PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight
Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath,
Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of
Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHILEAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common respectively, as the case may be: And whereas by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now rectifying Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby abolish and proclaim certain commons as hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Acts, that is to say:—

CODRINGTON FARMERS' COMMON—The common described in a Proclamation bearing date the seventeenth day of February, 1862, under the designation of a Farmers' Common for Agriculturists at Codrington, shall be and the same is hereby abolished. —(65.L.2747.)

ECHUCA BOROUGH COMMON—The unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries of the Borough of Echuca are hereby proclaimed to be a Borough Common for the use of all householders of the Borough of Echuca. —(65.K.3330.)

LENGTH OF VOYAGE OF STEAM VESSELS CARRYING PASSENGERS FROM VICTORIA TO SYDNEY, NEWCASTLE, ADELAIDE, AND HOBART TOWN.

PROCLAMATION.*

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS a Proclamation under the hand of the Acting Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twelfth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, was issued under the authority of *The Passengers Act 1855*, whereby amongst other things the length of the voyage for the purposes of the said Act of any steam vessel carrying passengers from Victoria to certain ports in New South Wales and Tasmania, and to South Australia, was declared as therein mentioned: And whereas it is expedient to revoke so much of the said Proclamation as is hereinafter specified: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that so much of the said Proclamation as prescribes what shall be deemed, for the purposes of the said Act, the length of the voyage from any port or place in Victoria to Sydney or Newcastle, New South Wales; Hobart Town, Tasmania; and South Australia, of any steam vessel carrying passengers, viz., twelve days for any auxiliary screw propelling vessel, ten days for any screw steam vessel, and eight days for any paddle-wheel steam vessel, shall, from and after the fifth day of May instant, cease and be revoked.

SECTIONS V. TO X. OF "THE POLICE OFFENCES STATUTE, 1864," EXTENDED TO THE BOROUGH OF WOODEND.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 225), called *The Police Offences Statute, 1864*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such Proclamation; and upon any such Proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation extend the provisions contained in sections V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X. of Part I. of the said Statute to the Borough of Woodend.

SHIRE OF KYNETON.

BYE-LAW No. 1.—FOR PROVIDING FOR THE DUE MANAGEMENT OF THE AFFAIRS OF THE COUNCIL, AND REGULATING THE CONDUCT OF THEIR OFFICERS AND SERVANTS.

BE it ordered and directed by the Council of the Shire of Kyneton as follows, that is to say:—

1. At every ordinary meeting of the council the first business thereof shall be the reading of, and putting for confirmation, the minutes of any preceding meeting; and no discussion shall be allowed thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings. The minutes, when confirmed, shall be signed by the president or chairman of the meeting at which the proceeding took place, in accordance with the Act.

2. The order of the business shall be as follows, or as near thereto as practicable:—

1. Reading of correspondence, and considering and ordering thereon.
2. Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
3. Reading and ordering on reports of committees and officers.
4. Orders of the day.
5. Motions of which previous notice has been duly given.
6. Examination and passing of accounts for payment.
7. Reading notices of motions for future meetings.

3. Every petition or memorial addressed to the council shall be in proper form, and must be presented by a councillor, who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded; and no debate shall take place thereon, except as to its being received and taken into consideration after the orders of the day, or at any future meeting, or, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

4. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the council, and any business which the president shall think fit to bring under consideration.

5. Every notice of motion shall be given to the secretary, in writing, and shall be read aloud at the meeting previous to that in which the same is to be taken into consideration, and every notice of motion shall be considered in the order in which it is given.

6. No motion entered on the notice paper shall be considered unless the councillor who has given such notice, or some other councillor authorised by him in writing, be present when the business is called on; and notices not so proceeded with shall be struck off the notice paper.

7. The mover of any motion which shall be referred to a committee shall, for the occasion, be a member of such committee.

8. Every councillor, including the president, shall stand up while addressing the council.

9. The president's ruling shall be final on all matters of order or practice.

10. Every motion or amendment shall be entered on the minutes, with the names of the mover and seconder, and on a decision thereon, the votes shall be recorded if required by any councillor.

11. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but, if lost, one other may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote; but, upon any amendment being carried, it shall be competent for any councillor to move one other amendment thereon.

12. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the motions then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next adjourned meeting of the council.

13. No councillor shall speak more than once on the same proposition, except by way of explanation, or reply on an original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of an amendment last proposed; and after the reply, the amendment or the original motion, as the case may be, shall be put to the vote.

14. Every councillor, when proposing a motion or amendment, or speaking on any matter, shall address the president, and shall not be interrupted except called to order, whereupon he shall sit down until the question of order shall have been decided. The councillor in possession of the chair may then resume the subject.

15. Any councillor who shall refuse to obey when ruled out of order, or shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, and who, if required by the president, shall refuse to withdraw such expression, and make satisfactory apology, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, to be recovered before any two or more justices of the peace.

16. Any councillor may, with the consent of the president, require the secretary to take down the particular words used by a councillor, immediately upon the same being uttered.

17. Any councillor may record his protest against any resolution of the council, on giving notice of his intention so to do, on the adoption of a resolution, and on such councillor entering his protest and his reasons for the same in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the council, and on his signing the same before the next meeting of the council; provided always that such protest may be expunged, if decided by a majority of the council not to be in accordance with truth, or not to be in terms respectful to the council.

18. No election to any office at the disposal of the council shall take place until six clear days' notice shall have been given in some local newspaper, inviting applications for the same, nor unless the salary or allowances attaching to such office shall have been fixed before proceeding to such election.

19. All revenue accruing from rates, licenses, Government grants in aid, or otherwise, shall be as a general rule allocated to each riding wherein they are raised, or for whose benefit such grant is made, except in the execution of necessary works for the joint benefit of each riding.

20. All contracts under £100 shall be made by tender, unless the council shall otherwise direct. All tenders shall be addressed to the president, and only opened at the time of their consideration by the council. When any tender shall have been accepted by the council, the person tendering, or some one on his behalf, shall pay a deposit at the rate of £5 per centum on all contracts amounting to £20 and upwards, into the hands of the secretary, which amount shall be returned to the contractor when he obtains a final certificate from the engineer that the works under such contract are satisfactorily completed.

21. All payments shall be made by cheque, and signed by the president and one other councillor, and countersigned by the secretary, and no cheque shall be given unless the account for which it is payable shall have been passed at a meeting of the council, or by a committee duly empowered so to do.

22. The shire office shall be open every day except the days excepted by the Local Government Act, and the days proclaimed as holidays under the Civil Service Act, between the hours of Ten and Three, and on Saturdays from Ten till Twelve o'clock, during which hours the secretary shall attend to transact the ordinary business of the council. The surveyor shall attend during the hours of business at every meeting of the council, and at such committee meetings as he may be required.

23. The valuer or valuers appointed by the council shall visit and examine every rateable property within the shire, and after having valued such property, shall deliver, or cause to be delivered, to the owner or occupier thereof (or if such owner or occupier cannot be found the same to be left on the premises) a notice setting forth the amount at which such property is valued, together with other particulars sufficient to describe such property; and every such notice shall be signed by the valuer.

24. The secretary and surveyor, and every other officer and servant, shall, whenever called on to do so, furnish official reports to the council.

25. The secretary shall have the custody of the common seal of the corporation; but he shall not affix the same to any corporate document without the express order of the council, nor unless such document bears the signature of the president, except in case of powers of attorney and other legal documents, not relating to the corporation, the signatures to which require to be verified before the president by declaration; and in any such case the said seal shall and may be affixed by the secretary to the president's certificate accompanying the same, on the receipt of a fee of 10s. 6d. for each attestation.

26. No motion, the effect of which would be to rescind any former resolution of the council, shall be entertained until fourteen days' notice be given, and a call of the council made; and no previous resolution shall be rescinded except such rescinding be carried by two-thirds of the councillors present.
