NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF MINING LEASES.

Notice to Mariners.

WALLAROO AND TIPARA BAYS.

All bearings are magnetic, variation $4^{\circ} 30'$ E.

Notice is hereby given that on and after the (1st) first day of April next (1865), the floating beacon now moored on the Tipara Reef will be replaced by a temporary lightship, which will be moored close under the rocky patch near the southern extremity of the Tipara Reef, with the following bearings:—

Elizabeth Point, S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ S.; Long Point, N.E. by E. The lightship has two masts, is painted red, and exhibits during the day a red ball at the mainmast head.

Lights.—From sunset to sunrise will be exhibited the following lights:—A white light from the mainmast (21) twenty-four feet above the sea-level, visible from all points of the compass at a distance of (7) seven miles in clear weather. A red light from the foremast (12) twelve feet above the sea-level, visible from N. to S. round by W. at a distance of (3) three miles in clear weather.

Vessels making the light from the N.N.W. should not stand towards the northern extremity of the reef whilst the red light is visible; by observing the direction a ship will be well clear of the reef.

Should the weather be hazy, and the red or less intense light be obscured, no vessel should approach the reef with the white light bearing S.S.E. under (7) seven fathoms.

The following description of the Tipara, and sailing directions for Wallaroo or Tipara Bays, are published for the guidance of mariners:—

The Tipara Reef is an extensive shoal, the southern extremity being four and a half ($4\frac{1}{2}$) miles N.W. from Elizabeth Point.

The reef consists principally of sand, but there is a rocky patch of small extent near the southern extremity which dries at low water; it is under the shelter of this patch where the lightship, referred to above, will be moored.

From the rocky patch, the reef extends in a northerly direction about two (2) miles, the outer edge trending to the N.N.W.; whilst the S.E. part takes a N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. direction; the extreme breadth from east to west nearly two (2) miles.

The soundings on the reef vary; in some places there being a fathom and a half ($1\frac{1}{2}$), whilst in others, particularly to the N.N.E. part of the shoal, there are only two (2) or three (3) feet. From the northern extremity of the reef the buoy off Long Point, referred to in this notice, bears N.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.

Vessels rounding the south part of the reef should not bring Elizabeth Point to bear to the southward of S.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.; whilst those intending to pass to the northward of the danger, into or out of Tipara Bay, should not bring the buoy off Long Point to bear to the eastward of E. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N.

A red nun buoy has also been placed off Long Point in three (3) fathoms, with the following bearings:—Elizabeth Point, S. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.; Long Point, E. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N.

To pass outside or to the westward of the Tipara Reef, do not approach the lightship from the westward under six (6) fathoms, or come within a mile of the same; from this position, when to the westward of the reef, steer a N.N.W. course, in which the same soundings will be maintained.

When the buoy of Long Point bears east, a course of N.E. may be shaped, taking care as the Long Point buoy is brought to bear S.E. not to come under four and a half ($4\frac{1}{2}$) fathoms.

When Long Point bears south, a course of E. by N. may be shaped, when the pilot and harbor master will come off and conduct the vessel to the anchorage or jetty.

At night no vessel in the vicinity of Tipara Reef should come under (7) seven fathoms, or attempt to enter the bay until the lights from the Smelting Works are clearly defined bearing E. by N., when that course may be shaped for the anchorage; taking care not to come under six (6) fathoms, unless the commander is sufficiently well acquainted with the bay to take the ship in, or the pilot has taken charge.

The tides in the vicinity of the reef and Long and Elizabeth Points are irregular and rapid; care must therefore be exercised to guard against the influence of the tides when in the stream of the reef, or near the points referred to.

It is high water at Port Wallaroo at 5h. 45m. P. & C.; rise and fall four (4) feet eight (8) inches at ordinary springs.

To pass inside Tipara Reef give Elizabeth Point a berth of a mile and a half ($1\frac{1}{2}$) to avoid the shoal rocky patch which extends nearly a mile from the point in a north-westerly direction.

With the Point bearing S.E., distant a mile and a half (1½), steer due N., which course will lead through the inner passage in not less than four (4) fathoms.

In beating through, keep the lead going, and do not, in a vessel drawing more than seventeen (17) feet, when standing in shore, bring Long Point buoy to bear to the westward of W.N.W.

In standing off, when to the southward of the north end of the reef, do not bring the Long Point buoy to bear to the eastward of N.N.E., by which the eastern part of the reef will be avoided.

Small vessels may pass inside the Long Point buoy, taking care not to bring Elizabeth Point to bear to the westward of S. by W., so as to avoid the Walrus Rock. With the above bearing a vessel will be in two (2) fathoms at low water, spring tides, with the Walrus Rock distant about half a mile.

The Walrus Rock lies nearly a mile off Long Point, when bearing S.E. by S., and is nearly dry at low water.

N.E. a mile and a half (1½) from the Walrus Rock lies the Bird Reef, which is awash at low water.

Coasters should give this danger a wide berth, not bringing the Long Point buoy to bear to the westward of S.W. With this bearing a vessel will be in two (2) fathoms at low water.

In the bay there is excellent anchorage in four (4) fathoms with the jetty end bearing E.S.E., distant about two (2) cables' lengths.

