## THE CIRCUIT COURTS OF VICTORIA DURING THE YEAR 1866.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the eleventh day of December, 1865.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the fifteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in the colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor of the said colony, by any Orders to be by him, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, from time to time made and proclaimed, to define the limits of districts within and the times at which circuit courts shall be holden in the said colony, and the said limits and times to alter and vary as he shall, with the advice aforesaid, deem necessary: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order appoint the times at which the several circuit courts of Victoria shall be holden during the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six to be as follow, that is to say:—

## COMMONS.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common respectively, as the case may be: And whereas by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that when any Crown land remains unsold within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land a farmers' common; when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under the *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for the use of such selectors and lessees; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim, increase, or abolish (as the case may be) the Commons hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, that is to say:—

BARNAWARTHA FARMERS' COMMON.—The Barnawartna Farmers' Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date

the 4th day of March, 1861, is hereby increased by adding there- to 4000 acres, more or less, being the unappropriated Crown lands within the following described boundaries, viz.:—Commencing on the north boundary of the township of Barnawartha at a point thereon where it is intersected by the main Sydney road; thence by the north-west side of that road bearing north-easterly to the south-east angle of allotment 9 of section 31, parish of North Barnawartha; thence by the east and northern boundaries of that allotment to the north-west angle thereof; thence by the east boundary of section 30, by the north boundary of that section and of section 29, bearing north and westerly to the north-west angle of the last-named section; thence by a line bearing north to the River Murray; thence by that river bearing westerly to the junction of Indigo Creek therewith; thence by that creek bearing south-easterly to the north boundary of the township of Barnawartha aforesaid; and thence by that boundary bearing east to the point of commencement. Excluding so much of the township of Haines as lies within boundaries above described.—(65.10934.)

**BELVOIR TOWN COMMON.**—The common described in a Proclamation bearing date the second day of September, 1861, under the designation of the Belvoir Town Common, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands within the town boundary of Belvoir.—(65.13891.)

**CRESWICK TOWN COMMON.**—The Creswick Town Common, described among others in a Proclamation bearing date the 23rd day of January, 1861, is hereby abolished.—(65.13893.)

**CRESWICK BOROUGH COMMON.**—The unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries hereinafter defined are hereby proclaimed a Common for the use of all householders of the borough of Creswick, viz.:—Commencing at the south-west angle of portion 108, parish of Springhill; bounded thence by the south boundaries of portions 108, 107, and 96, bearing east to the south-west angle of portion 95; thence by the west, north, and east boundaries of that portion to the south-east angle thereof; thence by the south boundaries of portions 84, 83, and 18 to the south-east angle of the last-named portion; thence by a road bearing south to a point thereon bearing east from the north-east angle of the borough of Creswick; thence by a line bearing west to the said angle of that borough; thence by the east, south, and west boundaries of that borough to the north-west angle thereof; and thence by a line bearing north to the point of commencement.—(65.13893.)

**NATTE YALLOCK TEMPORARY COMMON.**—The Common described in two several Proclamations, bearing date respectively the 9th day of May and the 29th day of August, 1864, as a Temporary Farmers' Common for the use of selectors of land in the agricultural area of Natte Yallock, is hereby abolished.—(65.12870.)

**SOUTH BARNAWARTHA FARMERS' COMMON.**—The South Barnawartha Farmers' Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 25th day of November, 1861, is hereby increased by adding thereto 4100 acres, more or less, being the unappropriated Crown lands within the following described boundaries, viz.:—Commencing on the Black Dog Creek, at a point thereon where it is intersected by the west boundary of the parish of North Wooragee; thence by that boundary and the west boundary of the parish of South Barnawartha, being a line bearing north one hundred and fifty-seven chains, more or less; thence by lines bearing east forty-six chains, more or less, and south eighty-four chains, more or less, to the south boundary of the parish of South Barnawartha; thence by that boundary bearing east to the east angle of allotment 4 of section O, parish of North Wooragee; thence by part of the southern boundary of that allotment bearing south-westerly twenty-two chains, more or less; thence by the western boundaries of allotments 1 and 2 of section M, bearing south-easterly to the south angle of the last-named allotment; thence by the south-eastern boundary of allotment G of section M to the south angle thereof; thence by a line bearing north-westerly to the east angle of allotment 4 of section C; thence by a road bearing south-westerly to the south angle of allotment 4 of section D1; thence by a road bearing north-westerly to the Black Dog Creek aforesaid; and thence by that creek bearing north-westerly to the point of commencement.—(65.9498.)

