AGENTS OF THE BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS EMPOWERED TO ENTER UPON ALLOTMENTS, ETC., OF DEFAULTING LESSEES.

To all to whom these Presents shall come, the Board of Land and Works send,

GREETING—

WHEREAS under and by virtue of the 12th and 13th sections of *The Amending Land Act 1865*, the Board of Land and Works have granted certain leases under their seal of certain allotments or subdivisions of allotments in certain agricultural areas, for the term of seven years, at the rent of two shillings per annum for each and every acre or fractional part of an acre of such allotments or subdivisions of allotments: And whereas it was provided in every such lease, and such lease was upon the condition, that in case the rent thereby reserved or any part thereof should not be paid in accordance with the covenant for payment thereinbefore contained, although no demand for payment should have been made; or if the lessee, his executors or administrators, should not before the end of the second year from the commencement of the term thereby created have made on the land thereby demised substantial and permanent improvements within the meaning of the said Act, certified in writing under the seal of the said board, or under the hands of arbitrators, or under the hand of an arbitrator appointed as provided by the Act, to be of the value of One pound for every acre and fractional part of an acre of the land demised; or if the lessee, his executors, administrators, or assigns, should not faithfully observe and perform all and every the covenants and conditions herein contained, and on his or their part to be observed and performed; it should be lawful for the said board to enter forthwith or at any time thereafter upon the land thereby demised and the same to repossess and enjoy and from thence-

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forth the said term thereby granted should absolutely cease and determine; and it was thereby agreed and declared that in any such case it should be lawful for the said board, and for any bailiff of Crown lands, or for any other agents or officers of the said board authorized in that behalf, without any demand whatsoever, to enter upon the land thereby demised, and the lessee, his executors or administrators, and all persons claiming under him or them for ever to expel and remove therefrom, without any legal process whatsoever and as effectually as any sheriff might do in case the said board had obtained judgment in ejectment for recovery of possession of the said land, and a writ of *habere facias possessionem* or other process had issued on such judgment directed to such sheriff in due form of law: And whereas the said board is desirous of appointing agents for the purpose of making an entry on any allotment or subdivision of an allotment so leased as aforesaid, in any case where a right to enter has arisen under any such lease: Now therefore the said board doth hereby appoint each of the persons whose names are set forth in the schedule to these presents to be an agent of the said board for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, and doth authorize and empower every and each of them jointly and severally in the name of the said board to enter upon all lands so granted and demised by the said board to any person whomsoever under and by virtue of *The Amending Land Act 1865*, and the lessee thereof, his executors, administrators, or assigns, and all persons claiming under him or them for ever to expel and remove therefrom, in any case where a right to enter the same has arisen under any such lease as aforesaid.

COMMONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold-fields common, or a town common respectively, as the case may be: And whereas by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or reproclaimed, and may from time to time reproclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim, alter, or abolish (as the case may be) the commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Acts, that is to say:—

CASTLE DONNINGTON TOWN COMMON.—The unappropriated Crown lands within the township of Castle Donnington (Swan Hill) are hereby proclaimed a Town Common, for the use of all householders of that township. Area five hundred and fifty acres, more or less.—(66.N.12018.)

PENSHURST TOWN COMMON.—The Town Common of Penshurst, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 12th day of February, 1866, and increased by another Proclamation dated 23rd April, 1866, is hereby abolished, and in lieu thereof the unappropriated Crown lands within the township of Penshurst are hereby proclaimed a Town Common, for the use of all householders of that township; area available for commonage two thousand and sixty-five acres, more or less.—(66.N.12358.)

WOODSTOCK AND TARNAGULLA FARMERS' COMMON.—The Woodstock and Tarnagulla Farmers' Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 4th day of March, 1861, and extended by a Proclamation bearing date 20th July, 1863, is hereby further extended by adding thereto allotments 2, 3, and 7, of section 2, in the parish of Woodstock; containing an area of two hundred and twenty acres.—(66.M.12064.)

BEECHWORTH MINING DISTRICT.

At a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Beechworth, begun and holden at Beechworth, in the said district, on the 6th day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

BYE-LAW No. 41.

No person shall interfere with, obstruct, or change the direction of any road or bridle track in general use, without having first constructed another road or track as efficient and available for public traffic as the one in use. This bye-law to apply to the Buckland and Omeo divisions only.

