UNITED COMMON.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight
Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath,
Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of
Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862*, it is amongst other things enacted that where there are two or more neighboring commons the Governor in Council may proclaim that the same shall be a common under the name of "The United Town and Gold Field [or, as the case may be] Common of" for the benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on either: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the neighboring commons hereinafter mentioned to be a United Common, under the following name, that is to say:—

THE UNITED BOROUGH AND FARMERS' COMMON OF KYNETON, LANGLEY, BAYNTON, AND GLENHOPE, comprising the Town Common for Kyneton (described in a Proclamation bearing date the 18th of February, 1861), the Farmers' Common on the north side of Kyneton and east of the Campaspe River (described in a Proclamation bearing date the 5th of June, 1862), and the Kyneton Municipal Common (described in a Proclamation bearing date the 22nd of September, 1862); and the said United Common shall be for the benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on any of the above-mentioned commons.—(65.K.3293.)

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twelfth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, and in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.

JURY LIST TO BE PREPARED FOR THE NEW COURT TOWN DISTRICT OF ECHUCA.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the tenth day of July, 1865.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-eighth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, numbered 272, and intitled, *An Act to amend the Law for regulating Juries*, it is amongst other things enacted, that in case any assizes, or any county court or court of general sessions of the peace, shall hereafter be lawfully directed or appointed to be holden at any town other than those at which the same are now holden, the clerk of petty sessions at such court town, and the clerk of petty sessions at every other town or place within the jury district of such court town, and all justices, constables, officers of police, and sheriffs, shall, within such time as the Governor in Council shall order for that occasion only, do and perform all such acts, matters, and things in and towards preparing, collecting, allowing, sending, and delivering the lists of men qualified and liable to serve as in the said

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Act are aforesaid, and making out the jury books for every such jury district as are thereinbefore required to be ordinarily done at a different time or period; and all such last-mentioned jury books shall be brought into use, and the persons whose names shall be therein set down shall be liable to serve immediately after the same shall have been made out by the sheriff; and the said last-mentioned books shall be used until new books shall have been prepared under the provisions thereinbefore contained: And whereas by an Order in Council made on the third day of July instant, it was ordered that a county court should be holden at Echuca, the same being a place at which a county court has not previously been holden: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that a jury list shall be prepared for the new court town district of Echuca, and that the several acts required by law be done within the times hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

The Clerk of Petty Sessions at Echuca shall issue his warrant to prepare and make out the jury list for the jury district of Echuca, on or before Wednesday, the nineteenth day of July instant; such list shall be prepared forthwith, and the notice prescribed by the ninth section of the said Act shall be affixed, as provided by that Act, on Sunday, the sixth and thirteenth days of August next ensuing; the court of petty sessions at Echuca aforesaid shall revise such list on Tuesday, the twenty-second day of August aforesaid; such list shall be sent to the sheriff on or before Thursday, the twenty-fourth day of August; and the jury-book shall be prepared and brought into use on or before Friday, the first day of September, in the present year.

And the Honorable Archibald Michie, Her Majesty's Minister of Justice for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

SCHEDULE B.

Referred to in this Order.

Manner in which the streets, courts, and alleys enumerated in Schedule A, referred to in this order, are ordered to be freed from obstruction, paved, kerbed, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewered.

The natural soil is to be reduced or made up, as the case may require, so that the longitudinal section of the whole street, court, or alley, shall in no part have an inclination of less than one (1) in eighty (80), and, where practicable, the entire length is to form one incline.

In laying on any stuff, it is to be spread in layers of not more than one foot thick.

The transverse section of the street, court, or alley (where the water-channels are on the sides), is to show a roadway whose crown shall be one inch above the kerbs of the footways, and the fall from the crown to the water-channels shall not be less than one (1) in twenty-five (25).

Each street, court, or alley shall have a bluestone pitched water-channel, either at each of its sides or in its centre, of sufficient capacity to meet the required drainage for the same, the width of said channel or channels in no instance to be less than two (2) feet.

The pitchers to be nine (9) inches wide, and from six (6) to nine (9) inches deep, and from nine (9) to fourteen (14) inches long, with upright sides, set in sand, and well rammed down to such section as the city surveyor may direct.

The bottom of the channel is to be seven (7) inches below the kerbstones of footpaths.

On either side of the roadway there is to be, where practicable, a footpath not more than three (3) feet wide, and these are to be separated from the roadway by a neatly dressed bluestone kerb from two (2) to four (4) feet long, six (6) inches wide, and fifteen (15) inches deep.

The footways are to be covered with a coat of gravel three (3) inches thick, and the surface is to fall towards the channel at the rate of one (1) in ten (10).

The roadway is to be covered with a coat of clean bluestone metal, 24-inch gauge, nine (9) inches deep in the centre, and six (6) inches deep on the sides, and, this, when necessary, covered over with a coat of good loam two (2) inches thick, and rolled with corporation iron roller.
