THE GENERAL SESSIONS DISTRICTS OF THE GRANGE, KILMORE, AND SANDHURST ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Justices of the Peace Statute 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that Courts of General Sessions of the Peace shall be holden in and for such places or districts within Victoria as the Governor in Council appoints; and the Governor in Council may from time to time define and appoint the limits and boundaries of the places or districts within which all such courts shall have jurisdiction respectively, and the places and times at which such courts shall be

holden: And whereas by three several Proclamations under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date respectively the second day of April, 1854, the twelfth day of May, 1862, and the first day of February, 1864, the districts within which the Courts of General Sessions for the Grange, Sandhurst, and Kilmore respectively have jurisdiction were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas it is expedient again to alter the said districts: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said several Proclamations as defines the boundaries of the districts within which the said Courts of General Sessions for the Grange, Sandhurst, and Kilmore have jurisdiction, and with the advice aforesaid I do hereby define and appoint the limits and boundaries of the places or districts within which the said several courts shall have jurisdiction as hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

The Court of General Sessions of the Peace for the district of the Grange, appointed to be holden at Hamilton, shall have jurisdiction within the district hereinafter defined, viz.:—Commencing at the southern extremity of Lake Hindmarsh, at the mouth of the Wimmera River; thence by that river southerly to the junction of Norton Creek therewith; thence by that creek southerly to its source; thence by a line south to the Glenelg River; thence by that river south-easterly to its source in the Serra Range; thence by that range southerly to Mount Abrupt; thence (including the township of Dunkeld) by a line and the east boundaries of the parishes of Kay and Yalimba to the south-east angle of portions 13 of the last-named parish; thence by the south boundaries of the parishes of Yalimba, Boram-boram, and Yatchau East to the Eumeralla River; thence by a line south-westerly to Mount Napier; thence by a line north-westerly to the confluence of the Wannon and Korote Rivers; thence by the Wannon River to its junction with the Glenelg River; thence by that river northerly to the junction of Power's Creek therewith; thence by that creek northerly to the north boundary of the county of Follett; thence by the said boundary of that county westerly to the South Australian boundary; thence by that boundary north to a point bearing west from the point of commencement; and thence to that point by a line bearing east.

The Court of General Sessions of the Peace appointed to be holden at Kilmore shall have jurisdiction within the district hereinafter defined, viz.:—Commencing at the confluence of the Murray and Goulburn Rivers; thence by the Goulburn River southerly to the north-east angle of Banks and Boyd's pre-emptive section; thence by a line bearing west three miles, more or less; thence by a line bearing south to a point on the Sugar Loaf Creek about one mile west from the junction of Sunday Creek therewith; thence by the Sugar Loaf, Mollison's, and Williams' Creeks to the Great Dividing Range; thence by that range south-easterly and north-easterly to the source of the Rubicon River; thence by that river to its junction with the Goulburn River; thence by a line north-westerly to Mount Pleasant; thence by a line north-easterly to the source of Frenchman's Creek in the Puzzle Range; thence by that range north-westerly to a point thereon bearing south from the south-west angle of the township of Merton; thence by a line north to the Barranhet Range; thence by that range north-easterly and south easterly to the source of Sandy Creek; thence by that creek north-easterly to its junction with the Broken River; thence by that river, excluding the township of Benalla, to the Broken Creek; thence by that creek to the junction of Back Creek therewith; thence by a line north to the Murray River; and thence by that river westerly to the point of commencement.

The Court of General Sessions of the Peace appointed to be holden at Sandhurst shall have jurisdiction within the district hereinafter defined, viz.:—Commencing at the north-east angle of the township of Castle Donnington, being a point on the River Murray; thence by the north, west, and south boundaries

