SIR.—I transmit to you a copy of a letter from the Royal Horticultural Society (3rd February, 1865), with a copy of a statement showing their intention to offer a prize for the best representative collection of fruit and vegetables from any of the colonies, to be exhibited at the Society's International Fruit Show in 1865.

You will perceive that the exhibition is fixed for the month of December in the present year.

I should be glad if the colonists of Victoria shall be able to avail themselves of the invitation of the society, by which I understand them to desire the exhibition of such fruit and vegetables (being capable of transmission to this country) as may either be characteristic of the colony and not equally produceable in many other parts of the world, or which, from local advantages, may be produced with peculiar success in the colony under your government.

NOTICE RESPECTING THE CLOTHING ISSUED FOR THE USE OF THE ABORIGINES.

THE USE OF THE ABORIGINES.

THE Central Board appointed to watch over the interests of the aborigines have caused the blankets and shirts issued this year to be finade of a peculiar pattern, as hereunder described; and it is hereby notified that the clothing is issued to the aborigines for their use and comfort, and still remains the property of the Government, and that no aboriginal can lawfully sell it, or exchange it for intoxicating liquors.

Persons illegally found in possession of any the blankets or shirts issued by the Central Board will be prosecuted.

The Blankets are of the following description: Size of a single blanket, 7 feet by 5 feet 4 inches: weight, 34 lbs. per pair; color, brownish-grey and yellow check. The brownish-grey stripes are 4 inches in width, and the yellow stripes 34 inches in width.

Serge Shirts: Rrownish-groy and yellow check.

Cotton Shirts: Narrow red and white stripes.

WORKS ON MAIN ROADS ORDERED UNDER "THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1863."

THE Governor in Council, in exercise of the power conforred by The Local Government Act, 1863. has, by Orders severally made on the 22nd day of May, 1865, directed that the undermentioned District Boards shall, within the times by the said respective Orders appointed, execute the works on Main Roads hereinafter named and described, as provided by the 220th section of the said Act, according to plans deposited with the Board of Land and Works, that is to say:—

The District Board of the Glenlyon Road District shall, within twelve months from the 22nd of May aforesaid, drain, form, and metal about one mile and eighteen chains of the Main Malmsbury to Daylesford road.

The District Board of the Metcalfe Road District shall, within twelve months from the 22nd of May aforesaid, drain, form, and metal about seventy-four chains, and drain and form about two miles and twenty-six chains of the Main Heathcote and Kyneton road.

The District Board of the Moorabbin Road District shall, within twelve months from the 22nd of May aforesaid, drain, form, and metal about three miles and forty-nine chains of the Main Point Nepean road.

MINING OPERATIONS AUTHORISED ON EXEMPTED LANDS AT CLUNES.

EMPTED LANDS AT CLUNES.

THE Governor in Council has authorised the holders of miners rights to mine upon and within the lands forming part of the Police Paddock at Clunes, and situate without the boundaries of the area still retained for the purposes of the police department, which is hereinafter described as follows:—

Commencing at the north-western angle of allotment No. 1, section A, township of Clunes, and bounded on the east by a line bearing south twenty-three degrees thirty minutes east five chains ninety-seven links; on the south by lines bearing south eighty-nine degrees twenty minutes west two chains thirty-two links; thence north forty minutes west fifty links; thence north forty minutes west eighteen chains fifty links; on the west by a line bearing north forty minutes west five chains; and on the north by a line bearing north eighty-nine degrees twenty minutes west eighteen chains fifty links, more or less, to the point of commencement; subject to the following conditions, namely:—

1. The surface of the ground shall not be occupied for the purpose of residence, and no tents or huts shall be erected thereon.

2. The warden or other authorised officer shall have power at

purpose of residence, and no tents or nuts shall be ercured thereon.

2. The warden or other authorised officer shall have power at any time to order the immediate discontinuance of any mining operations within the said reserve, which may appear to him likely to injure the surface of the land.

3. The workings shall be open at all reasonable hours to the inspection of any mining surveyor or other authorised officer.

4. On ceasing to mine the miners shall fill up all shafts and excavations made by them, and remove all debris, clay, and gravel, and leave the surfaceof the ground in as good a condition as before the commencement of mining operations.

5. In case any person so mining shall in any way violate any of the above conditions, it shall not be lawful for him any longer to mine upon or within the lands above described.

The mortality during April was higher than in the same month of the five preceding years. The readings of the thermometer show that the month was nearly two degrees warmer than the average. The temperature, however, was nearly as high in April, 1864, notwithstanding which the mortality was then considerably below the average.

Males and females died in the respective proportions of 55 and 45 per cent. 60 per cent. of the deaths were of children who had not reached their fifth year, against 62, 57, 58, 65, and 61 per cent. in the month of February of the five previous years respectively.

Ninoteen deaths occurred on the 13th and 20th, eighteen on the 1st and 3rd, and seventeen on the 19th and 23rd. These were the days of highest mortality. Those of the lowest were the 8th and 18th, the returns of each of which only show four deaths.

A male, aged 85 years, died of paralysis. This is the only death recorded during the month of a person more than 75 years old.

Twenty-one violent deaths occurred during the month. Of these eight were from drowning, viz., four male and two female adults and two children under 5 years of age. The death of a girl, aged 14, resulted from burns; that of a child, aged 22 months, of a scald. A laborer, aged 29, was crushed to death by a fall of earth; a carter, aged 51, died from the effects of a fractured ankle; a boy, aged 9, of fractured ribs; a girl, aged 9, and a boy, aged 2, of fractured fixle; a clerk, aged 48, was accidentally shot; a male, aged 36, died of sunstroke; a child, aged 7, of alcoholic poisoning; another, aged 26 weeks, of accidental suffocation; a goldminer, aged 38, committed self-destruction by poisoning; a male, aged 31, was hanged judicially.

Seventy deaths, or 18 per cent. of the whole number recorded, occurred in public institutions, viz:—40 in the Melbourne Hospital; 4 in the Benevolent Asylum; 13 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum; 3 in the Immigrants' Home; 7 in the Industrial Schools; 1 in the Melbourne Gaol; 1 in the Collingwood Stockade, and 1 in the Hulk Success.

The children dying under five years of age during the month numbered 241; of these 137, or 57 per cent., were males, and 104, or 43 per cent., were females; 135 were under one year of age, 53 were between one and two years, 23 were between two and three, 17 were between three and four, 13 were between four and five.

Of the 158 persons whose deaths occurred at a more advanced age than five years, 84, or nearly 53 per cent, were males, and 74, or about 47 per cent, were females; 14 were between five and ten, 7 were between ten and fifteen, 4 were between fifteen and twenty, 7 were between twenty and twenty-five, 21 were between twenty-five and firty, 12 were between thirty-five and forty, 16 were between forty and forty, 12 were between fifty-five, 21 were between sixty and fifty-five and fifty-five and sixty, 11 were between sixty and sixty-five, 9 were between sixty-five and seventy, 4 were between seventy and seventy-five, 1 was seventy-five and upwards, and of 1 adult female the age was not specified.
