SIR,—I have the honor of informing you that I have this day received a letter from the Governor of the French establishment of Pondichery, requesting me to make it known to master mariners intending to visit that harbor, that from the 1st day of March, 1866, to the 1st of May, 1866, for the light of Pondichery's Lighthouse will be substituted a double light affixed to the Flagstaff Mast. This light will be visible at sea from a distance of 5 miles, and will be sufficient to show the anchorage. This momentary substitution is required for the repairs necessary to the lighthouse's fire.

ONE HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD.
