Wangaratta.

And the Honorable James Forrester Sullivan shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

DISTRICT FOR BEER LICENSES.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirit Sale Statute 1864*, it is amongst other things enacted that a beer license shall authorize the licensee to sell and dispose of, not earlier than six o'clock in the morning nor later than eight o'clock in the evening, any ale or beer to be drunk in the house or on the premises described in such license, except in the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or in any borough, and if the premises described in such license be subsequently to the granting of such license brought within any borough, such license shall expire at the end of the then current year; provided that upon the application by the council of any borough the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare the whole or any part of such borough a district wherein beer licenses may be granted, and may on a like application revoke any such proclamation: And whereas the council of the borough of Ararat has made application that the whole of the said borough may be declared a district under the proviso of the Act above recited: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare the whole of the borough of Ararat to be a district wherein Beer Licenses may be granted.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight
Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath,
Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of
Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, that is to say:—

BIRREGURRA TOWN COMMON, described in a Proclamation bearing date 24th July, 1865, is hereby increased by the addition thereto of allotment 6, parish of Yeo, containing one hundred and one acres two roods, and described as follows: Commencing at the north-east angle of the allotment, being a point on the Barwon River; bounded thence by allotment 5, bearing west forty-nine chains twenty-five links; thence by a road bearing S. 32° W. twenty-three chains fifty-eight links; thence by allotment 7, bearing east fifty-six chains to the beforementioned river; and thence by that river bearing northerly to the point of commencement.—(63.L.9124.)

ONDIT AND CUNDARE FARMERS' COMMON, described in a Proclamation bearing date 1st September, 1862, is hereby increased by adding thereto eighty-three acres, more or less, being portion 95a, parish of Ondit, county of Grenville.—(65.K.9075.)

SHIRE OF METCALFE. PROPOSED SUBDIVISION.

A PETITION has been presented to the Governor, bearing the signatures of twenty-one ratepayers in the Shire of Metcalfe, wherein His Excellency is moved to divide the shire into three subdivisions corresponding with those shown on a plan which accompanied the petition.

The petitioners state that the large extent of the shire necessitates such subdivision, in order to provide for a suitable and sufficient representation, six members being found insufficient, and that the proposed subdivisions are fair and equitable.
