The Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Rules, adopted by the 2nd Ballarat Volunteer Rifle Corps, in lieu of those of the 21st of December, 1863, and the 5th of January, 1864.

RULES OF THE NO. 2 CORPS OF THE BALLARAT VOLUNTEER RANGERS.

1. The corps shall be styled "The 2nd Ballarat Volunteer Rangers," and every member shall be subject to the following rules.

2. The monthly subscriptions shall be One shilling (1s.), payable on the first day of each month.

3. No member shall wear the regulation uniform, as adopted by the corps, unless on duty or by permission of the officer commanding the corps, under a penalty of 2s. 6d. for each offence.

4. Any member having any complaint to make against any other member of the corps, whether commissioned officer, non-commissioned officer, or private, shall make the complaint in writing to the captain of his company, by whom it shall be placed in the hands of the commanding officer, who shall decide what action shall be taken in the matter.

5. Any member desiring leave of absence exceeding twenty-eight (28) days, shall apply in writing for such leave of absence to the officer in command of the corps, shall return his rifle and accoutrements into store properly cleaned and in good repair, and shall leave his address. All members changing their permanent address shall give notice of the same in writing to the secretary within fourteen (14) days of the same, under a penalty of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.).

6. Should occasion require the corps to be called together on any emergency, any member having obtained leave of absence shall hasten at once to head quarters, and consider his leave of absence cancelled.

7. Members shall be accountable for the good and serviceable order of their arms and accoutrements, clothing, &c., and shall make good any damage thereto occasioned by negligence.

8. Any member appearing at parade or drill with his person, clothing, arms, or accoutrements in a dirty state, or misconducting himself by using improper language to any other member, or in any other manner, shall be liable to be fined by the officer in command of the parade or drill any sum not exceeding 20s.

9. All fines collected shall be appropriated to such uses as the committee appointed under these rules shall decide; and at every general meeting of the corps (which general meeting shall be held half-yearly, viz., after the first parades in the months of January and July), the secretary shall submit a statement of all fines and subscriptions, and of their appropriation, for the information of the corps.

10. All members who may be three months in arrears with their subscriptions and fines, shall be proceeded against under the Volunteer Act for the recovery of the same.

11. The committee shall consist of ten (10) members (viz.), the commanding officer and three senior officers, the secretary and treasurer to be *ex officio* members, and four members to be elected by ballot; four to form a quorum. The election of the committee, secretary, and treasurer to take place at the half-yearly meetings of the corps.

12. The officer commanding shall fix the time and place for drill, parade, and practice, and meetings not otherwise provided for by these rules.

13. An account shall be kept with each member of the corps, in which he shall be debited with all sums charged to the corps on his behalf for uniform and drill instruction, and credited with all amounts earned by him as an effective.

14. If on the 1st January in any year a member's debit exceeds his credit by £1 or upwards, he shall be fined the amount of such difference; provided always that the amount of such fine shall not in any case exceed £2, and that the officer commanding may, at his discretion, enforce only one-half the fine.

15. If any member at any time desire to quit the corps under the provisions of the Act, he shall be fined the amount, if more than Ten (10) shillings, whereby the debit exceeds his credit; provided that no such fine shall exceed £2, and that the whole or the half may, at the discretion of the officer commanding, be remitted.

These rules were read over to No. 2 corps of the Ballarat Volunteer Rangers, at a general meeting held on the 13th February, 1865, and agreed to.

PATTERNS OF MERCHANDISE SENT BY POST BETWEEN THE UNITED KINGDOM AND VICTORIA.

The following arrangement under 35th section 27th Victoria No. 226, article 5, has been approved by the Governor in Council.

Patterns of merchandise may be forwarded between Victoria and the United Kingdom, subject to the same rates of postage and general regulations as books; and that the following conditions be also observed:—

1. The patterns must be of no intrinsic value. This rule excludes all articles of a saleable nature, and indeed whatever may have a value of its own apart from its mere use as a pattern, nor must the quantity of any material sent ostensibly as a pattern be so great that it could fairly be considered as having on this ground an intrinsic value.

2. The patterns must not bear any writing other than the address of the persons for whom they are intended, a manufacturer's or trade mark, numbers, and the prices of articles.

3. The patterns must be sent in covers open at the ends, so as to be easy of examination.

Samples, however, of seeds, drugs, and so forth, which cannot be sent in open covers, may be enclosed in bags of linen or other material; but closed bags, although transparent, must not be used for this purpose.

4. No article likely to injure the contents of the Mail bags, or the person of any officer of the Post Office, shall be forwarded as a pattern.
