THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACT EXTENDED TO THE SHIRE OF KYNETON.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session held in the eighteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign (number 13), intituled, *An Act for promoting the Public Health in populous places in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted that the said Act, or any clause or section thereof, shall apply to such city, town, district, or place in Victoria as the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may by Proclamation see fit to direct: And whereas it is expedient to extend the said Act to the undermentioned shire: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby declare and direct that the said Act shall apply to and be in force within the whole of the Shire of Kyneton.

SECTIONS V. TO X. OF "THE POLICE OFFENCES STATUTE, 1864," EXTENDED TO THE BOROUGH OF RUTHERGLEN.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 225), called *The Police Offences Statute, 1864*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such Proclamation; and upon any such Proclamation the provisions so

proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation extend the provisions contained in sections V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X. of Part I. of the said Statute to the Borough hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

The Borough of Rutherglen.
