NOTICE TO MARINERS.—PORT PHILLIP BAY.

Masters of vessels, pilots, and others navigating within Port
Phillip Bay, are hereby informed that the s.s. *City of Launceston*
lies sunk in the fairway between the Gellibrand's Point
lightship and the West Channel lightship, about eight and a
half miles N. by E. from the latter.

The ship lies with a slight list to starboard, in eleven fathoms
water, with her head to the westward, fore and main top-masts
about twenty feet above water.

A wreck buoy has been placed within half a cable's length of
the sunken vessel, with the following bearings: West Channel
lightship, S. by W.; Western hummock of Station Peak,
W. by N.

Until the sunken vessel is removed, a *red flag* by day, and a
bright white light by night, will be exhibited from the mast-
head of a vessel which will be moored close to the *City of*
Launceston.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to further amend the Laws relating to the Customs*; it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, from time to time to appoint the ports which shall be warehousing ports for the purposes of the said Act, and the other Acts with which the said Act is incorporated: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint the Port of Swan Hill, on the River Murray, to be a Free Warehousing Port.

SPECIAL TEMPORARY LICENSES FOR THE SALE OF LIQUORS IN THE SHIRE OF RIPON.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to the licensing of Public-houses and the Sale of Fermented and Spirituous Liquors*, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by proclamation, to declare any district or place in Victoria (not included in any municipality) a district or place within which may be granted by the petty sessions of such district or place special temporary licenses, for periods not less than one month, for the sale of liquors in such quantities and subject to such conditions (except the condition of the licensee being a spirit merchant), as specified in the 7th clause of the said Act, viz., that the licensee shall be authorised to sell and dispose of liquor in bottles containing not less than a pint, and in quantities not exceeding two gallons to be taken away in any one day by any one person, and not to be drunk in or near the house or premises in which such liquor is sold: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do, by this my Proclamation, declare the Shire of Ripon to be a district within which may be granted by the petty sessions of such district Special Temporary Licenses, for periods not less than one month, for the sale of liquors in the quantities and subject to the conditions hereinbefore specified.

CUSTOMS NOTICE.

DUTIABLE GOODS.—PORTS OF ECHUCA AND WAHGUNYAH.

It is hereby notified, for general information, that the Governor in Council, in accordance with the powers conferred upon His Excellency in Council by the 236th clause of *The Customs Act 1857*, 21 Vic. No. 13, has been pleased to approve of the following dutiable goods being imported into Victoria at the ports of Echuca or Wahgunyah, on the River Murray, in the packages and quantities hereinafter specified; and that the same may be entered and cleared thereat from the bonding warehouses for home consumption instead of in the packages and quantities at present allowed by the Regulations of the Customs Department, viz.:

Spirits in cask—in quantity as imported.
Spirits in bottle—in quantity of not less than six gallons.
Opium—in original packages.
Tobacco and cigars—if in original packages of not less than forty pounds weight.

And further, that any quantity of the following dutiable goods not less than that specified after each article, except any balance of such goods remaining in bond, may be entered and

cleared from the warehouses for home consumption at the said ports of Echuca and Wahgunyah, viz.:

Beer in casks—two hog-heads.
Beer in bottle—ninety-six gallons.
Coffee—three hundredweight.
Rice—twenty hundredweight.
Tea—one chest, or packages equal thereto.
Wine in bottle—ten gallons.
Wine in wood—as imported.

And that all other goods liable to duty in quantities of not less than the entire parcel originally warehoused, if the duty thereon shall not amount to One pound, and if the duty on such parcel or parcels amounts to or exceeds One pound, then in not less quantity than would be chargeable with duty amounting to One pound.

BYE-LAWS OF THE CASTLEMAINE BENEVOLENT ASYLUM.

OBJECTS.

TO relieve the aged, infirm, permanently disabled or destitute, of all creeds and nations, and to minister to their necessities, according to the means of the institution.

CONTRIBUTORS, BENEFACTORS, AND GENERAL SUBSCRIBERS.

2. Every benefactor of £10 and every annual contributor of £1 shall be eligible to be members of committee, and shall have the privilege of recommending persons for admission, and all existing life memberships shall continue valid.

