EXAMINATIONS FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.

THE Governor has directed the subjoined Despatch and Regulations to be published.

SIR,—With reference to the Circular Despatch of my predecessor of the 18th January, 1864, I transmit to you, at the request of the Civil Service Commissioners, the enclosed Regulations for an examination of candidates for the Civil Service of India, which is to take place in the month of June, 1865.

REGULATIONS

For the Open Competition of 1865.*

For the Open Competition of 1865.*

1. In June, 1865, an examination of candidates will be held in London. Not less than candidates will be selected, if so many shall be found duly qualified. Of these, will be selected for the Presidency of Bengal, [for the Upper Provinces, and for the Lower Provinces,] for that of Madras, and for that of Bombay. †—Notice will hereafter be given of the days and place of examination.

2. Any natural-born subject of Her Majesty, who shall be desirous of entering the Civil Service of India, will be entitled to be examined at such examination, provided he shall, on or before the 1st May, 1865, have transmitted to the Civil Service Commissioners, Dean's Yard, Londou, S.W.—

(a) A certificate of his birth, showing that his age on the 1st May, 1865, will be above seventeen years and under twenty-two years; [1]

(b) A certificate, signed by a physician or surgeon, of his having no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity, unfitting him for the Civil Service of India;

(c) Satisfactory proof of good moral character;
(d) A statement of those of the branches of knowledge hereinafter enumerated in which he desires to be examined.§

3. In any case in which a doubt may arise as to the eligibility of a candidate in respect of age, health, or character, such inquiries as may be necessary will be instituted by the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. The examination will take place only in the following branches of knowledge ||:

5. The merit of the persons examined will be estimated by marks, and the number set opposite to each branch in the pre-ceding regulation denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it.

- 6. No candidate will be allowed any marks in respect of any subject of examination unless he shall be considered to possess a competent knowledge of that subject.¶
- 7. The examination will be conducted by means of printed questions and written answers, and by vivá voce examination, as may be deemed necessary.

The Regulations are liable to be altered in future years.
 The number of appointments to be made, and the number in each Presidency, &c., will be announced hereafter.
 In future competitions it is intended that the maximum limit of age shall

- be 21.

 § Candidates are at liberty to send in their names and evidence of age as soon as they think fit to do so; but evidence of health and character must bear date not certifer than the 1st April, 1865.

 § It should be understood that candidates are at liberty to name at their pleasure any or all of these branches of knowledge (subject only to the restriction above mentioned as to Natural Science), and that no subjects are obligatory, qf "Nothing can be further from our wish than to hold out premiums for knowledge of wide surince and of small depth. We are of opinion that a candidate ought to be allowed no credit at all for taking up a subject in which he is a mere smallerer,"—Report of Committee of 1854.

- 8. The marks obtained by each candidate, in respect of each of the subjects in which he shall have been examined, will be added up, and the names of the candidates who shall have obtained a greater aggregate number of marks than any of the remaining candidates will be set forth in order of merit, and such candidates shall be deemed to be selected candidates for the Civil Service of India. They shall be permitted to choose, according to the order in which they stand, as long as a choice remains, the Presidency (and in Bengal, the division of the Presidency) to which they shall be appointed.
- 9. Selected candidates before proceeding to India will be on probation for two years, during which time they will be examined periodically with the view of testing their progress in the following subjects*:—

1. Oriental Languages:	Marks.
Sanskrit	 500
Vernacular Languages of India (each)	 400
2. The History and Geography of India	 350
3. Law	 1,250
4. Political Economy	 350

In these examinations, as in the open competition, the merit of the candidates examined will be estimated by marks, and the number set opposite to each subject denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it at any one examination. The examination will be conducted by means of printed questions and written answers, and by viol voce examination, as may be deemed necessary. The marks obtained at each of such periodical examinations will be added to those previously or subsequently obtained. The last of these examinations will be held at the close of the second year of probation, and will be called the "Final Examination," at which it will be decided whether a selected candidate is qualified for the Civil Service of India.

- 10. No candidate will be permitted to proceed to India until he shall have passed the final examination, and received a certificate of qualification from the Civil Service Commissioners, or after he shall have attained the age of twenty-four years and six months.†
- '11. The selected candidates who at the final examination shall be found to have a competent knowledge of the subjects specified in Regulation 9 shall be adjudged to have passed, and to be entitled to be appointed to the Civil Service of India.
- 12. The seniority in the Civil Service of India of the selected candidates shall be determined according to the order in which they stand on the list resulting from the final examination.
- 13. No person will, even after passing the final examination, be allowed to proceed to India unless he shall comply with the regulations in force at the time for the Civil Service of India, and shall be of sound bodily health and good moral character. The Civil Service Commissioners will require such further evidence on these points as they may deem necessary before granting their certificate of qualification.
- 14. Applications from persons desirous to be admitted as candidates are to be addressed to the Secretary to the Civil Service Commissioners, Dean's Yard, London, S.W.

NOTE.—(1.) The Secretary of State for India in Council has authorized the Civil Service Commissioners to state that it is his intention to allow the sum of £100 for the first year of probation and £200 for the second year to each selected candidate who shall have passed the required examinations to the satisfaction of the Commissioners, and shall have complied with such rules as may be laid down for the guidance of selected candidates.

- (2.) All selected candidates will be required, at the commencement of the second year of probation, to attend at the India Office, to make the necessary arrangements for entering into covenants (binding themselves, amongst other things, to refund in certain cases the amount of their allowance in case of their failing to proceed to India), and for giving a bond for £1000, jointly with two sureties, for the due fulfilment of the same. The stamps payable by civilians on their appointment amount to £3 10s.
- (3.) Candidates rejected at the final examination of 1867 will in no case be allowed to present themselves for re-examination.
