The Board has been constituted to afford advice and information to intending exhibitors.

The Victoria collection must be ready to be shipped by the *Great Britain*, to sail on the 10th of March next. It is therefore necessary that those who propose to avail themselves of this mode of giving publicity to their undertakings should at once prepare the objects they mean to send, and deliver them at the Exhibition Building on or before the 1st of March, well packed in suitable cases.

The funds at the disposal of the Board are very limited. The chief assistance which they can offer must be in the form of advice, founded on the experience derived from former undertakings of a similar kind. They will, however, forward to Dublin, free of cost, all such manufactures and products delivered to them at Melbourne as may be considered to possess sufficient merit to be worthy of a place in the Exhibition.

The Board having no executive agency in Dublin, will take charge of such articles only as are intended for permanent exhibition there, or as may be consigned to the friends or agents of the exhibitors.

The Board will not undertake to return goods to Victoria, but will, as far as is in their power, carry out the views of the exhibitors as to the ultimate disposal of them.

## THE BOROUGH OF RAYWOOD.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the third day of January, 1865.

PRESENT:

**W**HEREAS by *The Municipal Corporations Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted that any district not being a district wholly or in part comprised within the limits of the city of Melbourne, or, save as therein provided, the town of Geelong, or of any of the boroughs constituted by or under the said Act, which district shall not exceed in area nine square miles, and shall have no one point in such area distant more than six miles from any other point therein, and shall contain a population of inhabitant householders not less than three hundred, may be constituted a borough in manner next hereinafter mentioned; and it is also enacted that if not less than one hundred and fifty of the inhabitant householders resident within any such last-mentioned district shall sign and cause to be presented to the Governor a petition, praying him to constitute such district a borough under the said Act, and in such petition shall set forth accurately the boundaries of the district to which such petition shall refer, and if within one month of the publication as thereinafter mentioned of such petition, an equal or greater number of inhabitant householders resident within such district so described shall not have signed and caused to be presented to the Governor a petition praying him not to grant the prayer of such first-mentioned petition, it shall be lawful for the Governor, by an Order in Council, if it shall seem fit, to constitute such district, or any portion thereof, a borough within the meaning of the said Act; and it is further enacted that in every such Order in Council as aforesaid the name and boundaries of the borough thereby constituted shall be set forth, and upon the making of every such order the district therein named shall be and be deemed to be a "borough" thereinafter sometimes called a "proclaimed borough" within the meaning of the said Act; provided that such district shall not comprise any locality not included within the boundaries set forth in the petition for the constitution thereof: And whereas a petition in accordance with the provisions of the said Act has been presented to the Governor by inhabitant householders resident at Raywood and the vicinity, and notice of such petition has been duly given in the *Government Gazette* of the second day of December, 1864: And whereas no petition in opposition to the first-mentioned petition has been received: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, in exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act, constitute the district hereinafter described a borough within the meaning of the said Act, and doth set forth the name and the boundaries of the said borough in manner following, that is to say:—

**THE BOROUGH OF RAYWOOD.**—Five thousand seven hundred and sixty acres, or nine square miles: Commencing at the north-western angle; thence north 46° east one hundred and eighty chains; thence south 44° east three hundred and twenty chains; thence south 46° west one hundred and eighty chains; thence north 44° west three hundred and twenty chains to the commencing point aforesaid. The block is connected with the north-east angle of allotment 3, section 23, parish of Yarraberr, county unnamed, in the following manner:—Commencing at the said north-east angle; thence south 55° 35' west seventy-eight chains to the north-western angle of the proposed municipal area; bearings magnetic.

And the Honorable James McCulloch, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

STATUTE, 1864, EXTENDED TO CERTAIN BO-  
ROUGHS.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed  
in the session held in the twenty-seventh year of Her  
Majesty's reign (No. 225), called *The Police Offences Statute*,  
1864, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in  
Council may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend  
all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the  
said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and  
may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place,  
and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such Pro-  
clamation; and upon any such Proclamation the provisions so  
proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town,  
district, or place: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling,  
the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive  
Council, by this my Proclamation extend the provisions con-  
tained in sections V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X. of Part I.  
of the said Statute to the Boroughs hereinafter mentioned,  
that is to say:—

The Borough of Echuca.  
The Borough of Taradale.  
The Borough of Tarnagulla.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight  
Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath,  
Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of  
Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act*, 1862, it is amongst other  
things enacted, that when any Crown land remains  
unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon  
or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles  
of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within  
any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has  
been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such  
land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a  
town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case  
may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council  
may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any com-  
mon proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act:  
Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of  
Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby  
increase, alter, or abolish (as the case may be) the commons  
hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the above-recited  
provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

SANDFORD TOWN COMMON, described in a Proclamation  
bearing date the 18th day of February, 1861, is hereby abolished,  
and in lieu thereof the land hereafter described shall be and  
constitute the Town Common of Sandford, viz.:—Two hundred  
and twenty-three acres three roods ten perches, being allotments  
1 and 2 of section J, and a portion of land adjoining allotment  
2 on the west, in the county of Dundas, parish of Casterton:  
Commencing at a point on the Wannoo River, being the north-  
west angle of allotment 3 of section J; bounded on the south-  
east by that allotment, bearing N. 45° E. seventeen chains;  
thence by a road bearing N. 18° W. thirty-seven chains fifty-  
seven links and N. 48° 31' W. forty-four chains sixty-six links  
on the west by part of the east boundary of the township of  
Sandford, bearing S. 0° 35' E. fifty-seven chains, more or less;  
thence by part of the south boundary of the said township,  
bearing westerly seven chains, more or less, to the beforemen-  
tioned river; and thence by the said river, bearing south-easterly  
to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited  
at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(64 J. 9474.)

