THE ROYAL ASSENT TO "THE MARRIAGE AND MATRIMONIAL CAUSES STATUTE 1864."

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Constitution Statute* it is amongst other things enacted that the provisions of the Act of the fourteenth year of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-nine, and of the Act of the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy-six, *For the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land*, which relate to the giving and withholding of Her Majesty's assent to Bills, and the reservation of Bills for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon, and the instructions to be conveyed to governors for their guidance in relation to the matters aforesaid, and the disallowance of Bills by Her Majesty, shall apply to Bills to be passed by the Legislative Council and Assembly constituted under the *Constitution Act of Victoria* and the now-revoking Statute, and by any other legislative body or bodies which may at any time hereafter be substituted for the present Legislative Council and Assembly: And whereas the Bill hereinafter mentioned was reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon: And whereas by an Order of the Queen in Council, made on the thirtieth day of November, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, a copy whereof is hereto appended, Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the said Bill: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, in pursuance of the provisions of the aforesaid Acts, do by this my Proclamation signify that the Bill intitled *An Act to consolidate the Laws relating to Marriage and to Deserted Wives and Children and to Divorce and Matrimonial Causes*, which was reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon upon the second day of June, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this thirteenth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, and in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

At the Court at Windsor, the thirtieth day of November, 1864.

PRESENT:

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty's reign, entitled *An Act for the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land*, it is amongst other things enacted that no Bill which shall be reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon shall have any force or authority within the colony of New South Wales until the Governor of the said colony shall signify, either by speech or

message to the Legislative Council of the said colony or by proclamation as therein aforesaid, that such Bill has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same: And whereas by another Act passed in the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, entitled, *An Act for the better Government of Her Majesty's Australian Colonies*, it was provided, among other things, that the provisions of the said former Act, concerning the reservation of Bills for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon, should apply to and be in force in the colony of Victoria: And whereas the said provisions were maintained in force as regards Bills passed by the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of the said colony by a subsequent Act passed in the eighteenth and nineteenth years of the reign of Her said Majesty, entitled, *An Act to enable Her Majesty to assent to a Bill as amended of the Legislature of Victoria to establish a Constitution in and for the Colony of Victoria*: And whereas the Governor of the said colony of Victoria reserved a certain Bill passed by the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of the said colony, entitled, *An Act to consolidate the Laws relating to Marriage and to Deserted Wives and Children and to Divorce and Matrimonial Causes*, for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon: And whereas the said Bill so reserved as aforesaid has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and it is expedient that the said Bill should be assented to by Her Majesty: Now therefore Her Majesty, in pursuance of the said Acts, and in exercise of the powers thereby reserved to Her Majesty as aforesaid, doth by this present Order, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, declare Her assent to the said Bill.

And the Right Honorable Edward Cardwell, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

THE SHIRE OF BARRABOOL.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that if at any time in any district, whether single or united, which shall contain an area of not less than one hundred square miles, the total amount actually paid in respect of the general rate then last made shall have amounted to One thousand pounds, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to proclaim, if it shall seem fit, such district, by such name as in and by such Order in Council may be assigned thereto, to be a shire within the meaning of the said Act, and such district shall thereupon be and be called such shire accordingly; and no district, after the proclamation thereof as such shire, save as therein provided with regard to the adjustment of boundaries to those of electoral districts, shall be united with any other shire or district, or with any borough or municipal district: And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-fourth day of December, 1863, a Road District was proclaimed under the designation of "The Barrabool Road District": And whereas by another Proclamation bearing date the twenty-ninth day of June, 1865, the boundaries of the said Road District were altered and defined as therein mentioned: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made on the 23rd day of January, 1865, the said Road District was divided into three electoral subdivisions: And whereas the area of the said district and the amount of the last general rate therein are not less than the area and amount in the said Act mentioned, and it seemed fit to make an Order in Council this day to proclaim the said district to be a shire accordingly: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the district heretofore proclaimed and called the Barrabool Road District to be a shire within the meaning of the said Act, by the name in and by such Order in Council assigned thereto, that is to say:—

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the commons hereinafter mentioned, in

accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, that is to say:—
