RECEPTION IN BRITISH PORTS OF NORTH AMERICAN SHIPS OF WAR.

SIR,—With reference to my predecessor's Circular Despatch of the 1st of February, 1862, I have now the honor to transmit for your guidance a copy of letter from Earl Russell [11th May, 1865] stating that Her Majesty's Government have determined no longer to enforce certain orders there referred to, and set forth in his Lordship's previous letter of the 31st of January, 1862, relating to the reception in British Ports of ships of war belonging to either of the parties to the civil war in North America.

You will not fail to guide yourself in conformity with this decision.

Earl Russell to Mr. Cardwell.

Foreign Office, 11th May, 1865.

SIR,—I have the honor to acquaint you that, in the existing state of the civil war in America and the uncertainty which may be felt as to its continuance, it appears to Her Majesty's Government that the time has arrived for ceasing to enforce so much of the Orders which, in pursuance of my letter of the 31st of January, 1862, were issued by the several Departments of Her Majesty's Government, as empowered the authorities of any port belonging to Her Majesty, either in the United Kingdom or in the Channel Islands, or in any of Her Majesty's colonies, or foreign possessions or dependencies, to require any ship of war or privateer of either-belligerent which might enter any port, roadstead or waters belonging to Her Majesty, in order to obtain provisions or things necessary for the subsistence of her crew, or to effect repairs, to put to sea as soon as possible after the expiration of a period of twenty-four hours, without permitting her to take in supplies beyond what might be necessary for her immediate use; and not to suffer any such vessel as might have been allowed to remain within British waters for the purpose of repair, to continue in any port, roadstead or waters belonging to Her Majesty, for a longer period than twenty-four hours after her necessary repairs should have been

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completed, and also so much of the same orders as limited the quantity of coal and the period within which it might be obtained, to be embarked on board any such ship of war or privateer of either belligerent.

I have addressed a similar letter to the Secretaries of State for the Home, War, and India Departments, to the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and to the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty.

REGISTRAR GENERAL'S REPORT ON THE VITAL STATISTICS OF MELBOURNE AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF JUNE, AND FOR THE QUARTER ENDING 30TH JUNE, 1865.

ACTUAL Daily Mortality of persons of both sexes under and over five years of age in the Statistical District of Melbourne and suburbs, embracing a radius of ten miles, and including the Statistical Sub-districts of Melbourne Proper, East Melbourne, North Melbourne and Carlton, Fitz Roy Municipality, East Collingwood, Richmond, Jika-jika parish (exclusive of North Melbourne, Collingwood, and Richmond), South Yarra and Prahran, Emerald Hill and Sandridge, St. Kilda and Brighton, Doutta Galla and Kellor, Boroondara and Heidelberg, Cut-paw-paw parish, and the shipping in Hobson's Bay; also, the temperature in the shade at Melbourne, deduced from the mean of twenty-four hourly observations taken at the Melbourne Observatory on each day during the month of June, 1865:—

The mortality of Melbourne and suburbs during June showed a marked improvement upon that in the previous month. The deaths numbered only 264, against 405 in May. The mortality, however, was a trifle above the average of June in previous years, whereas the mean temperature was somewhat below the average.

Fifty-eight per cent. of the deaths were of males and 42 per cent. of females; 43 per cent. were of children under and 52 per cent. of persons over five. Since November, 1864, this is the first month in which deaths of persons at the younger period have been fewer than those at the older. The same fact, however, usually obtains in the cool months of the year. In June, 1864, 45 per cent. of the deaths were of children under five, against 31 per cent., 43 per cent., 51 per cent., and 49 per cent. in the same month of the four previous years respectively.

The days of highest mortality were the 5th, 14th, and 13th, on which respectively 19, 16, and 15 deaths occurred. Those of the lowest were the 11th, 24th, and 29th, on each of which the occurrence of only 4 deaths was reported.

Deaths of old people were rather numerous during the month, and include a male of 76 of phthisis, one of 80 of old age, another of 84 of pneumonia, a female of 76 of bronchitis, and one of 77 of nephria.

