## CAUTION TO MASTERS OF VESSELS.

MR. CHARLES MOORE, master of the barque *Robert Passenger*, was condemned on the 9th instant, by the Junior District Magistrate of Port Louis, in a penalty of £10, for having, on the arrival of his vessel at this port (on the 24th April, 1864), made a false declaration of his passengers, in contravention of Article 7 of Ordinance No. 38 of 1844.

## Ordinance No. 38 of 1844.

Art. 7.—“The Health Officer shall always be accompanied by a Port Officer, who shall require the master to report his name, that of the vessel, her tonnage, the flag under which she sails, the force of her armament, number of guns, number and country of the crew, number of passengers, her cargo, the name of the port from whence she sailed, and the motives of the vessel's coming to the island of Mauritius.”

REGULATIONS FOR THE LOCAL MILITARY STORE  
DEPARTMENT.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations for the guidance of the Local Military Store Department, viz.:-

1. The superintendent of the military store department will have charge of all military works and buildings and of all munition of war, the property of the colony, and will be responsible for the due care of and preservation thereof, and also that the various reserves are at all times kept complete.

2. On the 31st March in each year the senior officer of the local military department shall cause to be furnished to the superintendent of military stores an estimate of probable requirements of his department for the year commencing on the 1st April following. The superintendent will then prepare requisitions, including requirements of his own branches, by the 1st May, for submission by the senior officer of the local military department to the ministerial officer, and will be responsible that no such requisitions are in excess of the sum voted by the legislature.

3. The minister of the department will from time to time issue instructions as to the description of warlike stores to be procured from beyond the limits of Victoria, the mode of obtaining them, and the payment of their cost.

4. Bills of lading for such stores shall be forwarded to the office of the minister, from whence they will be transmitted without delay to the superintendent, through the local military department.

5. On receipt of such bills of lading, the superintendent shall arrange for landing and taking delivery of the stores.

6. As soon as practicable after the landing of the stores, the superintendent shall make application for the appointment of a board of survey to the senior officer of his department, to whom the proceedings of the board shall be forwarded for the information of the responsible minister.

7. Boards of survey and tender boards shall consist, when possible, of officers of Her Majesty's regular or local forces, or of both, and of any other person or persons who may be nominated by the responsible minister.

8. Supplies obtained in Victoria shall be procured by the superintendent from Government contractors according to the schedules published in the *Government Gazette*, and he will take

delivery of the same. Should the required articles not be included in the schedules, the superintendent shall make application for special instructions as to inviting tenders, to the responsible minister, through the senior officer of the local staff.

9. In urgent cases the superintendent may, on his own responsibility, purchase stores and execute repairs, provided that the expenditure in each case does not exceed the sum of Ten pounds (£10). All such cases shall be immediately reported to the senior officer of the local staff for the information of the responsible minister.

10. All requisitions for stores from the local military store department shall be submitted for the approval of the senior officer of the local staff, or such officer as he may direct, and shall be forwarded to the superintendent of stores, who will give instructions as to their issue; and no issue shall in any case be made without his written order, or, in his absence, of the officer performing his duties.

11. The superintendent shall have the custody of the stores, and shall keep a clear and exact account of every article which may in any manner be placed under his charge. He shall be particularly attentive to the preservation of the supplies, and shall give positive orders to this effect to the persons employed under him.

12. No articles whatever shall be lent, sold, or exchanged, without the authority of the minister procured through the local military department.

13. When stores, whether serviceable or unserviceable, shall not be required for the service of the department, the superintendent shall apply to the minister through the local military department for instructions as to their disposal.

14. No article shall be considered as unserviceable until they shall have been inspected by a board of survey appointed by authority of the local military department, and condemned.

15. All articles in store shall be constantly under observation, and shall be frequently inspected in detail. The contents of each package to be at all times correctly noted in conspicuous characters on a label attached to the package itself.

16. The superintendent of stores shall from time to time inspect the stores, and take stock thereof at least once in each year, viz.:—on 31st December, or whenever called upon to do so by the Commissioners of Audit, or other competent authority; and further, shall see that due order and regularity are maintained by his clerk or issuer.

17. The superintendent of stores shall send in the following returns in duplicate, viz.:—a quarterly return of small arms, small arm ammunition, camp equipage, and a half-yearly return of ordnance stores. One copy of each of the information of the minister, and to be retained in the local military department; the other to be forwarded by the senior officer, local staff, to the officer commanding the forces.

18. In addition to the above regulations which are made to meet local requirements, the superintendent of stores will observe as far as practicable all rules, regulations, and customs in force in the imperial service, and will carry out all such instructions as may be given by the senior officer of his department, for the custody, issue, transport, repairs of military stores and material of war, works of defence and military buildings belonging to the colony of Victoria; and shall keep or cause to be kept all books and accounts in connection therewith.
