WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 265), called The Police Offences Statute 1865, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation in the Government Gazette extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I, of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such-Proclamation; and upon any such Proclamation; the provisions son proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in sich city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation extend the provisions contained in sections V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X. of Part I. of the said Statute to the

WHEREAS by The Wines, Beer, and Spirit Sale Statute 1864, it is amongst other things enacted that a beer license shall authorise the licensee to sell and dispose of, not earlier than Six o'clock in the morning nor later than Eight o'clock in the evening, any ale or beer to be drunk in the house or on the premises described in such license, except in the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or in any borough, and if the premises described in such license, except in the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or in any borough, and if the premises described in such license, except in the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or in any borough, such license shall expire at the end of the then current year; provided that upon the application by the council of any borough the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the Government Gasette declare the whole or any part of such borough a district wherein beer licenses may begranted, and may on a like application revoke any such proclamation. And whereas the council of the borough of Carisbrook has made application that the whole of the said borough may be declared a district under the provise of the Act above recited: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive-Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare, the whole of the borough of Carisbrook to be a district wherein Beer Licenses may be granted.
