SHIRE OF BELFAST.

A COPY OF THE BYE-LAWS FOR THE COUNCIL OF THE SHIRE OF BELFAST.

THE following bye-law No. 1 was made by a special order of council at a meeting held at the Shire Office, Rosebrook, on Saturday, the 21st day of January, 1865.

2. The business of the council at all meetings shall be conducted with open doors, unless when the council are in committee.

3. The ordinary meetings of the council shall be held every fourth Saturday throughout the year, at Eleven o'clock in the forenoon; commencing on the 21st January, 1865.

4. The business of the council shall commence as soon as a quorum are present, but should such quorum not be present at the expiration of one hour after the time appointed for such meeting the circumstance shall be entered in the minute book together with the names of the members present, and said meeting shall lapse and stand adjourned to the following ordinary day of meeting.

5. The minutes of any meeting not previously confirmed shall be read first at all meetings in order that they may be confirmed, and no discussion shall take place thereon except as to their accuracy.

6. At all meetings the reading of correspondence unconnected with the business of the meeting, the presentation of memorials and petitions, the bringing of reports and notices of motion, shall have precedence in the order named of the business of each meeting. Memorials and petitions shall be presented by members only, who shall be responsible to the council for their being respectfully worded.

7. The orders of the day shall include all business incomplete at a former meeting, all matters of which due notice has been given, and any business which the president may see fit to introduce, and shall have precedence in the order in which they stand in the minute book and notice book respectively.

8. Notices of motion, containing the name of the proposer, shall be handed to the secretary during the sitting of the council, who shall enter them in a minute book to be kept specially for that purpose, and the member making such motion shall read the same aloud, and state day of bringing on such motion.

9. No motion entered on the notice book shall be proceeded with unless the member who gave such notice is present when the motion is called, or unless some other member present be authorised in writing by the proposer to take up the motion during his absence, and all notices not so proceeded with will be struck out.

10. No motion or amendment shall be entertained or discussed until it has been seconded, and one amendment only shall be discussed at the one time; but all amendments shall be considered and put before the original motion, and no member shall move more than one amendment on the same question. On the adoption of any amendment by the council, such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion, and for all purposes of subsequent discussion the amendment so carried shall be acted upon as an original motion.

11. Any member when speaking to a motion or amendment, or discussing any matter, must rise and address the president; and no member shall be interrupted except by a call to order, and the member then calling to order shall be heard, and the question of order decided before the subject is resumed, or any other business transacted; and any member moving or seconding any motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken on that amendment.

12. The president shall put each question, first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and shall there and then decide which has the majority.

13. The ruling of the president shall be final on all points of order, and shall be given without argument or comment, except by way of citing a precedent, and if two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the president shall decide which has the first claim to be heard.

14. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for the adjournment of the council, and if, on the question being put, the motion for adjournment is negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, or any other that may be allowed precedence by the president, shall be discussed, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be entertained. But if the motion for adjournment be carried, then the business undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the council.

15. The council shall, in all cases, vote by a show of hands, and on a division the names of the members voting pro and con shall be recorded. Any member may require the secretary to take down, in writing, any particular word or words used by a member immediately on the same being used.

16. No member shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion, or impute improper motives, or use disrespectful words to others, or appear before the council in an improper manner, and all personal reflections upon any member or officer of the council shall be considered as highly disorderly, and the member making use of such offensive expressions, appearing before the council in an improper manner

of which the president shall be the judge, shall be liable, at the discretion of the council, to a fine not exceeding Five pounds.

17. In committee of the council the standing orders shall also be strictly observed.

18. It shall be competent for a majority of not less than two-thirds of the council in session to suspend, during the discussion of any subject, any standing order herein contained, except the purport of such suspension be the rescinding of any motion previously adopted by the council.

19. All payments shall be made by cheque, signed by the president or acting chairman and one member, countersigned by the treasurer.

20. Tenders shall be addressed to the president, and shall be on the printed forms, and must not only include a lump sum for the whole of the work specified but also a complete schedule of quantities and prices, showing how the lump sum has been arrived at, and must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit, according to the following scale:—For every tender which does not amount to £1000, £10; for every tender which exceeds in amount £1000, £25. The security in all cases of contracts shall be £10 per cent. on the amount of the tender. Tenders which do not comply with these conditions will be rejected.

21. Any contractor whose tender has been accepted by the council, and who fails or refuses to sign the contract and complete the full deposit within one week after the acceptance of the tenders shall forfeit the moneys paid in by him as a preliminary deposit, any error in computing the amount of the said tenders or ignorance or misunderstanding of the conditions of the specification that may be alleged to the contrary notwithstanding, and the council shall be at liberty to re-let the contract.

22. No deposit shall be repaid to the contractor until he has obtained a certificate from the engineer of the council (to be attached to applications for such refund) that the works have been completed in accordance with the terms and conditions of the specification, &c.

23. No councillor or officer of the council shall be received as surety for any officer or servant appointed by the council.

24. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would involve the expenditure of any sum of money exceeding £50, shall be entertained by the council, unless notice of such motion be given in the usual manner.

25. It shall be competent for any councillor without previous notice, to move for a call of the whole council for the consideration of any subject, at the next or any subsequent meeting, and upon such motion being carried, due notice thereof and of the date for which the order of the day or notice of motion for which such call is made is set down for consideration, shall be given by the secretary to each councillor, and any councillor not in attendance when such order of the day or notice of motion comes on for discussion, or at the voting on such question, or any amendment thereon, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

OFFICERS.

26. Any officer or servant of the council who shall wilfully, by any act of omission or commission of any matter or thing appertaining to his duties, by which the council shall sustain any loss or damage, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

27. In all cases it shall be considered sufficient for the collector to call once for any sum due on the assessment roll, and in the event of any such sum not being paid to him, a notice shall be left by the collector stating that unless such sum be paid before the expiration of 14 days from the date thereof, legal proceedings shall be taken by the collector for its recovery.

28. The engineer, secretary, treasurer, collector, valuers, and poundkeepers, shall be considered the officers of the council within the meaning of this bye-law.

29. The collector shall, previous to the day on which the ordinary meetings of the council take place, prepare a report showing the amount of rates received by him during the month preceding, the moneys paid in to the treasurer, and the amount of uncollected rates, and shall deliver the same to the secretary.
