CLEARANCE OF BONDED GOODS FROM MELBOURNE TO PORTS ON THE MURRAY.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that in accordance with the powers conferred by the 236th clause of *The Customs Act 1857*, 21 Vict. No. 13, His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of bonded goods, in the packages and quantities hereinafter specified, being cleared from the port of Melbourne to the warehousing ports of Victoria or New South Wales, on the River Murray, viz.:

Spirits in cask—in quantity as imported.
Spirits in bottle—in quantity of not less than six gallons.
Opium—in original packages.
Tobacco and cigar—if in original packages of not less than 40 lbs. weight.
Beer in casks—two hogsheads.
Beer in bottle—ninety-six gallons.
Coffee—three hundredweight.
Rice—twenty hundredweight.
Sugar—seven hundredweight.
Tea—one chest, or package equal thereto.
Wine in bottle—ten gallons.
Wine in wood—as imported.

NOTICE TO OFFICERS IN THE CIVIL SERVICE, AND ELECTORAL REGISTRARS, AND OTHERS IN THE EMPLOYMENT OF THE GOVERNMENT.

THE subjoined Instruction and copy of a Resolution of the Legislative Assembly (originally published in 1859) are re-published for the information of all Officers in the Civil Service, and of Electoral Registrars, and others in the employment of the Government:—

"Such officers are hereby accordingly instructed to refrain from taking any part in Elections for Members of Parliament beyond the recording of such vote or votes as by law they may be entitled to; and they are also informed that dismissal from the Civil Service will be the penalty for disobedience to this Order."

WHEREAS by *The Electoral Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council shall, as he shall see fit from time to time, appoint within and for each division of every province and district respectively one place and not more for taking the poll in such division at contested elections for the province or district, and every such appointment may revoke; provided that if the returning officer of the province or district and any police magistrate or superintendent of police acting in the locality shall by writing under their hands certify to the Governor that it is necessary so to do it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to appoint as aforesaid in and for such division one or more polling place or places, and the appointment of such place or places or any of them from time to time to revoke; provided also that no appointment of any polling place in or for any division of a province or district shall be revoked between the issue of any writ for election for the same and the return of such writ: And whereas by an Order in Council made on the second day of September, 1864, Launching Place was appointed a polling place for the Brushy Creek division of the district of Evelyn, and it is expedient to abolish the same: And whereas by another Order made on the first day of May, in the present year, a polling place at Mia-mia was erroneously appointed for the Tylden division of the district of Dalhousie instead of for the Campaspe division thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby order as follows:—

The appointment of Launching Place to be a polling place for the Brushy Creek division of the electoral district of Evelyn is hereby revoked.

The appointment of Mia-mia to be a polling place for the Tylden division of the electoral district of Dalhousie is hereby revoked.

3. Fresh meat is to be supplied in such proportions as may be required, and, when the quantity admits, to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately. When shins of beef form a portion of the supply, a fair proportion of the bone, not less than five inches, must have been cut off.

4. The supplies coming under the head of rations and medical comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto, on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department, either for delivery at the Stores and Transport Office, or at the office of the department concerned, as may be stated in the order.

5. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account.

6. The order issued by the head of department must accompany the goods, and the account is to be rendered simultaneously with delivery of the supplies. In other cases the account is to be rendered monthly.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies, as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final; in respect to breads of first quality, a sample of the best bread ordinarily retailed to the public will be considered as a test loaf.

8. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured by the person requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 5.

In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the person to whom the rations are due, or to the contractor, in waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department, or officer in charge of the station, will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 5.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivery or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report of the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Government may direct; it will also be in the power of the Government to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. It will be competent for the Inspector of Stores on behalf of the Government, or the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months; it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of the month.