BYE-LAW No. 42.

The following shall be the public purposes to which the residue of fees paid in respect of depasturing on any gold-field common, after paying necessary incidental expenses, shall be applied, viz.:—To making improvements on the respective commons; aiding public schools, libraries, or charitable institutions, as the mining board shall direct.

BYE-LAW No. 43.—COMMONS.

That all and singular the rules and regulations for the management of gold-fields commons hitherto in force in the mining district of Beechworth are hereby annulled and repealed, and the following substituted in their stead, viz.:—

The general election by the mining board of three managers for each gold-field common in the mining district of Beechworth, shall take place on the third Wednesday in November in each year.

The holders of miners' rights or business licenses may recommend to the board, by memorial addressed to the chairman, three persons for election, as managers of the common on which they are entitled to depasture cattle. All such recommendations to be endorsed with the consent of the person recommended.

All candidates shall be nominated by members of the board. If not more than the required number be nominated they shall be declared elected; should more than the required number be nominated, the election shall be determined by ballot, and those three who obtain the greatest number of votes shall be declared elected.

The mining board may, at any meeting, fill up vacancies that may occur in the management of any common in the same manner as at general elections.

Ordinary and special licenses to depasture cattle on commons shall be granted under the hands of the managers, who shall not be entitled to demand fees for cattle depasturing until such cattle shall have been branded with the common brand, or a registry made of their other brands or distinguishing marks. All cattle depasturing on any common for which the fees due are not paid, may be dealt with as illegally depasturing.

No person shall be allowed to depasture cattle on any common unless such cattle shall be his or her own property.

No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the commons.

No entire horse or boar shall be allowed to depasture on the common, and no bull shall be allowed to depasture on the common except with the special permission of the managers.

The managers shall keep proper books of account, and for all fees received by them for cattle depasturing on the commons shall give a printed receipt in the form of the schedule hereto annexed, consecutively numbered, the butts of which must be kept for inspection by auditors.

All books of account, plans, or other documents relating to the management of the commons shall be the property of and be at the disposal of the mining board, except in cases where a gold field is united to a town or farmers' common, the books, &c., shall be the joint property of the bodies appointing the managers.

The following shall be the scale of fees for depasturing cattle on the commons, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance, except for goats, the fees for which shall be payable yearly in advance:—

Horses, mules, asses, foals, 6s. per head per annum.

Bullocks, cows, heifers, steers, calves, 3s. per head up to 20 head, and for all in excess of 20 head, 4s. per head per annum.

Goats, 8d. per head per annum.

Foals, calves, and kids under nine months old whose dams are legally depasturing on the commons to run free. All foals, calves, and kids otherwise depasturing shall be charged for.

Special licenses may be granted to butchers and others engaged in slaughtering on the following terms, viz.:—horned cattle, 3d. per head per week; sheep and swine, 3d. per head per week.

No goat shall be allowed to depasture on the Beechworth United Common unless it wear on its neck a triangle formed of three pieces of wood, each piece to be not less than thirty inches in length and one inch in breadth; and all goats found upon said common without such triangle shall be dealt with as illegally depasturing.

The managers shall appoint and from the fees collected pay a herdsman. They shall also get their accounts for each year, ending 31st October, audited by two competent persons to be approved of by the board, and shall publish the same in some local newspaper; and, on or before the 10th day of November following, shall transmit to the clerk of the board a certified balance-sheet, together with the amount of all unexpended fees.

BYE-LAW No. 44.—COMPENSATION, HOW AND WHEN MADE.

When any person shall desire to occupy any Crown lands for a mining purpose which is lawfully and *bona fide* used as a yard, garden, cultivated field, or orchard, or upon which any house, outhouse, shed, or other building, or any artificial dam or reservoir shall be standing, upon payment of compensation as hereinafter provided, and subject to the following conditions, he may do so in accordance with the provisions of these bye-laws.

Any person desiring to occupy for a mining purpose any such Crown land as hereinbefore mentioned, shall do so provisionally by fixing posts defining the area he desires to occupy as aforesaid, in the same manner as is prescribed for occupying claims or easements. If such person shall be prevented from fixing such posts by the person using such land as aforesaid, in such case it shall be sufficient if such person shall define the area aforesaid as near to the manner aforesaid as the circumstances will permit.

