W HEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed
in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present
Majesty, called The Weights and Measures Statute 1864, it is
amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council
may at any time if he think fit, and shall at the request of not
less than half the councils or boards constituting any union
proclaimed under the said Act, dissolve the same by proclamation; And whereas the councils of the shires of Lexton and
Ballarat were proclaimed a union on the twenty-ninth day of
