By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Vic-toria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Land Act 1862 it is amongst other things enacted that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common respectively, as the case may be: And whereas by The Amending Land Act 1865 it is amongst other things enacted that when any Crown land remains unsold within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under The Land Act 1862, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land a farmers' common; when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under the The Land Act 1862, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for the use of such selectors and lesses; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or reproclaimed, and may from time to time reproclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of The Land Act 1862 and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darking, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim, increase, or abolish (as the case may be) the Commons hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, that is to say:—

BABNAWARTHA FARMERS' COMMON.—The Barnawartha Farmers' Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date

Twelvo out of the fourteen deaths registered at Collingwood were of children under three years of age, the chief causes of death being scariatina and diarrhoma. Out of the thirty-two deaths registered at South Melbourne nine were inquest cases; and in North Melbourne thirteen out of twenty-three were deaths of children under three years, diarrhoma and scariatina being the most fatal diseases. Dysentery and diarrhoma exist at Emerald Hill, and there, as in the districts generally, the mortality has been on the increase.
