PROCLAMATION.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir Charles Henry Darling, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHFREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the twenty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reice (No. 219), intituled, Anact to consolidate the Law relating to Gaols, it is amongst other things enacted that all buildings, erections, houses, enclosed places, and premises hereafter to be erected, built, enclosed, purchased, enlarged, or maintained at the public expense as and for public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments within Victoria; which are from time to time proclaimed by the Governor in Council, by notice in the Governmen Gazette, as such public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, or penal establishments, shall, from and after the publication of such notice, be severally deemed and taken to be the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments (thereinafter called "gaols"), respectively, of the place or district where the same are situated, and shall be subject to the several provisions made for the regulation, discipline, management, and care of the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments already erected (also thereinafter called "gaols"), and of the prisoners confined within the same; and it is also enacted that, except where it is otherwise proclaimed by the Governor in Council, every gaol shall be and be taken for all purposes as being equally a house of correction and a prison for debtors, and also every house of correction and the provisions of the said Act: Now therefore I. Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act, and of all other powers combiling me in this behulf, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim, declare, and notify that the buildings, erections, houses, enclosed places, and premises of correction, are such public

BEECHWORTH GAOL—Comprising all buildings, erections, houses, enclosed places, and premises on the following site, viz.—Five acres and thirty-six perches, county unnamed, parish of Beechworth, being portion of block 23, township of Beechworth: Commencing at the southernmost angle of block 23; bounded on the south-west by Williams street, bearing N. 50° 45° W. five chains; on the north-west by Ford street, bearing N. 12° 40° E. eight chains fifty-nine links; on the north-east by a line bearing S. 50° 45° E. eight chains seventy-one links; and on the south-east by High street, bearing S. 38° 13′ W. seven chains seventy links to the point of commencement.

Every petition or memorial addressed to the council shall be in proper form, and must be presented by a councillor who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded, and no debate shall take place thereon, except as to its being received and taken into consideration after the orders of the day or at any future meeting, or if necessary that it be referred to a committee.

4. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the council, and any business which the president shall think fit to bring under con-

5. Every notice of motion shall be given to the secretary in writing, and shall be read aloud at the meeting previous to that in which the same is to be taken into consideration, and every notice of motion shall be considered in the order in which it is

notice of motion shall be considered in the notice paper shall be considered unless the councillor who has given such notice, or some other councillor authorized by him, be present when the business is called on, and notices not so proceeded with shall be struck off the notice paper.

7. The mover of any motion which shall be referred to a committee, shall for the occasion be a member of such committee.

8. Every councillor shall stand up while addressing the president.

The president's ruling shall be final in all matters of order

or practice.

10. Every notion or amendment shall be entered on the minutes, with the names of the mover and seconder, and on a division thereon the votes shall be recorded, if required by any

division thereon the votes shall be recorded, if required by any conneillor.

11. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but if lost, one other may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote, but upon any amendment being carried, it shall be competent for any councillor to move one other amendment thereon.

12. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council, but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next ordinary meeting of the council.

13. No councillor shall speak more than once on the same question, except by way of explanation or reply on an original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of an amendment last proposed, and after the reply, the amendment or the original motion, as the case may be, shall be put to the vote.

14. Every councillor, when proposing a motion or amendment, or speaking on any matter, shall address the pre-ident, and shall not be interrupted except called to order, whereupon he shall sit down until the question of order shall have been decided; the councillor in possession of the chair may then resume the subject.

15. Any councillor who shall refuse to obey when ruled out of order, or shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, and who, if required by the president, shall refuse to withdraw such expression and make satisfactory apology, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds, to be recovered before any two or more justices of the peace.

16. Any councillor may, with the consent of the president, require the secretary to take down the particular words used by a councillor immediately upon the same being uttered.

17. Any councillor may record his protest against any resolution of the council, on giving notice of his intention so to do on the adoption of the resolution, and on such councillor entering his protest and his reasons for the same in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the council, and on his signing the same before the next meeting of the council. Provided always, that such protest may be expunged, if decided by a majority of the council, not to be in accordance with truth, or not to be in terms respectful to the council.

18. No election to any office at the disposal of the council shall take place until six clear days' notice shall have been given in some local newspaper, inviting applications for the same; or unless the salary or allowances attaching to such office shall have been fixed before proceeding to such election.

19. All contracts shall be made by tender, unless the council shall otherwise direct. All tenders shall be addressed to the president, and only opened at the time of their consideration by the council. The respective amounts, with the names of the parties tendering, shall, in every case, be entered on the minutes of the council. When any tender shall have been accepted by the council, the person tendering, or some one on his behalf, shall pay a deposit in accordance with a schedule hereto attached, into the hands of the treasurer, which amount shall be returned to the contractor, when he obtains a final certificate from the engineer that the works under such contract are satisfactorily completed.

20. All payments shall be made by cheque, and signed by the