Twelve out of the fourteen deaths registered at Collingwood were of children under three years of age, the chief causes of death being scarlatina and diarrhoea. Out of the thirty-two deaths registered at South Melbourne nine were infant cases; and in North Melbourne thirteen out of twenty-three were deaths of children under three years, diarrhoea and scarlatina being the most fatal diseases. Dysentery and diarrhoea exist at Emerald Hill, and there, as in the districts generally, the mortality has been on the increase.

1. The hay to be oaten, good, sound, and sweet; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (colonial grown) and bran to be sound and sweet and of the best description.

2. The supplies are for police and telegraph horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximative, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed or additional horses be required to be stationed in any of the districts tendered for, the supplies required may be drawn from the contractor. The excess over the estimate will not, however, exceed during the whole year 50 per cent. of the estimated quarterly consumption.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

8. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct not exceeding £20, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. It will be competent for the Inspector of Stores on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving in writing a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice only can be given from the first day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th June, 1866; and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1863* it is amongst other things enacted that at any time after the first annual election or general election, as the case may be, or first appointment of members of the district board, for any original or proclaimed district, hereinafter sometimes called "single district," the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, and if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said district, shall within three months after the receipt of the same divide the district into two, or, if the Governor in Council shall see fit, into three separate electoral subdivisions, hereinafter called subdivisions, by such names as shall by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council the boundaries of the subdivisions shall be set forth; provided that no such division shall be made within three months before any day appointed for holding any election of members of the district board in or for such district: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-first day of July, 1864, a road district was proclaimed under the designation of "The Epping Road District." And whereas, by another Proclamation bearing date the eleventh day of April, 1864, the boundaries of the said district were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by not less than twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act

in respect of rateable property in the said road district, praying for the division of the same into three subdivisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order divide the Epping Road District into three separate electoral subdivisions in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by the names hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, and doth hereby set forth the boundaries of the said several subdivisions in manner following, that is to say:—

**NORTH SUBDIVISION.**—Commencing at a point on the Merri Creek at the north-west angle of section XXIV., parish of Keelbundora; thence east by the northern boundaries of sections XXIV., XXV., and XXVI. to the eastern boundary of the Epping Road District; thence northerly, westerly, and southerly by the eastern, northern, and western boundary of the said district to the commencing point.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that when any Crown land remains unsold within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land a farmers' common; when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for the use of such selectors and lessees; and it is also enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862*, and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase or proclaim (as the case may be) the commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

## MINING OPERATIONS AUTHORISED WITHIN EXEMPTED LAND AT BALLARAT.

THE Governor in Council has authorised the holders of a miner's rights to mine within the limits of the land occupied as a Police Paddock, north of the Ararat road and east of Winter's Swamp, Ballarat, subject to the following conditions, viz. :—

1. The surface of the land shall not be broken, nor shall it be occupied for the purpose of residence, nor shall any tents or buildings of any description be erected thereon.
2. The mining operations shall be conducted in such a manner as not to interfere with the purpose for which the reserve was made.
3. The warden or other authorised officer shall have power, at any time, to order the immediate discontinuance of any mining operations within the said reserve which may appear to him likely to injure the surface of the land.
4. The workings shall be open at all reasonable hours to the inspection of any mining surveyor or other authorised officer.