of that township, bearing west, south, and east to an ana-branch of the said river; thence by that branch easterly to the junction of the Loddon River therewith; thence by that river southerly to the north boundary of the township of Kerang; thence by part of the north, the west, and part of the south boundaries of that township, bearing west, south, and east to the Loddon River aforesaid; thence by that river southerly to the north boundary of the township of Newbridge; thence by part of the north, the east, and part of the south boundaries of that township, bearing east, south, and west to the Loddon River aforesaid; thence by that river southerly to the junction of Bel-bet Creek therewith; thence by a line bearing easterly to Mount Prospect on the Alexander Range; thence by that range southerly to the source of Myrtle Creek; thence by that creek northerly and easterly to its junction with the Coliban River; thence by that river north-easterly to its junction with the Campaspe River; thence by that river northerly to the north-west angle of the shire of McIvor; thence by the north boundary of that shire east to Mount Pleasant Creek; thence by that creek northerly to the south boundary of the township of Runnymede; thence by the said boundary of that township west to the Campaspe River aforesaid; thence by that river northerly to the north-east angle of allotment 4 of section 8, parish of Elmore; thence by the north boundary of the Campaspe road district west to the south-east angle of the East Loddon road district; thence by the east boundary of that district north to the Picanniny Creek; thence by that creek northerly to Mount Hope Creek; thence by that creek, the east side of Kow Swamp, the Nannilla and Yaluk Creeks, to the Murray River; and thence by that river north-westerly to the point of commencement.

THE GENERAL SESSIONS FOR ECHUCA AND HEATHCOTE.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Justices of the Peace Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted, that Courts of General Sessions of the peace shall be holden in and for such places or districts within Victoria as the Governor in Council appoints; and the Governor in Council may from time to time define and appoint the limits and boundaries of the places or districts within which all such courts shall have jurisdiction respectively, and the places and times at which such courts shall be holden. And whereas it is expedient that Courts of General Sessions should be holden at Echuca and Heathcote: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint Courts of General Sessions of the peace to be holden at Echuca and Heathcote respectively, within Victoria, and do hereby define and appoint the limits and boundaries of the places or districts within which such courts shall have jurisdiction, that is to say:-

The Court of General Sessions of the peace to be holden at Echuca shall have jurisdiction within the district hereinafter defined, viz.:—Commencing at the confluence of the Murray and Goulburn Rivers; thence by the Goulburn River southerly to a point thereon about one mile northerly from the junction of Sandy Creek therewith, the said point being the north-east angle of the shire of McIvor; thence by the north boundary of that shire west to Mount Pleasant Creek; thence by that creek northerly to the south boundary of the township of Runnymede; thence by the said boundary of that township west to the Campaspe River; thence by that river northerly to the north-east angle of allotment 4 of section 8, parish of Elmore; thence by the north boundary of the Campaspe road district west to the south-east angle of the East Loddon road district; thence by the east boundary of that district north to the Picanniny Creek; thence by that creek, Mount Hope Creek, the east side of the Kow Swamp, the Nannilla and Yaluk Creeks to the Murray River; and thence by that river south-easterly to the point of commencement.

The Court of General Sessions of the peace to be holden at Heathcote shall have jurisdiction within the district hereinafter defined, viz.:—Commencing at the north-east angle of the shire of McIvor, being a point on the Goulburn River about one mile north from the junction of Sandy Creek therewith; thence by the north boundary of the said shire, being a line bearing west to the Campaspe River; thence by that river southerly to the junction of the Coliban River therewith; thence by a line south-easterly to the eastern angle of the Tooborac pre-emptive section, being a point on the main road between Heathcote and Kilmore; thence by a line south-westerly to the confluence of Williams and Mollison's Creeks; thence by the last-named creek easterly to its junction with the Sugar Loaf Creek; thence by that creek northerly to a point thereon about one mile west from the junction of Sunday Creek therewith; thence by a line

north to a point bearing west from the north-west angle of Banks and Boyd's pre-emptive section; thence by a line and the north boundary of that section east to the Goulburn River; and thence by that river northerly to the point of commencement.

UNION UNDER "THE WEIGHTS AND MEASURES STATUTE 1864."