3. Every executor paying to the institution a bequest of £50 or upwards, and every person (not being a paid collector) raising in any one year the sum of £50 or upwards, and every other person elected at an annual meeting at the recommendation of the outgoing committee in consideration of special services rendered to the institution, shall be entitled to the privileges of benefactors of £10.

4. Every benefactor of £10, and every contributor of £1 per annum shall be entitled to one vote, every benefactor of £20 and every contributor of £2 per annum shall be entitled to two

votes, and every benefactor of £30 and every contributor of £3 per annum and upwards shall be entitled to three votes at all general meetings of contributors.

5. The current year shall, with respect to each benefaction, be reckoned from the day of payment; and, with respect to each annual contribution, from the day on which such contribution was first paid.

6. No person shall hold any honorary office or have any privilege connected with the institution until his contribution shall have been actually paid.

7. It shall be competent for the general committee by vote, or any ten or more contributors by writing under their hands, to require the secretary to summon a general meeting of contributors any time or times between the annual meetings. The occasion of calling every meeting shall be specified in the requisition, and no other business shall be transacted thereat; and every such meeting shall, with an intelligible reference to its object, be called by the secretary, by advertisement in one or more of the local newspapers, at least one week before the day of meeting.

8. At all general meetings of contributors ten shall constitute a quorum, and as soon as a quorum is present the chair shall be taken, but if no quorum be present within half an hour of the time named, the meeting shall stand adjourned to the following week at the same day and hour, and so on from week to week until a quorum be formed.

9. All votes at the annual and other meetings of the contributors shall be taken by a show of hands, or by ballot if required.

10. If the validity of any election at the annual meeting, or at any meeting of the general committee for filling up any vacancy during the year, shall be disputed, the question in dispute shall be referred to the president.

GENERAL COMMITTEE.

11. The administration of the affairs of the asylum shall be entrusted to a committee, to be elected in accordance with the Act of Incorporation and bye-laws, and shall consist of fifteen members, including the president, two vice-presidents, and treasurer.

12. The president, vice-presidents, and treasurer shall hold office for one year only, and shall go out of office (but may nevertheless be re-elected) on the second Thursday in the month of January in every year, at which time their successors shall be appointed by the contributors; and each of the above-named offices shall become vacant in any of the ways in which the office of ordinary members of committee shall become vacant, and the vacancy filled in the same manner under the 12th section of the Act of Incorporation and the bye-laws.

13. If it shall happen that any member or members of committee whose retirement may require to be determined by lot, shall be absent from the meeting at which it shall be necessary to determine by lot who shall go out of office, then the chairman of the meeting, if need be, shall inscribe the name of him or them so absent on the paper, and shall do all things necessary to be done on behalf of the absentee for determining the issue of the said lot, and the retirement or otherwise of the absentee or absentees, and the decision then arrived at shall be as valid and effectual as if such party or parties were present.

14. The secretary shall keep a collected list for each year of the attendance and non-attendance at ordinary and adjourned meetings of the various members of the general committee, and a similar but distinct list in relation to special meetings; and in the event of any member of committee becoming disqualified, and his office becoming vacant, it shall be necessary before the remaining members shall declare the office vacant, and proceed to fill up the vacancy, that one month's notice of motion to that effect be given by some member of committee.

15. The general committee shall direct the general business of the asylum, frame rules for its internal regulation (the same not being repugnant to the bye-laws), alter, repeal, amend, and make new rules, enter into contracts for the supply of provisions and other articles for the use of the asylum, direct payment to be made for the same, fill up all vacancies in all honorary offices, as those of president, vice-presidents, treasurer, secretary, medical officers, auditors, and visiting committee, between the annual meetings in January, and appoint and discharge all servants and paid officers of the institution. They shall meet on the second Thursday of every month, and on such other days as they may appoint by way of adjournment. As soon as a quorum shall be present the chair shall be taken by the president, or in his absence by one of the vice-presidents, or in their absence by a chairman appointed by the members then present; but if no quorum shall be present within twenty minutes of the time named, such meeting, as well as every special meeting hereinafter authorised, shall stand adjourned to the following week at the same day and hour, and so on from week to week until the next monthly meeting. They shall superintend and give all necessary directions for the admission, discharge, and dismissal of inmates in accordance with the terms and spirit of the bye-laws.

