WORKS ON MAIN ROADS ORDERED UNDER "THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1863."

THE Governor in Council, in exercise of the power conferred by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, has, by Orders severally made on the 10th day of April, 1865, directed that the undermentioned Shire Council and District Boards of Road Districts shall, within the times by the said respective Orders appointed, execute the works on Main Roads hereinafter named and described, as provided by the 220th section of the said Act, according to plans deposited with the Board of Land and Works, that is to say:—

The Council of the Shire of Ararat shall, within twelve months from the 10th of April aforesaid, drain, form, and metal about two miles and nine chains of the Main Ballarat to Ararat road.

PORTLAND CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

- ALL charges must be paid to the person in charge when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
- Orders for interment must be given to the person in charge of the cemetery before Five o'clock p.m. on the day previous to the interment.
- The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.
- The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.
- The usual hours of interment will be from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.
- The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person, on evidence being produced to the trustees that the relations or friends of such persons are unable to pay the costs and charges.
- Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery, to be made to the trustees through the person in charge. A certificate permission will be granted to the person applying, on payment of the charges set forth in schedule A, and in compliance with the following rule.
- The trustees, if required, will cause all common graves to be dug at an extra expense of Fifteen shillings; but when a brick grave or vault is required, it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees or some person duly appointed by them; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent, in writing, of such person must be left with the order.
- All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences, to be kept in repair and in proper condition at the expense of the owner.
- Wooden fences allowed, but if not kept in proper repair will be removed by order of the trustees without notice to the owner.
- Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, or covered by slabs of stone, granite, slate, or iron.
- A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription, to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who may withhold permission and prevent the erection of any monument which shall appear to them unbecoming or inappropriate, and shall determine and fix the position of any monument which may be preferred to be erected according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets, copper or composition clamps must be used.
- No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
- It is notified, that any person wantonly or wilfully destroying, or doing, or causing to be done any damage to any monument, vault, or tombstone, building, erection, paling, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery, or guilty of a misdemeanor, and being convicted thereof, is liable to be punished as prescribed by the Act in that case made and provided.
- No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.
- The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.
- Three of the trustees to form a quorum.
- No grave to be of a less depth than six feet.
