PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act*, 1862, it is amongst other things enacted that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common respectively, as the case may be: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim Nine hundred acres, more or less, in the county of Grenville, being the unsold and unappropriated Crown lands in the township of Shelford, to be a Town Common for all householders in the town of Shelford aforesaid, in accordance with the above recited provisions of the said Act.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-seventh day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, and in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.

DISTRICT BROUGHT UNDER THE GUNPOWDER ACT.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act to regulate the importation, carriage, and custody of Gunpowder*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may proclaim any town, township, or borough, not being a sea-port town, as a district into which no gunpowder shall be brought unless for deposit in a public or licensed magazine; and if any person shall bring more than one hundred pounds of gunpowder into any such district, and shall not forthwith deposit the same in a magazine as aforesaid, it shall be forfeited: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the borough of Daylesford as a district into which no gunpowder shall be brought unless for deposit in a public or licensed magazine.
