The Board has been constituted to afford advice and information to intending exhibitors.

The Victoria collection must be ready to be shipped by the *Great Britain*, to sail on the 10th of March next. It is therefore necessary that those who propose to avail themselves of this mode of giving publicity to their undertakings should at once prepare the objects they mean to send, and deliver them at the Exhibition Building on or before the 1st of March, well packed in suitable cases.

The funds at the disposal of the Board are very limited. The chief assistance which they can offer must be in the form of advice, founded on the experience derived from former undertakings of a similar kind. They will, however, forward to Dublin, free of cost, all such manufactures and products delivered to them at Melbourne as may be considered to possess sufficient merit to be worthy of a place in the Exhibition.

The Board having no executive agency in Dublin, will take charge of such articles only as are intended for permanent exhibition there, or as may be assigned to the friends or agents of the exhibitors.

The Board will not undertake to return goods to Victoria, but will, as far as is in their power, carry out the views of the exhibitors as to the ultimate disposal of them.

ARARAT MINING DISTRICT.

BYE-LAW (No. 5) TO REGULATE THE APPOINTMENT OF MANAGERS FOR THE UNITED BOROUGH AND GOLD FIELDS COMMON OF ARARAT.—[10th January, 1865.]

AT a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Ararat, begun and holden at the Mining Board Room, Ararat, in the said district, on the tenth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

1. Three managers of the United Borough and Gold Fields Common of Ararat within this mining district shall be elected by the mining board in the month of January each year, excepting the present year, when the election shall take place as soon as the board can arrange the same after this bye-law becomes law.

2. Any person recommended to nomination by at least (20) twenty holders of miners' rights or business licenses shall be eligible for election as manager of said common, but such candidate must at his election be proposed and seconded by members of the board.

3. When such election takes place, if more than three candidates are proposed as managers for said common, a ballot shall be taken of the members of the board present, and those three who obtain the greatest number of votes shall be declared by the chairman duly elected as managers of the common for the ensuing year. The chairman shall not vote unless two or more candidates have an equality of votes, in which case he shall have a casting vote.

4. Notice shall be given by advertisement in some newspaper circulated in the district at least fourteen days prior to the date of election of the intention of the board to elect managers, which notice shall also state the day of election, and all recommendations of candidates must be sent in to the chairman of the mining board previous to such day.

5. In case a sufficient number of written recommendations of candidates is not sent in, or in case some of such recommendations are determined objectionable, the members of the board shall then elect such managers as they may think desirable.

6. When a vacancy occurs in the office of manager, the board shall as soon as convenient proceed to fill such vacancy in accordance with the provisions of this bye-law.

The undersigned members of the said mining board concurred in making the foregoing bye-law.

Printed forms of tender may be obtained from the Government Storekeeper, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at each station, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

2. The supplies to be delivered on the requisition of the officer in charge of the district or station, the quantities stated in schedule being, however, only approximative, and it must be understood that the Government will draw either more or less than stated. The excess over the estimate will not, however, exceed during the whole year 50 per cent. of the estimated quarterly consumption.

3. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by any contracts made by the military commissariat.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by an invoice of quantity, showing the gross weight, the tare, and the net weight (this should be on the back of the requisition or order), which when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the District, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours from a reasonable time to be fixed on the order, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of a department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.
