QUARANTINE OF THE STEAM-SHIP "LONDON."

SEVERAL cases of Small-pox having occurred on board of the steam-ship *London*, during the passage thereof from Plymouth: His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, in exercise of the power conferred by *The Public Health Statute 1865* (28 Victoria No. 264, § 90), made the following Order with respect to the said vessel, and also with respect to the persons and things on board of the same, viz. :—

That the said steam-ship *London*, and the passengers and crew on board of the same, be detained and kept for the performance of quarantine, at the Quarantine Station, until all quarantine measures deemed necessary and expedient shall have been carried out.

That the said ship be released from quarantine so soon as it shall have been cleansed and disinfected, together with such of the passengers and crew as shall have been vaccinated at the Sanatory Station.

That any of the passengers or crew refusing to be vaccinated shall be detained in quarantine until the operation of vaccination shall have been performed.

The limits and boundaries of the Quarantine Station and the Quarantine Anchorage are described in a Proclamation bearing date the 24th day of October, 1864, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the 1st of November, 1864.

All persons are hereby required to take notice accordingly.

With this view Sir William has obtained from Shiraz some of the best tobacco seed, and at his request I send you a packet of that seed for cultivation in the colony under your government.

TRANSMISSION OF GOLD IN LETTERS THROUGH THE POST OFFICE.

NOTICE TO THE PUBLIC.

WITH the view of affording facilities to persons resident on the gold fields and elsewhere, for transmitting by post to parts beyond the seas small quantities of gold without the necessity for entering such gold at any custom house, His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of gold being examined at the places mentioned below, subject to the following regulations, in accordance with the 235th clause of *The Customs Act 1857* :—

Receipt and Pay Offices.

REGULATIONS.

1. Duty will be received at any of the above Receipt and Pay Offices on small quantities of gold to be transmitted by post to parts beyond the seas. The quantity so forwarded may in no case exceed four ounces.

2. Persons desirous of availing themselves of this permission should present their gold, together with the letter or packet in which they intend to forward it, at a Receipt and Pay Office, and pay the amount of duty required.

3. As instructions have been given to the Receivers and Paymasters to seal and secure such packages containing the gold so to be transmitted, and to certify to the quantity, all persons must be careful to observe that these letters or packages must in no cases be re-opened, otherwise they will subject themselves to a penalty and render the gold liable to forfeiture.

AMENDING LAND ACT 1865.

Section 27.

NOTICE TO PASTORAL TENANTS AND HOLDERS OF LEASES OR LICENSES TO OCCUPY SITES FOR INNS, STORES, FACTORIES, MILLS, ABATTOIRS, LIME-KILNS, BRICK-KILNS, FERRIES, OR OTHER PURPOSES.
