PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Statute of Gaols*, 1864, 27 Victoria No. 219, it is amongst other things enacted that the several Acts and parts of Acts mentioned in the schedule to the now reciting Act, to the extent to which the same are therein expressed to be repealed, shall be and the same are thereby repealed, but such repeal shall not affect any proclamation, sentence, rule, regulation, appointment, order, proceeding, warrant, direction, offence, or other thing theretofore passed, made, done, or committed, but any such proclamation, rule, regulation, appointment, order, or direction may be rescinded, altered, or otherwise dealt with as if the same had been made or passed under the now reciting Act: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the eleventh day of December in the year 1857, a certain building called and known as the Police Lock-up at Carisbrook was proclaimed a gaol: And whereas it is expedient to discontinue the use of the said premises for the confinement of prisoners under sentence: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the Proclamation hereinbefore mentioned, whereby the said Police Lock-up at Carisbrook was constituted a Gaol.
