ACCOUNT OF THE MAIN ROAD CONSTRUCTION FUND.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, in accordance with the provisions of The Local Government Act, No. 176, section 224, directed that the several Shire Councils and District Road Boards receiving additional subsidy in respect of Works on Main Roads executed under Orders in Council of 1865, which additional subsidy is and has been payable from a vote numbered division 82, item 9, £32,760, "to subsidize District Road Boards, &c.," shall cause the several sums so received to be paid to the account of the "Main Road Construction Fund"; and that a copy of so much of the said account as shall not have been theretofore sent shall be made up to the 20th of October instant, and shall be forwarded on or before the 31st of December next for the information of the Commissioners of Audit, together with the requisite vouchers relating to the same.

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Henry Thomas Manners Sutton, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commanderin-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c., &c. WHEREAS by the Amending Land Act 1865 it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time, before or after the proclamation of any agricultural area, proclaim as a road or as a town or village any portion or portions of such area not selected, purchased, or leased, and not exceeding, if proclaimed as a town or village, six hundred and forty acres of the lands comprised in such area; and the lands in such town or village shall be sold by auction in the manner provided for the sale by public auction of lands not reserved for proclamation in such areas: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the land hereinafter described as a town in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

Before any barrel, box, or case is received into the magazine it is to be carefully examined, and if it is not perfectly closed, so that no powder or combustible matter can escape, or should any iron be found to have been used either in its construction or repair, it is not to be received into the magazine.

2. No barrel, box, or case is on any account to be opened in the magazine; but when required, it is to be taken to a shifting shed.

# SHIRE OF MOUNT ROUSE.

#### BYE-LAW NO. 1.—REGULATIONS FOR CONDUCT OF BUSINESS AT MEETINGS OF THE COUNCIL.

AT MEETINGS OF THE COUNCIL.

1. The first business of each meeting of council shall be the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting, and their confirmation, unless such has already been done at the close of the former meeting; but no discussion shall take place thereupon, except as to the accuracy thereof.

2. After the disposal of the minutes—(1) Correspondence despatched and received shall be read; (2) Petitions and Memorials presented; (3) Notices of Motion given; (4) Reports brought up; (5) Motions and Orders of the Day considered; (6) Accounts dealt with.

3. All correspondence, after being read, must stand over for consideration until the disposal of the motions and orders of the day.

4. Petitions must be presented by a member of the council, who shall be responsible for the same being couched in respectful terms; and on the presentation of a petition, no debate shall

take place thereupon until notice has been given in the usual manner; and the only question that shall be entertained on the occasion of its presentation shall be—"That the potition be received, and if necessary, that it be referred to a committee."

5. No motion shall be discussed or decided on at any meeting of the council unless notice in writing, signed by the council proposing, shall have been given at a previous meeting of council; nor shall any report of committee be decided on unless similar notice be given; and the secretary shall furnish each councillor with a copy of each notice of motion three clear days at least before the meeting for which the same is given.

6. The "Orders of the Day" shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of council, and any business which the president may think fit to bring under consideration. Any member of the council may, however, bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of a notice of motion, such notice to be given at the previous meeting to that at which the same is to be taken into consideration (unless the council agree to a suspension of Standing Order No. 5), and all such notices of motion shall be considered in the order in which they are given.

7. No motion entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded with unless the councillor who has given such notice, or some other councillor authorized by him, be present when the business is called in its order; and notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out of the paper.

8. No motion proposing any petition, address, bye-law, or standing order shall be entertained unless the mover shall submit therewith a draft of such petition, address, bye-law or standing order as such architash and not be taken into consideration until the following meeting of the council.

#### ORDER OF DEBATE.

9. Any councillor desirous of proposing a motion or amendment, or of speaking to any matter under consideration, must address the president; and no councillor, when speaking, shall be interrupted, unless called to order, in which case the councillor calling to order shall be heard thereon in preference to any other speaker, and the question of order shall be disposed of before the subject is resumed, or any other subject entered

cillor calling to order shall be heard thereon in preference to any other speaker, and the question of order shall be disposed of before the subject is resumed, or any other subject entered upon.

10. Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of such motion or amendment before addressing the council in support thereof, and deliver the written form thereof, signed by himself, to the secretary, who shall add thereto the name of the seconder. No motion or amendment so made shall be writhdrawn without leave of the council.

11. No motion or amendment shall be entertained or discussed unless it be seconded.

12. If more than one councillor, speak at the same time, the president, or in his absence the acting president, shall decide which is entitled to presudience.

13. No councillor shall speak twice on the same motion or amendment, except by way of explanation or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of the amendment last proposed, unless by permission of a majority of the council; and the president or acting president shall, without waiting for the interposition of the council, call to order any councillor proceeding to speak a second time on the same motion or amendment; and no councillor shall be allowed to address the council on any motion or amendment after the reply. No right of reply shall be allowed the seconder of any motion or amendment, as the case may be, shall be immediately put to the vote.

14. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but if lost, another may be moved before the original question is put to the two te; but upon any amendment being carried, it shall be competent for any councillor to move one other shall be immediately put to the vote.

15. In taking the sense of the council, the president shall put to the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, or call for a show of hands in like manner.

16. No councillor may require the secretary to take down any particular wo

ment, and his decision as to what is order or practice shall be final in such case.

20. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment; but if on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the council.

21. Any one or more of the Standing Orders of the Council may be suspended pro tempore in case of emergency, provided that a majority of the councillors present shall deen such suspension necessary, but not otherwise.