He shall register the provisional occupation of such land with the registrar within forty-eight hours of the time of fixing such posts, and shall at the same time deposit with the registrar the sum of five pounds as a guarantee for payment of any expenses, which may be incurred in determining the amount of compensation to be paid to the person lawfully using such land as aforesaid.

For the purpose of determining the amount of such compensation, the person or his agent using such land as aforesaid, and the person or his agent desiring to occupy such land for a mining purpose, shall each, upon the receipt of a written request from either, requesting him to appoint some person to act in his behalf as a valuator, appoint some person accordingly. If at the expiration of fourteen days from the date of the receipt of such written request either party shall have failed to appoint some person who will act in their behalf as a valuator, and who will determine the amount of compensation as aforesaid, within the seven days next ensuing, then a valuator who may have been appointed by either party shall be deemed to have been appointed by, and may act alone on behalf of both parties. When both parties appoint a valuator, and such valuator are unable to agree to the amount of compensation to be paid, it shall be competent for such valuator to appoint a third party whom they shall mutually agree to. The decision of any valuator acting alone for both parties, or the decision of a majority of three valutors appointed as herein ordained, as regards the amount of compensation to be paid to the person or his agent using such land as aforesaid by the person occupying it for a mining purpose, shall, in either case be final and conclusive to all intents and purposes whatsoever. When such valuator or valutors shall have ascertained the amount of compensation to be paid as aforesaid, they shall deliver their decision, in writing, in the following form:—

I, or we, the undersigned, having been duly appointed to ascertain and decide upon the amount of compensation to be paid by _____, prior to his occupying for a mining purpose that piece of Crown land lawfully used by _____, situated at _____, marked by posts, and measuring _____ more or less, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of bye-law _____, decide and award the amount of such compensation to be £ _____ s. d. (pounds shillings and pence).

Upon production to the registrar of a receipt certifying that the due amount of compensation has been paid to the person or his agent lawfully using such land by the person or his agent provisionally occupying it, the registrar shall register such receipt. Thereupon such person shall be deemed to be in lawful possession of such land for any mining purpose, and the registrar shall refund to such person his guarantee deposit; but if such person shall neglect or refuse to pay such compensation within fourteen days next ensuing the date of the award, then the sum deposited shall, on payment to the registrar of a fee of Two shillings and sixpence, be forfeited and paid by the registrar to the person or his agent lawfully using such land as aforesaid.

The undersigned members of said mining board concurred in making the foregoing bye-laws.

Tenderers must state the security proposed, whether in debentures, bank deposit-receipt, cash deposit, or sureties; if the latter, the certificate on the printed form of tender must be signed by two responsible persons willing to become bound in the sum specified for the due fulfilment of the contract, and the names of the tenderers and their proposed sureties, together with their respective addresses, must be stated at full length upon such certificate.

Tenders must be accompanied by bank notes, or a bank draft in favor of the Chairman of the Tender Board, for ten per cent. of the amount of security required, which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

The Government may elect to require a cash deposit; but any approved security must be completed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

All tenders must be enclosed in a separate envelope, marked "Tenders for —" (as the case may be), and be deposited in the Tender-box at the Government Stores, King street, or (if sent by post) must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Stores and Transport Office, Melbourne.

CONDITIONS.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and to be delivered in sound packages.

2. Bread. A sample of the best ordinarily retailed to the public will be considered as a test loaf for first quality. Second quality to be made of flour known in the trade as "best seconds," and the third quality (that issued for prisoners of the Crown) to be made of flour, the produce of prime wheat, from which twelve per cent. has been extracted in bran and waste.

3. Fresh meat is to be supplied in such proportions as may be required, and, when the quantity admits, to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately. When shins of beef form a portion of the supply, a fair proportion of the bone, not less than five inches, must have been cut off.

4. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department, either for delivery at the Stores and Transport Office, or at the office of the department concerned, as may be stated in the order.

5. The order issued by the head of department must accompany the goods, and the account is to be rendered simultaneously with delivery of the supplies. In other cases the account is to be rendered monthly. The rates quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

6. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order they will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the Contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a Board of Survey composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

8. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured by the person requiring it and the expense charged as in clause 6.

9. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the person to whom the rations are due, or to the contractor in waiting for a Board of Survey, the head of the department, or officer in charge of the station, will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report of the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

12. It will be competent for the Inspector of Stores, on behalf of the Government, or the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months, it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of the month.