16. No proposition to enact or amend a bye-law, or frame or vary any rule, shall be entertained unless one month's previous notice has been given of such; and no motion to rescind a resolution shall be submitted within three months after such resolution has been passed unless one month's notice of the same be given, and such motion be passed by an absolute majority of the whole general committee.

17. All ordinary meetings of committee shall be summoned by circulars from the secretary three days at least before the day of meeting. No person who has been absent for four consecutive ordinary meetings of committee, or otherwise disqualified, shall be summoned.

18. No person shall be a member of committee and a salaried officer of the asylum at the same time; nor shall any salaried officer be present at any committee meeting except when required.

19. The general committee by vote, or three members thereof by writing under their hand, shall be at liberty at any time to require the secretary to summon a special meeting of the general committee to be holden within two weeks from the delivery thereof. Seven days' notice at least of such meeting shall be given to each member by circular by the secretary, and the occasion for calling the meeting shall be stated both in the requisition and summons, and no other business than that so stated or clearly indicated shall be transacted at such meeting. But non-attendance at special meetings shall not in itself, or in conjunction with any other, induce a vacancy of office under the twelfth section of the Act of Incorporation.

20. The general committee shall present a general report of the affairs of the asylum at the annual meeting in January, which report shall be prepared by the treasurer and secretary, and be presented at a special meeting of committee for revision and approval at least one week before the day appointed by the committee for the annual meeting.

VISITING COMMITTEE.

21. A house visiting committee, consisting of six members, shall be elected by, from, and subject to the general committee, at their first monthly meeting annually, or as soon after as conveniently may be. It shall be their duty to visit the asylum at least once a week, to inspect the several wards, to provide employment for the inmates, and in conjunction with the superintendent ascertain if any of them are in a fit state for employment, to certify and send up monthly to the general committee all housekeeping accounts, in general to admit and discharge inmates, and where necessary dismiss from the asylum any who may be guilty of gross misconduct, but in all cases of dismissal or admission of inmates likely to be permanent they shall present a special report to the general committee for their final approval or disapproval.

TREASURER.

22. The duties of the treasurer shall be to receive all moneys from the collector, the Government, and any others; pay all accounts of the asylum passed by the general committee, and those above £1 by bank cheque, which cheques shall be signed by the president and secretary as well as by the treasurer; to keep proper accounts of receipts and disbursements in a book provided for the purpose, lay the book or a summary of the same before the general committee at every monthly meeting, and furnish a balance-sheet every year duly audited.

23. He shall deposit all moneys received by him, whenever the same shall amount to £5, in such bank as the general committee shall from time to time direct, and shall cause the different sums so deposited to be paid to the account of the Castlemaine Benevolent Asylum.

SECRETARY.

24. The duties of the secretary are to keep proper minutes of all meetings and attendances, and record them in a book provided for the purpose; to call all meetings, to introduce and explain the business to be transacted, and to conduct and record all such correspondence as may be directed by the general committee; and to prepare, in conjunction with the treasurer and medical officers, the report for the annual meeting.

The common seal of the corporation shall be kept in a strong box with two locks and keys (one of which keys shall be kept by the treasurer and the other by the secretary), and be deposited at the bank where the asylum account is kept.

The common seal shall not be affixed to any deed or other instrument except by order of the general committee at a meeting at which five members at least shall be present.

The office of the secretary shall become vacant in any of the ways in which the office of an ordinary member of committee may become vacant under the twelfth section of the Act of Incorporation.

COLLECTOR.

25. It shall be the collector's duty to canvass and obtain contributions for the asylum. He shall give a receipt for every sum he receives, and keep a counterpart of such receipt. He shall hand over to the treasurer in the first week of every month the moneys received during the preceding month, and at the same time supply the treasurer with a list of the contributors and the respective sums paid by them, and shall provide satisfactory security to the amount of £200.

AUDITORS.

26. The auditors shall, in the first week of January in every year, or as soon after as conveniently may be, examine the collector's books and also the treasurer's balance-sheets, with all accounts, vouchers, and documents relating thereto, and shall report thereon to the general committee at the meeting appointed by them.

MEDICAL OFFICERS.
