The Board has been constituted to afford advice and information to intending exhibitors.

The Victoria collection must be ready to be shipped by the *Great Britain*, to sail on the 10th of March next. It is therefore necessary that those who propose to avail themselves of this mode of giving publicity to their undertakings should at once prepare the objects they mean to send, and deliver them at the Exhibition Building on or before the 1st of March, well packed in suitable cases.

The funds at the disposal of the Board are very limited. The chief assistance which they can offer must be in the form of advice, founded on the experience derived from former undertakings of a similar kind. They will, however, forward to Dublin, free of cost, all such manufactures and products delivered to them at Melbourne as may be considered to possess sufficient merit to be worthy of a place in the Exhibition.

The Board having no executive agency in Dublin, will take charge of such articles only as are intended for permanent exhibition there, or as may be consigned to the friends or agents of the exhibitors.

The Board will not undertake to return goods to Victoria, but will, as far as is in their power, carry out the views of the exhibitors as to the ultimate disposal of them.

THE SHIRE OF TULLAROOP.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency **SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING**, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that if at any time in any district, whether single or united, which shall contain an area of not less than one hundred square miles the total amount actually paid in respect of the general rate then last made shall have amounted to One thousand pounds; it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to proclaim, if it shall seem fit, such district, by such name as in and by such Order in Council may be assigned thereto, to be a shire within the meaning of the said Act, and such district shall thereupon be and be called such shire accordingly; and no district, after the proclamation thereof as such shire, save as therein provided with regard to the adjustment of boundaries to those of electoral districts, shall be united with any other shire or district, or with any borough or municipal district: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the fourteenth day of January, 1861, a Road District was proclaimed under the designation of "The Tullaroop Road District": And whereas by another Proclamation bearing date the thirty-first day of August, 1863, the said Road District was, amongst others, altered, as therein mentioned: And whereas the area of the said district and the amount of the last general rate therein are not less than the area and amount in the said Act mentioned, and it seemed fit to make an Order in Council this day to proclaim the said district to be a shire accordingly: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the district heretofore proclaimed and called the Tullaroop Road District to be a shire within the meaning of the said Act, by the name in and by such Order in Council assigned thereto, that is to say:-

THE SHIRE OF TULLAROOP.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this ninth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, and in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.

COMMON-TOLL ROAD.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency **SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING**, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS the Council of the Shire of Warrnambool has complained to the Governor in Council that it ought, by reason of the traffic passing along the road hereinafter mentioned being common to its own district with the district in which tolls are payable upon such road, to have a share of such tolls in the manner provided in the 25th clause of *The Local Government Act, 1863*: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the road hereinafter mentioned to be a Common-toll road, for the purposes and within the meaning of the provisions of the said Act relating to Common-toll roads, viz.:-

The portion of the Ararat to South-western sea-board road extending from Youl's Creek to Woolsthorpe, and thence in two branches, one leading towards the Borough of Belfast and one towards the Borough of Warrnambool, for a distance of

one mile on each branch road from the junction, shall be a Common-toll road of the respective Shires of Belfast and Warrnambool.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this sixteenth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, and in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that in every district divided into subdivisions the Governor in Council shall, within fifteen days after any subdivision of such district shall become such subdivision, appoint in and for such subdivision one place to be the place of polling at all elections held in and for such subdivision, and may from time to time afterwards appoint in lieu thereof another such place within such subdivision; and it is further enacted that every shire shall after the proclamation thereof as such be and be deemed to be and have been such and the same district as such shire was at the time of such proclamation, and save as aforesaid and save where herein otherwise expressly provided all the provisions of the said Act relating to districts shall continue to be of full force and effect with regard to such shire, and be read accordingly: And whereas by two several Orders in Council bearing even date herewith the shires of Avoca and Mount Rouse were respectively subdivided as therein mentioned; and it is expedient to appoint a polling place for each subdivision: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order appoint the places hereinafter mentioned to be the polling places for the subdivisions of the shires aforesaid opposite to which respectively such polling places are mentioned, viz:—

