THE SUBDIVISIONS OF THE SHIRE OF BELFAST.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the twenty-seventh day of February, 1865.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor	Mr. Verdon

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act*, 1863, it is amongst other things enacted, that at any time after the first annual election or general election, as the case may be, or first appointment of members of the district board, for any original or proclaimed district thereafter sometimes called "single district," the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, and if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said district, shall within three months after the receipt of the same divide the district into two, or, if the Governor in Council shall see fit, into three separate electoral subdivisions, thereafter called subdivisions, by such names as shall by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council the boundaries of the subdivisions shall be set forth; provided that no such division shall be made within three months before any day appointed for holding any election of members of the district board in or for such district; and it is also enacted that every shire shall after the proclamation thereof as such be and be deemed to be and have been such and the same district as such shire was at the time of such proclamation, and save as aforesaid and save where herein otherwise expressly provided all the provisions of the said Act relating to districts shall continue and be of full force and effect with regard to such shire and be read accordingly: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made on the thirtieth day of November, 1863, the shire of Belfast was constituted: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by more than twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said shire, praying for the division of the said shire into three subdivisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order divide the shire of Belfast into three separate electoral subdivisions in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by the names hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, and doth hereby set forth the boundaries of the said several subdivisions in manner following, that is to say:—

THE NORTH RIDING—Commencing at the south-east angle of the Woolsthorpe Township Reserve; thence westerly by the south boundary of said reserve and the northern boundary of the Tower Hill Farmers' Common to the junction of the Yambuk and Bootahpool Farmers' Common; thence by the northern boundary of the last-named common to the Shaw River; thence southerly by the Shaw River to the northern boundary of the Codrington Farmers' Common; thence by portion of the northern boundary and part of the eastern boundary of said Codrington Farmers' Common to its north-east angle; thence by the northern boundary of the same common and a direct line west to the western boundary of the shire; thence northerly by the said western boundary to the run occupied by T. A. Brown; thence by part of the southern and by the western boundaries of the said run to the run occupied by R. and W. Jamieson; thence by the south-western and by the western boundaries of the runs occupied by R. and W. Jamieson, Samuel McGregor, John McKellar, and James Whyte's run, respectively, and a direct line to the north-west angle of J. R. Nowlan's pro-emptive right; thence by the western boundary of the said right to the south-west angle of said right; thence by a direct line south-easterly to the north-west angle of the Weerancourt pro-emptive right; thence by the west boundary of the said right to the south-west angle thereof; thence by a line south-easterly to the north-west angle of section IV. of the parish of Macarthur; thence southerly by the western boundary of section IV. and the south-west boundary of section II. of the said parish to the north-west angle of the township reserve of Macarthur; thence by the northern and eastern boundary of the said township reserve to the western boundary of the county of Villiers; thence northerly by the county boundary of Villiers to the southern boundary of the Mount Rouse road district (as gazetted 2nd October, 1860); thence easterly by the southern boundary of the Mount Rouse road district to the western boundary of the township of Caramut; thence south and east by the western and southern boundaries of the township of Caramut to the centre of the Ararat and south-western sea-board road; thence south by the centre of the abovenamed road to the town reserve of Woolsthorpe; thence by the eastern boundary line of the said reserve south to the commencing point.

THE EAST RIDING—Commencing at the south-east angle of the township reserve of Woolsthorpe; thence by a line south to the northern boundary of portion 2, parish of Yarrturk; thence by the northern and eastern boundary of portion 2 and the eastern and southern boundary of portion 4 of the said parish to the north-west angle of portion 6 A of the said parish; thence by a line bearing south to portion 20 in the said parish; thence by part of the northern and western boundaries of the said portion to the Yangery Creek; thence by the Yangery Creek southwards to a bridge on the Woodford road; thence by that road westerly seventy-five chains twenty-five links, more or less; thence by a road due south to Rutledge's special survey, and by the boundary between the farms occupied by Pickering and Sloane and a line south to the sea-coast; thence westerly by the sea-coast to the mouth of the Belfast Lough; thence by the eastern shore of the Belfast Lough and the River Moyne to the main road from Belfast to Warnambool; thence easterly by the said road to the three-chain road to Kirkstall; thence

northerly by the three-chain road abovenamed to the northern boundary of the Tower Hill Farmers' Common; thence by the boundary of the said common northerly and easterly to the commencing point.

THE WEST RIDING.—Commencing at a point on the sea-coast forty chains east of the mouth of the Fitz Roy River; thence northerly by the west boundary of Peyton and Mowbray's run to a point due west of the north boundary of the Coderington Farmers' Common; thence east to and by the said north boundary to the north-east angle of the common; thence south and further east by the boundary of the same common to where it intersects the Shaw River; thence northerly by the Shaw River to the northern boundary of the Yambuk and Bootahpool Farmers' Common; thence easterly by the northern boundary of said common last-mentioned and part of the Tower Hill Farmers' Common to the intersection of the three-chain road *via* Kirkstall to Mount Rouse; thence southerly by that road to the main road from Belfast to Warnambool; thence westerly by the main road to the Moyne River; thence southerly by the Moyne River and the western shore of the Belfast Lough to the sea-coast; thence by the sea-coast westerly to the commencing point. Excepting the Municipality of Belfast.

And the Honorable James Forrester Sullivan shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