Fourteen deaths from violence took place during the month, of which the following are the particulars:—A blacksmith aged 51 died of compound fracture of the leg, a laborer aged 45 and a contractor aged 41 of injuries to the spine, a drayman aged 35 of injuries caused by a wheel passing over his head, a carter aged 26 of laceration of the calf of the leg, a baker's apprentice aged 17

in consequence of being passed over by a cart, a male aged 7 of a fractured skull. A child aged 2 died of scalds. Three infants, aged respectively 14, 16, and 43 weeks, were accidentally suffocated, one of them stated to be by overlying, the particulars of the others not mentioned. A newly-born baby was found in the University reserve, and is supposed to have been strangled; a female aged 39 committed suicide by cutting her throat; a laborer aged 28 hanged himself in the Melbourne Gaol.

Seventy-nine deaths, or nearly 28 per cent. of the whole, occurred in public institutions, as follow:—41 in the Melbourne Hospital, 4 in the Benevolent Asylum, 13 in the Yarra Bend and 1 in the Royal Park Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Lying-in Hospital, 6 in the Immigrants' Home, 9 in the Industrial Schools, and 2 in the Melbourne Gaol.

NOTE.—The Melbourne Hospital is in Melbourne Proper, the Benevolent Asylum in North Melbourne and Carlton, and the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum in Jika-jika parish (remainder of).

The number of deaths of children under five years of age was 138, of which 66, or rather more than 47 per cent., were of males, and 72, or slightly under 53 per cent., were of females; of those who died, 73 were under one year of age, 28 were between one and two years, 20 were between two and three, 7 were between three and four, and 10 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 149; of these, 99, or about 66 per cent., were males, and 50, or nearly 44 per cent., were females; 9 were between five and ten years, 2 were between ten and fifteen, 7 were between fifteen and twenty, 6 were between twenty and twenty-five, 12 were between twenty-five and thirty, 19 were between thirty and thirty-five, 20 were between thirty-five and forty, 20 were between forty and forty-five, 14 were between forty-five and fifty, 8 were between fifty and fifty-five, 14 were between fifty-five and sixty, 6 were between sixty and sixty-five, 4 were between sixty-five and seventy, 3 were between seventy and seventy-five, and 5 were seventy-five and upwards.

Deaths from zymotic diseases fell off from 115 in May to 67 in June. Of this class scarlatina and diphtheria caused 15 deaths in the latter month against 19 in the former; diarrhoea and dysentery caused 20 against 40; whooping-cough caused 17 deaths in both months. Deaths from constitutional diseases did not decrease in the same ratio as deaths from all causes, but occasioned 20 per cent. of the whole mortality, against 15 per cent. in May. Deaths from phthisis, a disease classed under the constitutional head, showed increased numbers, viz., 36, against 31 in May.

The number of deaths which occurred throughout the district of Melbourne and suburbs during the quarter terminating on the 30th June, 1865, was 1091, or 7·80 in every thousand of its inhabitants.

The deaths which took place in the various sub-districts were in the following proportions to their populations, as ascertained at the last census:—Melbourne Proper, 265 deaths, or 11·15 in a thousand; East Melbourne, 1 death, or ·49 in a thousand; North Melbourne and Carlton, 191 deaths, or 11·39 in a thousand; Fitz Roy Municipality, 72 deaths, or 6·09 in a thousand; East Collingwood, 95 deaths, or 7·51 in a thousand; Richmond, 68 deaths, or 5·99 in a thousand; Jika-jika parish (remainder of), 77 deaths, or 9·37 in a thousand; South Yarra and Prahran, 81 deaths, or 6·23 in a thousand; Emerald Hill and Sandridge, 91 deaths, or 7·35 in a thousand; St. Kilda and Brighton, 53 deaths, or 4·71 in a thousand; Doutta Galla and Keilor, 17 deaths, or 5·51 in a thousand; Boroondara and Heidelberg, 37 deaths, or 6·46 in a thousand; Cut-paw-paw parish, 39 deaths, or 6·42 in a thousand; shipping in Hobson's Bay, 4 deaths, or 2·32 in a thousand.