Small vessels can anchor in three (3) fathoms, with the end of the jetty bearing S.S.E. to S.

Alongside the jetty will be found good berths from eight (8) to fourteen (14) feet shoaling towards the shore.

TOWN COMMONS.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act*, 1862, it is amongst other things enacted that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

HUNTLY TOWN COMMON.—The undermentioned land shall be and constitute a Common for the use of all householders in the town of Huntly, viz.:—1967 acres, more or less, being allotments 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, and 16 of section 13, and sections 17, 18, and 19, in the parish of Huntly.—(65.L.1363.)

WALLAN-WALLAN TOWN COMMON.—The land hereafter described shall be and constitute a Common for the use of all householders in the town of Wallan-wallan, viz.:—430 acres, more or less, county of Bourke, parish of Wallan-wallan, being allotment 17 in the said parish, and the unsold and unappropriated land in the township of Wallan-wallan.—(65.L.405.)

YAMBUK TOWN COMMON.—The land hereafter described shall be and constitute a Common for the use of all householders in the town of Yambuk, viz.:—160 acres, more or less, county of Villiers, parish of Codrington, being the unappropriated land in that portion of the township of Yambuk lying on the right bank of the River Shaw: Commencing at a point on the said river; thence by part of the north boundary of the said township, bearing west sixty chains, more or less; thence by the west boundary thereof, bearing south forty chains; thence by part of the south boundary thereof, bearing east twenty-six chains, more or less, to the before-mentioned river; thence by the said river, bearing north-easterly to the point of commencement.—(65.L.412.)

REGULATIONS FOR THE REFORMATORY SCHOOL ON BOARD THE HULK "DEBORAH."

THE Governor in Council, in exercise of the power conferred by *The Neglected and Criminal Children's Act, 1864*, has approved of the subjoined Regulations for the Reformatory School on board the hulk *Deborah*.

- These rules to be read to every boy on joining the ship, and afterwards monthly.
- No boy is to have in his possession any article not issued

to him by the Government, and any boy may be searched whenever it is thought necessary.

3. At the ringing of the first bell every morning, each boy will rise, fold up his bedding neatly in his hammock according to the pattern shown him, and will be ready by the second bell, to convey his hammock on deck or otherwise as he may be directed.

4. Every morning as soon as the boys are washed and dressed, and every evening immediately before lock-up, prayers are to be read; grace will be said before and after meals by one of the elder boys; and every Sunday divine service will be performed by the ministers of religion appointed for the purpose, or in the absence of any such minister, by an officer of the ship, but no boy is to be required to be present at the religious worship of any other denomination than that to which he belongs.

5. The boys will attend school every week day for two hours, and a school register will be kept recording the attendance, and showing the progress made.

6. The boys will on all occasions when ranked up for muster or other purpose, or when confined for misconduct, observe the strictest silence, and no loud or unnecessary talking will be permitted during their attendance at school or when at work. Swearing, indecent and profane or improper language are at all times forbidden.

7. After being locked up for the night the boys may talk in a quiet orderly manner until the ringing of the silence bell, after which they must be totally silent. Should anything be required during the night, the warder on duty must be applied to, but no unnecessary trouble is to be given.

8. When on deck the boys will conduct themselves in an orderly manner, and perform cheerfully any work assigned to them. They are not to climb up the bulwarks, go down the side-ladders, enter the galleys, or be found in any prohibited part of the ship.

9. Every boy who can read will be supplied with a bible and prayerbook, and will be allowed instructive books at suitable hours, but this indulgence will be withdrawn from any boy who may wilfully or carelessly damage or lose a book.

10. Every boy must be strictly obedient and respectful to his officers, industrious at his work, attentive when at school, neat and clean in his person and habits, careful of his clothes, books, and other government property, and quiet and orderly in his general conduct.

11. Should any boy wish to see the inspector-general, he will give his name to the officer in charge of the ship, who will insert it in a book kept for that purpose; but any boy desirous of complaining of his treatment in any way, must do so within a week of the occurrence complained of, or no notice will be taken of his complaint.

12. Any boy wishing to write to a relation may do so once in three months, or oftener if special necessity be shown, but no attempt must be made to send a letter without permission; and every letter written or received by any boy shall be inspected by the superintendent or other officer appointed for the purpose, who may, if he shall see fit, withhold any such letter until he shall receive instructions respecting it from the inspector-general.

13. Relations of boys will be permitted to visit them, and converse with them in the presence of an officer, at intervals of a month, on application to the office of the Inspector-General of Penal Establishments, Melbourne.

14. Ministers of religion will be allowed to visit boys of their respective denominations every day (except Saturday), between the hours of Eleven a.m. and Three p.m.

15. Any boy who may infringe these regulations, or be guilty of any disobedience of any lawful order, or of any turbulent, dishonest, or immoral conduct, may be punished by the superintendent, or, in his absence, by the senior officer of the ship, provided that a record of every such punishment shall be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose; provided also that no corporal punishment shall exceed that which may be lawfully inflicted, by schoolmasters, and that no boy shall be kept in solitary confinement for a longer period than three days, or on bread and water only for a longer period than forty-eight hours.