THE UNITED GOLD FIELDS COMMON OF LINTON'S, BROWN'S,  
SPRINGDALLAH, HAPPY VALLEY, LUCKY WOMAN'S, AND  
ITALIAN GULLY (the component parts of which are referred to  
and united by a Proclamation bearing even date herewith), shall  
be and the same is hereby increased by adding thereto the land  
herein described, comprising 8000 acres, more or less, viz.: Com-  
mencing at a point on the Woody Yaloak or Smythe's Creek  
where it is intersected by the south boundary line of the Mop-  
pianimum pre-emptive right; thence by that line east one  
hundred and sixteen chains, more or less, to the west boundary  
line of the Gold Fields Common for Italian Gully; thence by  
that line south to the Ilbarook Creek; thence by that creek  
westerly and southerly to the north-east angle of the Mindai  
pre-emptive right; thence west to a point on the Woody Yaloak  
or Smythe's Creek, being the north-west angle of allotment 34  
in the parish of Mindai; thence by the said creek northerly to

the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at  
the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. Deducting from the above-  
described area all sold or otherwise legally appropriated land.—

**PETITION UNDER "THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1863."**

**PROPOSED MURRAY AND GOULBOURNE ROAD DISTRICT.**

**A**PETITION has been presented to the Governor, signed by fifteen inhabitants of the portion of the Murray District situated on the eastern side of the River Goulbourne and to the south of the Murray, wherein the petitioners state that they are holders of rateable property within the area hereafter described; that it contains upwards of 2000 square miles, and rateable property of a net annual value of upwards of £5000 per annum; and that it forms at present no portion of any road district.

They therefore pray that such area may be proclaimed a Road District under the name of "The Murray and Goulbourne Road District," which they describe as follows:— "Commencing at the junction of the Goulbourne and the Murray, following the south bank of the Murray easterly as far as the point at which it is joined by the eastern boundary of the station called 'Cobram'; thence by a straight line due south to the Broken River; thence following the north bank of the Broken River westerly to Shepparton; and thence by the east bank of the Goulbourne to the starting point at its junction with the Murray."

The Governor has been pleased to order that the said petition be taken into consideration by his Executive Council on Monday, the 27th day of February next ensuing.

Printed forms of tender may be obtained from the Government Storekeeper, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at each station, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

The tenders for each station will be accepted or rejected separately.

Tenders may be for either of the supplies required, oats, bran, hay, or straw only; and if all be included in one tender, it will be accepted for one article only, if advisable.

Tenderers may offer for the manure at each station at per cwt.; manure to be removed as may be arranged with the officer in charge, and the value of the manure will be deducted from the account for forage.

As much forage as the storage will accommodate will be drawn at a time for the convenience of contractors.

The price must be per ton for hay and straw, and per bushel of 40 lbs. for oats, 20 lbs. for bran, and 54 lbs. for maize, including delivery at the stations and all charges; bags to be returned when empty.

The net weight only after deducting the tare is to be charged.

The names and addresses of the tenderers and of their proposed sureties must be stated at full length.

All tenders must be enclosed in a separate envelope, marked "Tender for ——" (as the case may be), and deposited in the box at the Government Stores, King street; or if sent by post they must be addressed to the Government Storekeeper, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice and by letter to accepted tenderers.

#### CONDITIONS.

1. The hay to be eaten, good, sound, and sweet; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (colonial grown) and bran and maize to be sound and sweet and of the best description.

2. The supplies to be delivered on the requisition of the officer in charge of the district or station, the quantities stated in schedule being, however, only approximative, and it must be understood that the Government will draw either more or less than stated. The excess over the estimate will not, however, exceed during the whole year 50 per cent. of the estimated quarterly consumption.

3. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by any contracts made by the military commissariat.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by an invoice of quantity, showing the gross weight, the tare, and the net weight (this should be on the back of the requisition or order), which when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the District, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours from a reasonable time to be fixed on the order, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of a department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

8. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Government Storekeeper, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth of the monthly account, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. It will be competent for the Government Storekeeper on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving in writing a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice only can be given from the first day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th June, 1865.

AMENDED REGULATIONS FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF MANAGERS OF THE MALMSBURY BOROUGH COMMON.

WHEREAS it is deemed expedient by the Council of the Borough of Malmsbury, in exercise and execution of the powers given to them, to repeal Bye-law No. 5, and to make other regulations respecting the election of Managers for the Malmsbury Borough Common: Be it therefore ordered and directed that Bye-law No. 5 shall be and the same is hereby repealed, and that the following regulations be substituted:—

The foregoing regulations, passed by the Council of the Borough of Malmsbury, the 9th day of November, 1864, have not been disallowed by the Governor in Council.