THE SOUTH RIDING—Commencing at a point on the northern boundary of the shire of Lexton where it is intersected by the main dividing range of the Pyrenees; thence northerly by the said range to a point due west of the north-east angle of the borough of Avoca; thence by a line due east to the western boundary of the Tullaroop Road District; thence south by the western boundary of said road district to the north-west angle of the town reserve, parish of Bung Bong; thence east by the north boundary of said reserve to a point in the centre of McNeil's Creek; thence southerly by the centre of McNeil's Creek to the northern boundary of Hodgkinson's pre-emptive right; thence west to the north-west angle of said pre-emptive right; thence by the northern boundary of the shire of Lexton westerly to the commencing point.

THE NORTH RIDING—Commencing at a point on the Main Dividing Range due west of the north-east angle of the borough of Avoca; thence by the Main Dividing Range northerly to the south boundary of the shire of St. Arnaud; thence easterly by the said south boundary to the south-east angle of that shire at Nattie Yallock; thence easterly by the south boundary of the Dunolly mining division to a point in the west boundary of the parish of Wareek, being six miles and a half, more or less, from the south-east angle of Nattie Yallock; thence south by the west boundary of the parish of Wareek and part of the west boundary of the parish of Bung Bong to a point in the said west boundary due east of the north-east angle of the borough of Avoca; thence west to the said north-east angle; thence further westerly by a direct line to the commencing point.

THE WEST RIDING—Commencing at a point on the west boundary of the township reserve of Navarre where it is intersected by the Main Road; thence by a line due south to a point due west of the south boundary of the township reserve of Crowlands; thence easterly by part of the Ararat shire's northern boundary and part of the northern boundary of the shire of Lexton to the intersection of the main range of the Pyrenees; thence northerly by said range to the southern boundary of the shire of St. Arnaud; thence by a direct line westerly to the commencing point.

separate electoral subdivisions in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by the names hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, and doth hereby set forth the boundaries of the said several subdivisions in manner following, that is to say:—

THE KINGOWER RIDING—Commencing at the south-east angle of the Inglewood Gold Fields Common; thence west along the south boundary to the south-west angle of said common; thence north by the west boundary to the intersection of the northern boundary of the Brenannah Run; thence westerly by the northern boundary of Brenannah Run and the boundaries of the Spring Hill and Avoca Forest Runs to the centre of the Avoca River; thence southerly by the centre of that river to the northern boundary of the Dunolly mining division; thence easterly along that boundary to the centre of the River Loddon; thence northerly by that river to the commencing point.

THE PENSHURST RIDING—Commencing at a point where the shire boundary on the south joins Muston's Creek; thence by Muston's Creek northerly to the three-chain road leading from Chatsworth to Hamilton; thence by the said three-chain road to Lake Linlithgow; thence by a line bearing west to the boundary of the shire; and thence by the shire boundary southerly and easterly to the commencing point.

THE DUNKELD RIDING—Commencing at a point where the three-chain road from Chatsworth to Hamilton crosses Muston's Creek; thence by Muston's Creek and southern

1. The hay to be eaten, good, sound, and sweet; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (colonial grown) and bran and maize to be sound and sweet and of the best description.

2. The supplies to be delivered on the requisition of the officer in charge of the district or station, the quantities stated in schedule being, however, only approximative, and it must be understood that the Government will draw either more or less than stated. The excess over the estimate will not, however, exceed during the whole year 50 per cent. of the estimated quarterly consumption.

3. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by any contracts made by the military commissariat.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by an invoice of quantity, showing the gross weight, the tare, and the net weight (this should be on the back of the requisition or order), which when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the District, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours from a reasonable time to be fixed on the order, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of a department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

8. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Government Storekeeper, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth of the monthly account, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11.