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, called *The Weights and Measures Statute 1864*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, at the request of and pursuant to any agreement made by the councils or boards of any two or more of any adjoining boroughs, shires, and road districts, may proclaim such boroughs, shires, and districts to be a "union" for the purposes of the said Act, and by such Proclamation fix the proportion in which the expenses devolving upon such union under the said Act shall be borne by the several bodies corporate of such boroughs, shires, or districts: And whereas the council of the shire of Kyneton, the council of the borough of Woodend, the council of the borough of Malmesbury, and the board of the Woodend, Newham, and Rochford road district, have requested that the said shire, boroughs, and road district may be proclaimed a "union," and that the expenses devolving upon such union under the said Act may be borne in the proportion of four-sevenths by the shire of Kyneton, one-seventh by the borough of Woodend, one-seventh by the borough of Malmesbury, and one-seventh by the road district of Woodend, Newham, and Rochford: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do proclaim the shire of Kyneton, the borough of Woodend, the borough of Malmesbury, and the road district of Woodend, Newham, and Rochford, to be a "union" for the purposes of the said Act, and do fix the proportion in which the expenses devolving upon such union under the said Act shall be borne by the council of the said shire of Kyneton, the council of the said borough of Woodend, the council of the said borough of Malmesbury, and the said board of the road district of Woodend, Newham, and Rochford:—Four-sevenths by the council of the shire of Kyneton, one-seventh by the council of the borough of Woodend, one-seventh by the council of the borough of Malmesbury, and one-seventh by the board of the road district of Woodend, Newham, and Rochford.

POLLING PLACES FOR CERTAIN ELECTORAL DISTRICTS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the eleventh day of September, 1865.

WHEREAS by *The Electoral Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council shall, as he shall see fit from time to time, appoint within and for each division of every province and district respectively one place and not more for taking the poll in such division at contested elections for the province or district, and every such appointment may revoke; provided that if the returning officer of the province or district and any police magistrate or superintendent of police acting in the locality shall by writing under their hands certify to the Governor that it is necessary so to do it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to appoint as aforesaid in and for such division one or more polling place or places, and the appointment of such place or places or any of them from time to time to revoke; provided also that no appointment of any polling place in or for any division of a province or district shall be revoked between the issue of any writ for election for the same and the return of such writ: And whereas the returning officers for the respective electoral districts and the police magistrate or superintendent of

police acting in the respective localities hereinafter mentioned have, by writing under their hands, certified to the Governor that it is necessary to appoint polling places for certain divisions of such districts, and it is expedient to revoke the appointment of one other polling place: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order appoint the polling places mentioned in the Schedule hereunto annexed, to be polling places for the divisions opposite to the names of which they are respectively placed; and with the advice aforesaid doth hereby revoke the appointment of Glenpatrick as a polling place for the Glenpatrick division of the district of Crowlands, that is to say:—

WHEREAS by The Public Health Statute 1865 (28 Vict. No. 264), it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Orders from time to time directing that the provisions thereafter contained for the prevention of epidemic, endemic, and contagious diseases be put in force in Victoria, or in such parts thereof or in such places therein as in such Orders respectively may be expressed; and may in like manner rescind such Orders; and whereas the Central Board of Health has reported the existence of scarlet fever of a malignant type at Pentridge: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that the provisions contained in the said Act for the prevention of epidemic, endemic, and contagious diseases be put in force at Pentridge, in the county of Bourke, with a view to removing a serious nuisance now existing there.

And the Honorable James McCulloch, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Dog Island Lighthouse is situated on the small island of that name in Poveaux Strait, off the entrance to the Bluff Harbor, in 46° 39' 35" south latitude, and 168° 26' east longitude, as measured on the Admiralty Chart.

The light which will be permanently exhibited on and after the first day of August, 1865, is a Holophotal Dioptric Revolving White Light of the first order, shewing a flash every half minute.

It is elevated 150 feet above the level of the sea, and will be visible in clear weather at a distance of 18 nautical miles.

Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and may be forwarded (if by post, prepaid) addressed to the Deputy Postmaster General, with the words "Tender for the Conveyance of Mails" endorsed on the cover, or placed in the Tender Box at the General Post Office.

Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender, and every tender will be taken to include the entire service as called for.

Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signatures and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit receipt for a sum equal to twenty per cent. of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. The notice of acceptance if delivered at the address named in the tender shall be deemed sufficient.

The money deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them on application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts, but not otherwise.

Persons tendering are requested to state the description of the vehicle they intend to use, and the number of horses by which it is to be drawn.

A separate tender must be sent in for each service, but notwithstanding this condition any offer will be entertained for the performance of any number of services for a lump sum. The number of the service or services tendered for must be plainly endorsed on the outside of the cover.

The tender of any person failing to comply with the foregoing conditions will not be entertained.
